REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

Only recently a top Australian business management consultant and president of the Victorian Tennis Association, Mr. John P. Young, said in a magazine interview that sporting organisations had to become more professional in their outlook and their choice of administrators.

Apart from the comments he made on his particular sport, Mr. Young made several observations that, at the risk of sounding boring because of the number of times I have said it, must also apply to table tennis, at National and State level.

Despite what a number of people have said I do not think I can look back on the past year and say "we have come a long way". I came into the position facing a mixture of people with varying ideas of how the sport should be administered. There obviously had to be some unification and I think that many of the problems found by Mr. Barry Brown during his tenure of office, which led to his strong remarks in the past annual reports, have disappeared or lessened. For that I thank all members of council for playing their part in finding a common ground for agreeing or disagreeing with dignity.

But the important role I wanted to play was to create a new enthusiasm for the future. I am not sure that all members of the council agreed with me that there has to be drastic change in attitude to table tennis administration or there has to be a change in personnel. And I want to assure all present members of the council that in no way do I denigrate them nor do I criticise their decisions or their motives. I also believe that there is a place for everyone of the council members of past years to assist in the running of the sport in this State.

But we just cannot live from hand to mouth any longer. There are a number of ways which table tennis can serve industry, trade and commerce in a practical exchange for financial support. This must be our call - not how munificent some sponsor has to be. We must give value. We must sell our sport and ourselves. We must be able to talk trade, industry and commerce on common ground, not with cap in hand asking for favours, but with a product to sell.

To achieve this we have to change our thinking about how the sport is run in this State or the type of person required for the business side of what now is becoming a serious business. I suggest this incoming council consider the possibility of setting up a directorship type of administration, with attempts to bring into our fold businessmen and other experts in various fields such as accountants, solicitors and financial advisers, without involving them in the day-to-day running of the table tennis side of the sport.

The next two years will be most important for table tennis in this State. We cannot wait for other sports to carry their flags ahead of us. And that is why the two positions we have made for 1981, Administrative Assistant and State Coach, must head our thoughts and planning next year.

## REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT (CONT)

I have stated in council, at committee meetings and to anyone else who cares to listen, that I am not happy with the set of rules suggested by the Department of Sport and Recreation for the position of Administrative Assistant. We have been continuing a long and involved round of discussions to establish our own set of rules for the position and it is essential that council be completely satisfied that what they finally agree to is what will be the standards for the future, in the same way as our Constitution. I also wish to state here that I am in no way interested at this point in the personalities in the positions, the setting of a set of standards far outweighing any feeling any council member has for an individual.

Our council of last year has also approved of the appointing of Mr. Hae Hwa Lee as State Coach, and I can see even at this stage that the administration of his office is going to put some burdens on someone's shoulders, but again the problems that could arise are problems that are certainly not insurmountable. We welcome Hae, his wife and two children to NSW on April 1 and may their stay be one of contentment, good health and prosperity. They are a lovely family.

During the year we had the Chinese team in Sydney and it was one of the most memorable sections of the Australian tour. We are greatly indebted to the Rural Bank for their sponsorship and to the Premier, Mr. Wran and his staff for their interest.

It is not my usual intention of mentioning individual members of the council, as they are part of a team which I consider worked well last year, but I do wish to thank Mr. Keith Bowler for his invaluable assistance, his friendship, his astuteness and his calm assessments in times of stress. He has been a great right hand.

One of my big concerns for the future is our attitude to the Country. In the past year I have found that there are two definite sections in NSW, the City and the Country, and unless something is done table tennis will be the poorer because of the lack of co-ordination and the blind eyes that are apparently turned to each other. This is another administrative problem and the future could see two separate organisations if unity is not achieved.

On the playing side, the performances of Paul Pinkewich and Gary Haberl, to my way of thinking, transcends all that was good in NSW last year. Paul must surely rank as one of the most enduring and talented sportsmen this State has ever had. And although he has not been a regular attender of council meetings, he is always ready and willing to give his advice from the knowledge he has gained in the sport in the past 15 years. He has been especially helpful to the juniors and to Mrs. Joy Brown's coaching seminars. Gary is starting to make his mark in the sports and I hope that his future will, at the very least, follow similar lines.

There are many facets of the playing side of table tennis which did not greatly enthrall me, but it would be churlish to make too many criticisms of the players until the administration problems are sorted out.

I wish you all well and table tennis prosperity for 1981.

## REPORT FROM THE A.T.T.A. DELEGATE

It is no coincidence that the Australian Table Tennis Association is in the same parlous position as the State. In fact, the same as all State bodies. The A.T.T.A. too, is suffering from lack of funds and a lack of professionalism in administration. It seems a pity that some members of the A.T.T.A. want to push into the background the appointment of a National Director of Table Tennis, but in one way I can see their point. It is like a worm biting its own tail. We have to show the Government that we can support a Director, but we have to get a Director to assist on getting the sponsorship to support the position. There is an answer, there has to be, but that, too, will mean the end of the administration of national table tennis as we know it.

#### REPORT FROM THE A.T.T.A. DELEGATE (CONT'D)

The system of communication between delegates on issues so important as to require meaningful discussions has caused so many problems in the past year. We have had cases of misunderstandings that have gone on and on in letters on a subject that could be clarified with personal discussions. I have voted on matters that I have regretted when I have seen the arguments of other delegates received after the voting closes. There are times when I would have liked to have discussed the matter at hand with delegates before voting but to do this I would have to involve myself with hundreds of dollars of extra phone calls around the country. It has not been my habit to charge the State for phone calls or postage (-) an offer which seems completely lost on the State council, who have not even offered any thanks (-) so the State account would be astronomical. But I have enjoyed my two years on the National council and I would like to continue serving table tennis at the national level.

#### REPORT FROM THE COACHING CO-ORDINATOR .

Coaching throughout New South Wales during the year reached an all time low with very few qualified coaches being actively involved.

N.S.W. did not have a coaching co-ordinator for much of the year so the duties were left to a committee of people who had difficulties in meeting, due to the many other commitments they had, caused by the short fall in Council members. However, a coaching of coaches course was conducted in Bathurst with 3 people qualifying and a N.S.W. coaching seminar was held at Camp Mackay, Kurrajong, which was run by the National Director of Coaching, Mike Johns, with 20 coaches in attendance.

The Acton award scheme, which entails players going through tests to obtain either their gold, silver or bronze award badge was put into practice with many players obtaining awards. The Japanese coach Munehara Yasu toured Australia during the year with many players and coaches gaining greater knowledge of the game from this talented coach.

With N.S.W. employing a State coach this year, there is a part to play for everyone in developing table tennis in this state, but particularly the assistance of all coaches is essential.
