

Presidents Report - 2012

Dear Associations, Clubs and Registered Members

The past year has been one of the toughest for the Board for many years.

We managed one major national and one international tournament which required a lot of effort and risk for this organisation and the Directors and support from a wide range of members. The holding of the National Olympic selection tournament, then the Oceania Olympic selection Championship placed a lot of stress on the organsiations structure and at one time threatened the financial stability of TTNSW.

Fortunately due to the efforts of all involved, we were able to present a successful set of programs and also were able to minimise any financial effects on the organisation. I would particularly like to note the great work by Stephen Gillespie as the Events Manager for both events.

We have continued to increase the number of Associations affiliated with our organisation and the number of registered players has also increased. I would like to welcome the following Associate members to TTNSW.

This brings our Associate membership to 50.

It is worth reflecting that Table Tennis NSW is actually a conglomeration of all the Affiliated Associations in NSW. Therefore, the Affiliated Associations are actually the ones responsible for ensuring that our sport in NSW is run appropriately and offer players a range of events that advance the player experience and increase the involvement in the game.

TTNSW has Council meetings during the year to which the Affiliated Associations are invited. Whilst much of the time at these meetings is given over to items which are not of great concern to specific Associations it is disappointing to see that few send a delegate or have items placed on the agenda for discussions.

Continued development of table tennis in NSW

The success of the "Social" membership has continued and we are looking for further increases in this level over the coming years. Additionally, the Council has changed the rules so that Social members may play in a State Event, as long as they pay an additional amount each time.

The TTNSW office arrangements changed towards the end of 2012 with Jason leaving us to pursue other activities; of course Ted and Jan continue to service the office and the requirements of the organisations.

Last year I mentioned that we need to look at the establishment of a full time executive position; with what has been happening over the past year and the plans for the future the need is becoming urgent.

Permanent Executive Offer

Over the next several months the Board and Council will be looking at how we can raise the money to make this dream a reality during the later part of 2014. The options are sponsorship (though this has proven hard in the past), increasing registration fees combined with raising entry fees to State tournaments. Also there may be a way of gaining better margins on items sold through TTNSW and looking at obtaining greater funding from various government grants etc.

We all want a professionally run and adequately supported organisation; this cannot happen with the current structure. To move forward and to gain greater recognition from all levels of governments and to truly develop as a popular sport, we need to have someone full-time to run TTNSW. Without this we will always remain a small and insignificant sports group.

Currently Table Tennis NSW is funded mainly from 2 specific areas

- 1. A State government grant of \$20,000 which is to be used specifically towards administration of the sport. This grant is used to pay part time administrators. This part time arrangement has meant that much of the desired administration has definitely not been handled as well as it should have been. Actions have been taken to ensure that there will be a significant improvement in 2013.
- 2. Affiliation and member fees. Whilst it may be argued that Table Tennis NSW is making large amounts of money from this area an examination of the fees will show that this is not as significant as may be expected. We are required to pay Table Tennis Australia an annual registration fee, plus \$17.60 per registered player (this excludes social players) as well as contribute to the insurance costs. On average, this leaves \$30 per registered player to go towards other items of administration. This amount excludes "Social" member's payments.

All this means that TTNSW has around \$50,000 each year to ensure the appropriate level of administration of our sport. Please note "Administration" does not mean HR costs alone. In fact TTNSW HR costs are around 13% of revenue, this is half what is spent at TTA and less than what a normal company or sports administration would expect to pay in proportion of revenue.

The great majority of work associated in running State events, preparation of timetables and generally getting "things done" is through volunteer time from people who are also working "day jobs" and do these extra things in their spare time.

Membership cards

I will accept that the issue of member cards has been dealt with poorly in the last few years. However it is worth mentioning that the issue of the cards is not assisted by poor, or in some cases almost no, information on new members. Regularly the details we receive from our Affiliates provide only the name of the player with occasional scant information. In the past we have been lenient regarding this matter, but with the new national data base through IMG we will have to tighten the expectations from all Associations/Clubs.

Data management and website

I mentioned last year that we were moving to a new national system through the IMG group. Well, as always occurs with these plans the transfer has not gone a smoothly as we thought and has taken a lot than longer. However, all membership data is now runs though the IMG system and the new website is now up and running.

The new system will allow us to manage better and allow members to participate better in events and know what is going on with TTNSW and all our Associate members. On line registration of membership, tournaments, the buying of uniforms and updating of calendars will be a feature of the new service.

Email addresses and registered player details

We need all members to give us up to date email addresses, if possible. The cost of posting out information and event forms is very expensive and also very time consuming. Please keep the office up to date on your current email address.

Also we need better details for ALL members' information. Hopefully the move to the IMG system may assist in this but in these modern times the need for accurate information about a member is essential. Email address and mobile numbers are only the minimum requirements.

Directors

I would like to thank all the Directors for their contribution and hard work over the last year. We have received four nominations, one for each of the Executive positions; and seven nominations for the Directors position. We normally have eight, therefore one Directors position will be decided at the AGM.





TABLE TENNIS NSW - SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY

In 2012 Table Tennis NSW supported three events:

Teddy Bears Picnic

This year the picnic was renamed as BIG DAY OUT and was held at Luna Park.

Table tennis did not participate as there was no indoor venue available. Table Tennis has been involved in the Teddy Bears Picnic from 2004 to 2011 and we hope to be involved in future events.

The organisers indicated that table tennis will remain on their activity list and will be invited to participate if a suitable site becomes available.

Variety Club Christmas Party

Since 2007 we gave participated in the event which is held for up to 9,000 children from disadvantaged backgrounds at the Darling Harbour Convention Centre.

We have been informed that the party will be held at Darling Harbour in 2013 and will be relocated to Lune Park in 2014 whilst the Convention Centre undergoes major refurbishment.

It was held on the 4th December 2012 and the support of Doug Flood, Lena Walczuk and the volunteers assigned by the organisers was greatly appreciated.

Sydney Special Children's Christmas Party

This event was held at Rose Hill Race Course on 12th December 2012 for approximately 5,000 children who are challenged by a physical or intellectual disability, a serious illness or are from a disadvantaged background.

The participants enjoyed the opportunity to participate in an activity in which they could be involved. They would have their turn and then rejoin the gueue for another hit.

Organisers observed the table tennis area at the 2011 Teddy Bears Picnic and asked Table Tennis NSW if they could participate in their event

Thanks to Doug Flood and volunteers assigned by the organisers for their efforts and support.

5 / 6 year old – watching, helping and participating

The carers and the participants at these events indicated that they had played in previous years and that table tennis is one of the highlights in attending the parties. The carers look forward to the opportunity to sit down and have a rest whilst the children have fun playing the robots (or "the machines" as children call them)

As organisers we do not always recognise the children participating. However, this year at the Special Children's Christmas Party I noticed a six (6) year old boy pulling his mother towards the queue and his mother told me that he had been looking forward to this day for some time and that as soon as they came through the gates he went looking for the table tennis area.

This year he joined the queue patiently waiting his turn at playing table tennis and after his go rejoined the queue on a couple more occasions before his mother convinced him to look at other activities, he reluctantly agreed when he was promised that he could come back later. Sure enough he was back within the hour.

I remembered this young boy from 2011, when he stood outside the barriers, and despite encouragement would not have a hit, after a while he came into the area, picked the balls up and placed them in the ball collection. His mother said that she was happy to see him take an interest in table tennis as he had not shown interest any other activity. Eventually he had a hit when we were starting to pack up and by then he did not want to leave. It was great to see him at the 2012 Party

The days would not have been possible without the co-operation of the volunteers as well as:

There is positive feedback from organisers and participants for these events and they let us know that table tennis is integral in the success of these events.

Schools Report 2012

Schoolboys Shield

83 teams played with a total of 166 players. There were 2 players undefeated both from Blakehurst Aubrey Young & Nick Chen.

Schoolgirls Shield

NSW Junior Table Tennis team was well represented by 38 players, 8 dedicated coaches, and 26 caring parents. The championship was a success for NSW in many ways. As team manager, I was very proud of how our juniors conducted themselves. While our elite juniors concentrate on achieving their personal goals, I witness many matches where our inexperienced juniors, lifted their game and played their heart out doing the best they can possibly do.

U13 Age Division:

NSW dominated the u13 Boys team and individual events. While the A team (Jay Ong, Jayden Lam, Lenny Han & Richard Wang) knock out the Victorian A team to take home the Gold medal, the B team (Bob Liang, Mike Liang, Troy Zaitounian & Vartevar Zaitounian) knock out the Victorian B team to win the Bronze medal.

The u13 Boys Singles semi-final consists of 1 Victorian player and 3 NSW players (Jay, Lenny & Richard). Lenny Han did us proud by knocking out the Victorian player to guarantee an all NSW affair in the finals. He went on to win the u13 Boys Singles title, a well deserved effort for our little champion.

The u13 Girls team was weaken when our top 2 players (Antonia Zhang & Katherine Li) moved up to compete in the u15 Girls team event. They joined Mia Cross to form the u15 Girls B team. Seeded #1 for her age group, Antonia Zhang went on to win the u13 Girls Singles title.

U15 Age Division:

NSW girls dominated the team event by winning the Gold and Bronze medal. Our A team (Sarah & Vanessa Tan & Samantha Ong) proved too strong for the Victorian team to win the Gold medal, while our B team won the Bronze.

The Boys A team (Andy Yin, Anthony Zhao, Nicholas Lee & Thomas NG) narrowly missed out on the Gold medal play-off after losing 4-5 to South Australia. However they gallantly recover the next day to win the Bronze medal play-off. A player worth mentioning here is Andy Yin who was competing at the National level for the first time. Note: *The \$10 is accepted by the NSWTTA as a 'social registration fee' which provides members playing in the Illawarra with insurance cover. The \$10 is paid to the NSWTTA. Members wishing to play in the Sydney or State competitions should register directly with NSWTTA, paying the State fee for their class of membership. **The concessional rate applies to CentreLink pensioners and University students, who need to produce their card for noting on the first attendance to claim the concession.

***Beaton Park members include all sportspersons paying to attend any sports at Beaton Park; they can attend practice on Thursday nights, the first two free of charge.

Annual Dinner

This is an important opportunity to acknowledge the achievements of our members. Medallions were presented to the Winners and Runners Up in all events. Life Members Alan Russell and Tony Arts assisted with the presentations. Members and their guests were challenged by the several trivial pursuit competitions. An excellent evening was enjoyed by all. Thanks are due to Graeme Wells and Alan Russell for organising the evening.

Financial position

As shown by the annual financial statements, our financial position is sound. The Management committee decided that in an effort to broaden our membership base, funds and effort should be devoted to promoting the sport. A budget of \$5,000 was approved for the promotion. An overview of what is planned is shown below.

At the same time it is worth repeating (from the 2011 annual report) the benefits for members of maintaining a significant investment. First, the interest earned covers some of our expenses and, has enabled fees to be kept at their current levels for several years in spite of the annual Council increases in rent at the inflation rate. Second, it enables us to purchase tables and equipment as required without first having to raise the funds. Third, if the opportunity did arise for the Association to obtain its own premises, then we have a significant cash sum available.

Illawarra Credit Union (ICU) Sponsorship

The ICU has been our major sponsor for many years. In a review of their sponsorship in 2012 the Illawarra Credit Union emphasised the benefits to our members of their sponsorship. Specifically, members including members or their families, may qualify for concessional rates on mortgages or loans. The best way to find out if you might qualify is to enquire at the ICU. Further, if our members increased their business with the ICU, the level of sponsorship could be raised.

Our Promotion, February 2013

Plans are well advanced for this promotion for which we seek the support and involvement of all members. Two banners have been ordered, and brochures and flyers are being produced. With the banners as focal points, members would hand out flyers. The feature of the promotion is three free nights, Thursday 21 Feb., Monday 25 Feb., and Thursday 28 Feb., at Beaton Park from 7.30pm to 9.30pm, with special programs, including fun activities. So help will be needed in distributing the flyers, and assisting with the programs which largely will be directed at newcomers.


Acknowledgements

On behalf of the membership, it gives me pleasure to acknowledge the commitment of all committee members, and to thank them all for their contribution. Alan Russell remains a tower of strength for the sport and the well-being of the Association. He is always there to help and advise members, assisting with coaching whenever requested.

Expression of opinion on imposition of non-refundable bond or entry fee The Management committee seeks an expression of opinion on their proposal which, it is hoped, would provide a strong motivation for teams to abide by the rules when they are unable to field a team. The present rules require a team captain unable to field a team to notify the team captain of the opposing team "not less than 24 hours before the match" wherever possible, and also to inform a member of the match committee (Rule 4.4). This rule was not followed a number of times, which is particularly unfair on those members travelling a long distance for their match, only to find that their opposition has not fronted up without informing them.

The Management committee proposes that a non-refundable bond of \$60 be levied on each team entry, with the bond being forfeited in the event that this rule was not complied with. In normal circumstances where the rule is observed, the \$60 would be credited over the last few competition matches as team playing fees of its members.

Our District continued to improve participation levels during 2012 in both competition and social play thanks to various promotional tournaments like the NSW Corporate Games (In aid of Diabetes Australia), the SND invitational Premier League Challenge (with decent prize money) and the PCYC, MQ Uni& Suns Annual Events. We now have 13 clubs participating in the District competitions divided over 5 divisions and are negotiating with a few new clubs to further expand. We are working towards an initial competition during 2013, which we hope will assist qualification for the proposed national club championships by TTA in October.
