PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The last Annual General Meeting of the Association elected two new senior officials, in the persons of Mike Lane as Secretary and Tom Cross, Snr., as Treasurer. The great contribution of these two gentlemen is shown by the award of the Michael Szabados Award to Mike, for the "greatest services to the game", and the satisfactory state of our finances under Tom's watchful eye.

Several former Council members resigned during the year but we were very pleased to have Tom Cross, Jnr., and Bill Cook, two entirely new members to the Council and to welcome back Geoff and Barbara Cubitt. We were delighted to learn that there is a third member of the family who may join the Council some day, be it ever so far away; congratulations Mum and Dad. We were, however, sorry to receive the resignation of our hard working Tournament Committee Chairman, Ken Cole.

The outstanding playing (and financial) event of the year was the visit of the Japanese - including World Champion, Hasegawa - and the South Koreans, for the South Pacific Championships in Sydney, and of the Indonesians to Parkes, after S.E.A.P.A.T.T. in Melbourne. This involved a tremendous volume of work and organisation in which many "old-timers" came to the assistance of the officials and who all participated in a fine exhibition of team work. The events themselves were a great and popular success and will help further to put the game on the sporting map. It is hoped that comparable events may now be arranged at more frequent intervals, especially as the A.T.T.A. has been accepted as an affiliate of the Asian Federation.

The Men's team, ably captained by Cliff McDonald, are to be warmly congratulated on winning the Australian Team's Championship, especially as they were without the able assistance of Mike Wilcox. We all hope that there is no truth in the rumour that Mike may be retiring from the game.

Long and delicate negotiations earlier in the year resulted in an arrangement whereby the Association had an administrative connection with the Centre at Summer Hill for the first time; and it may be hoped that in due course this will lead to an even more direct and financially attractive association, to the greater good of the game.

I shall be retiring from office at the Annual General Meeting and would like to thank so very many members for acts of friendship and support, and to wish my yet-to-be-elected successor every success.

ANNUAL REPORT

33rd Annual Report to be presented to members at the Annual General Meeting to be held at 3rd Floor, Training Room, A.M.P. Building, Sydney Cove, on Thursday, 20th February, 1969.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

This, the Thirty-Third Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year 1968.

The Council has not had an easy year and through the sterling work of some of its members has had some successes amongst the many problems.

My predecessor as Secretary complained in last year's Annual Report that the majority of members were interested only in playing and not putting something back into the game by helping to organise such events as Championships, etc. This aspect is still causing serious concern to the Association. For the sport to succeed in New South Wales, the Council must be made up of people who are prepared to work to the furtherance of the game and not of people who just stand around and watch others. A great deal of satisfaction can be gained from helping the game of table tennis succeed.

We want, and must have, more people who are prepared to work and do the job that is asked of them when they accept the position of a Council member.

FINANCE

Although starting 1968 in better light than 1967, the financial position was by no means bright.

We are pleased to announce that the Statement as at 31/12/1968 shows that we have cleared all sundry creditors and debtors. This is indeed a compliment to Tom Cross, Snr., who as Treasurer has guided us through the year to show a good credit balance.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 1969

The next World Championships will be held in Munich during April, 1969. Three New South Wales players have been selected in the Australian Team. The Association wishes Joy Brown, Vicki Wheller and Paul Pinkewich every success during their forthcoming trip.

BANK OF NEW SOUTH WALES PACIFIC CHAMPIONSHIPS

We are indeed grateful to the Bank of New South Wales for assisting the promotion of this Championship. After playing in S.E.A.P.A.T.T. at Melbourne, the World Champions from Japan, Korea and Australia played in a triangular series at the Alexandria Basketball Stadium.

This was the first opportunity for a number of years that Sydney had to witness such greats in Table Tennis. The skills shown by the Japanese and Koreans was quite out of this world.

The tournament was a great success in every respect and I hope that it will not be too long before we have the opportunity of witnessing the skills and sportsmanship of such great players.

AMPOL MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS

To end a large International programme during 1968, Ampol brought two Thailanders in the persons of W. Chayanond and P. Pradit to Sydney in August. During a weeklong programme, many people had the opportunity of seeing these two players.

A handicap tournament was run at Summer Hill which was won by P. Haigh (-9) when he beat P. Pradit (-40).

The following night the New South Wales team of C. McDonald and P. Pinkewich played the Thailanders in a representative match. Thailand were victorious 4-1 with Pinkewich being the lone winner for New South Wales.

On the Sunday night, a tournament was run at Summer Hill between the Thailanders, the New South Wales State team and 2 qualifiers. Cliff McDonald showing a return to form beat Pradit in the semi-final and then went on to beat Chayanond in the final.

AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time the Senior and Junior Championships were played concurrently at Hobart during September, 1968.

The Mens team played extremely well during the entire tournament and were justly rewarded when Cliff McDonald beat Graham Stirling (Vic.) in the deciding game of the last day's play to keep his unbeaten record and regain the trophy for New South Wales.

The Ladies finished in 2nd position behind the Victorian side which was too experienced for any of its rivals.

The performance of both these teams was very good when it is remembered that both sides were without their No. 1 players from the previous year, Mike Wilcox and Fay Smith.

The Junior Boys performed creditably to finish in 2nd position behind Victoria. Paul Pinkewich was the outstanding player with a 100% record.

The Girls finished a disappointing 5th but were well served by our only country representative, Sue Wiggins.

For the first time in many years there were no New South Wales players in the finals of the individual championships, however, Jim Leggatt was successful in the Mens Consolation event.

Special mention should be made of the tremendous team spirit that prevailed in the New South Wales camp and also of the valuable job done by Ken Cole as Manager of the Teams.

NEW SOUTH WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Championships were again held at the Summer Hill Table Tennis Centre during July. The large entry was headed by Lee Mun Chew (Malaysian Champion), Phil Anderson (S.A.), Joan Lane (S.A.) and Suzy Javor (Vic.) 9 times Australian Ladies Champion.

The Ladies Singles final was fought out between Suzy Javor and Joan Lane with Suzy the victor in straight games.

Lee Mun Chew won the Mens Singles final from Cliff McDonald who has now been runner-up for a record number of 6 times.

Paul Pinkewich became the first person to win the Junior Boys Singles on 3 consecutive occasions.

Congratulations are extended to the winners and runners-up in all events.

During the year several Championships have been conducted at Summer Hill, as well as at various country centres such as Dubbo, Grafton, Gunnedah and Maitland.
