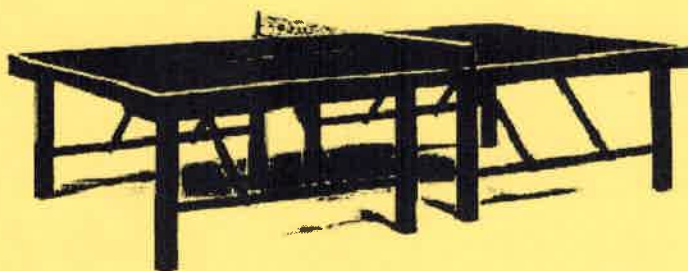

Members, it gives me great pleasure to present my eighth report as Administration Officer (Part Time 3 days a week) for Table Tennis NSW Inc. The year 2003 was another exciting and interesting one, which this report should reflect.

Fijian Team Tour of Sydney

I had the pleasure of preparing a playing and training program for the visiting Fiji Men's Table Tennis Team. The team were in Sydney to gain experience for their participation in the South Pacific Championships to be held in Fiji in June 2003.

There was a tremendous amount of behind the scenes work including the sending of 52 E-mails; receiving 27 E-mails; other letters and countless telephone calls before and during their visit to make the tour a success.

I took the opportunity to watch the visitors play on a couple of occasions and their enthusiasm was obvious. Win or lose they were having a great time.

Anthony Ho, Vice President, Fiji Table Tennis Association presented Table Tennis NSW with a beautiful hand carved wooden Tanoa. A traditional bowl used in Kava Ceremonies, which now has pride of place in the TTNSW office.

Injuries and fatigue started to take their toll on our visitors during the second week and some training sessions had to be cancelled and some matches were in doubt until the last minute.

I wish to place on record my appreciation to all of the Sydney Clubs, Officials, Coaches and players for their tremendous support for this tour.

Loop

Four editions of LOOP were distributed in January, April, August and November in 2003 and mailed to members. Most of the articles have been posted on our Web-site for the public to access. Once again I would like to thank all of the people who submitted articles and/or pictures for publication, they made interesting and informative reading. Thank you to our advertisers, I hope that you received value for money.

NSW Sport & Recreation Involvement

NSW Sport & Recreation continue to be our main source of income. With out which this Association could not continue to provide the many services it does to its members and the sport in general. We are now in the final year of our three-year business plan. Table Tennis NSW received \$20,000.00 for 2003.

The Country Athlete Scheme applications continue to be negotiated directly with the Department and the parent. My only involvement apart from the distribution of the Application Forms is to verify membership currency and have the Junior Selectors prioritise the applicants. Eight of our Junior Members were successful in 2003 sharing \$3,640.00.

A new scheme was introduced this year to financially assist NSW Country Coaches and Officials, \$1,000.00 was shared by two of our members.

Two of our Directors attended a "Risk Management Seminar" conducted by NSW Sport & Recreation during 2003.

In addition to free access to the Internet and E-mail, NSW Sport & Recreation provide free office accommodation at Sports House and access to photo copying equipment. This is very much appreciated.

Where to play Table Tennis guide

This again has proved to be a valuable tool in the daily operation of the office. Over the course of a year I refer hundreds of inquires from the public as to where they can play Table Tennis to the nearest Club/Association. It is the duty of each Club/Association contact person to encourage all potential new members. Don't fall into the trap of feeling comfortable with current membership numbers of your club. As members leave for varying reasons there is a constant need to replace them. The playing venue is also listed on the TTNSW Web-site www.ttnsw.org.au

Bad Debts

It appears that bad debts continue as a result of non or part payment of all fees associated with selection in NSW Teams at National Championships by some members. Directors may have to take a stronger stand against members who have not made full payment prior to the departure for Australian Championships or this worrying trend will continue.

Equipment Sales

Once again the sale of Table Tennis equipment has been an important part of my duty. We receive funding from NSW Sport & Recreation for this project. It provides a service to all members, particularly those residing in country areas and a small profit for Table Tennis NSW (see Finance Report).

Registrations

There has been a slight decrease (50) of Registered Members from the year 2002. While this is no cause for alarm it is a trend, which needs to be reversed. Another new club affiliated during 2003, I refer to Team Tenabit. (Metford) located in the Newcastle district. I hope that they see benefit from their affiliation.

Member should be mindful of one of the benefit associated with a larger number of registered members is the financial burden will be smaller because it is shared by a larger number.

While it is pleasing that there is a large number of members over the age of forty enjoying our sport (307) and our Juniors members are strong (134) it is disappointing that the age group which should be supplying the bulk of our competition, that is players between eighteen and forty years of age is only 227.

Nepean District Association again recorded an increase (30%) while St George Sutherland had a 68% increase. Disappointingly some other Associations had a negative growth.

Conclusion

I consider that the duties of Office Administrator continue to be a very important link between the public, NSW Sport & Recreation, the Directors and the sport of Table Tennis.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

2003 was again an extremely hectic and productive year for Table Tennis NSW.

This was our 2nd year at Sydney Olympic Park and has been a very productive year in good partnership with the State Sports Centre Trust.

We ran two TOPS after schools programs – the first in term two – bronze award – ages 6 to 9 on Tuesdays - we had 16 enthusiastic students who completed the eight week course and we ran two classes – Silver & bronze in term 3 – bronze on Tuesdays & Silver on Thursdays. We look forward to continuing this program in 2004 – offering both Bronze & silver – Tuesdays – commencing on February 10th to March 16th.

The venue was open Tuesdays from 7pm to 9 pm for training & coaching – Paul Zhao the on duty coach.

On Thursday nights the Metropolitan / Insurance Competition has expanded – it is good to see more & more junior teams and players participating in one of the two grades. The competition also included novice players & coaching. Congratulation to Les Walczuk for his continued organisation & success of this competition – this comp will re-commence on Thursday 12th February 2004.

The City Vs Country annual challenge was again a very enjoyable & successful day with City this year being victorious

In 2003 NSW hosted three national championships :

- 1) The Australian Schools Championships – whilst it was disappointing to only have one interstate team participate – it was encouraging to have 65 teams over the 4 days. Most players had an enjoyable time apart from a few minor hic-ups.
- 2) Australian Athletes with Disabilities Championships – this was the inaugural championships held at the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre and ran over three days – a very successful championships conducted by Table Tennis Australia – with an enormous assistance from NSW volunteers – Kogarah RSL – Douglas Flood, Edd Nash & members as well as the NSW Disabilities Director – Beryl Davies & the Volunteers from the NSW Veterans Association.
- 3) Australian Junior & U18 Championships – Very Successful championships. I would like to thank ALL the volunteers & board members who assisted me in organising a very successful championship.

There were two milestones achieved by two associations in 2003 –

NSW Insurance & Financial Institutions Table Tennis Association & NSW Country Table Tennis Association – both have conducted their 50th Championships during 2003 – congratulations to the organisers for their meritorious achievements– Les Walczuk & Alan Taylor – whose efforts over many numbers of years guaranteeing the continuation and success of both these Championships.

The State Sports Centre Trust also conducted a lunchtime competition (Lunchtime Legends) – 12 noon to 2 pm Tuesdays which ran for 12 weeks – with six teams of business houses located within Sydney Olympic Park.

The 2003 Tournaments took on a new look with the tournament director using computerised draws for all tournaments – this brought mixed reactions BUT also highlighted existing problems with running tournaments – it is essential that ALL players

arrive on time for their scheduled matches and are ready to play when called on by the organisers.

For 2004 we plan to use TIMED draws – which means all players MUST be at the venue & on their allocated tables by the times indicated in the draw – the draws will be available on the WEBSITE and players will be able to phone to get times for their first matches – any type of system will only work with the co operation of the players. Please remember to have your entries in by the closing dates and turn up well in advance of your scheduled time.

The NSW Schools tournaments were also successful with the Schools Director Gillian Hutchinson having packed stadiums for most events. NSW will be endeavouring to form a schools sub-committee with the Schools Director; Junior Director; Junior Development, coaching committee & schoolteachers to improve the development of these tournaments.

We also conducted a survey at the Australian Schools Championships with four schools winning STIGA table tennis tables donated by Table Tennis Australia & Combined Sports Traders: Congratulations to: St Andrews Public School; Beverley Hills Girls High School; St Johns Park High School & Blayney High School. The Junior Development Officer will be contacting all of the schools in the surveys to follow up on the surveys & arrange coaching.

Our representative teams for 2003 have once again had improved performances.

The year 2003 proved to be another very successful year for our Association with the continuation of our very strong weekend competition which led to unprecedented success in the Australian Championships.

Our Association caters for all players with qualification for events being reached in the year when a member attains the age of 40 years. We are constantly on the look out for new members and all people from these age groups are most welcome at our weekend competitions. If you know of anyone, regardless of their playing standard, who wishes to play our game we would be delighted to hear from you.

Our Association sends teams to the Australian Veterans Championships, which were this year held in Adelaide. Due to the strength of our weekend domestic competition our teams enjoyed success beyond expectations with Gold medals being won by all our Men's teams in the Over 40, Over 50, Over 60 and Over 70 teams events. This is an accomplishment, which has never before been achieved by any State. 2003 was a busy year for our junior players.

For the Juniors, we introduced the point systems and the Junior TOP10 Challenge. The main purpose of the point system was to encourage juniors to play in more tournaments and to provide achievable goals for novice players.

NSW UMPIRE'S REPORT

2003 has again been a somewhat mixed one for our association, with the effects becoming evident of the loss of some of our members who did not take up the transfer to the new ANOC scheme or left due to the pressure of other commitments causing difficulties in providing officials for many local events.

We were however represented at the Australian Youth Olympic Festival by Steven Lee as Deputy Referee and Peter Lazell, Maurie Poole, Carol Poole, Tony Katona, Karl Preuss, Sam Lau and Rob Crowdy as umpires, and at the first Australian Athletes With Disabilities Championships by Steven Lee (Referee), Maurie Poole (Deputy Referee) and Carol Poole, Tony Katona and Sam Lau as umpires.

There was also some involvement by our members on the international scene, with Steven Lee (Director Technical), Maurie Poole (Deputy Referee) and Carol Poole officiating at the World Wheelchair Games in Christchurch, New Zealand and Maurie Poole attending the South Pacific Games in Suva, Fiji as an umpire. Phil Males was involved with the presentation of Advanced Umpire Training courses in Paris and China, while Steven Lee did considerable work on translation of rules for disabled players for the International Paralympic Table Tennis Committee.

The latter part of the year saw the conduct of a level 2 State Umpires Course at Kogarah with a total of 15 participants successfully completing the written examination of whom 8 completed their oral and practical sections at the Australian Junior Championships and are now full Level 2 State Umpires. Carol Poole also passed her Level 3 National exams and assessments, and it is expected that the remaining participants will complete their qualifications in the near future, giving a further boost to our numbers and more availability of officials. Our new State Umpires are: Graham Boyton, Steve Eggleton, Doug Flood, Steve Gillespie, Keith Johnson, Edd Nash, Marie Pinkewich and Frank Zayzon, with Banoo Bengali, Steve Bruton, Armida Croccolo- Brugnoli, Gillian Hutchison, Patrick McMahon, Shirley Smith and Damir Terzic still to complete the final requirements.

As well as the new umpires, other members to officiate at the Australian Junior Championships were: Phil Males (Tournament Director), Maurie Poole (Referee), Ian Finlay Deputy Referee and Steven Lee (Umpire).

The association confidently looks forward to a resurgence of interest/activity in 2004.

TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2003

There were fifteen tournaments held in the 2003 season in NSW of which I ran seven. Due to family commitments this is all I can possibly run in one year. The 2004 season will be no different, so it will be up to the players in NSW to determine if this will be enough. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Leonie Whiteford for all her help during the year and for running the tournaments that I could not attend. I would also like to thank Tien Quach for her help and also for the loan of her laptop computer that I used to run the tournaments.

Using a computer to run the tournaments was a new innovation introduced this year with mixed results. Due to some limitations of the software that I used there was some confusion when recording scores on the player slips which caused a few problems. There were also problems getting results to the officials because the software had limited reporting facilities. This will all be rectified in 2004 with the acquisition of new software written by Brian James, provided free of charge, specifically for table tennis. Brian has been using this software to run all the major tournaments around the country for the last few years with a great deal of success and acceptance.

There were a few other problems with the time tournaments took to complete this year. I have examined the schedules for the tournaments that I ran in 2003 and have discovered that there are periods during the tournaments where more tables are needed to run the scheduled events than are available. This causes players to become annoyed when they turn up on time for their matches only to find that they may have to wait up to an hour to begin their event. This will be rectified in 2004 with the introduction of timed tournaments where the players will know what table they are playing on and what time each match will be played. While timed tournaments will alleviate some problems they will not change the length of time taken to complete a tournament. At the moment most tournaments have some matches where best of seven games are played. This can add up to an extra hour and a half of playing time. With the increase in hiring costs perhaps we should consider only playing best of five games.

The other thing the committee should look at is restricting the number of events that each player can enter other than the current method of restricting a player to only one event per time slot. This makes it difficult to run a tournament smoothly when some players can enter a large number of events and then proceed to reach the final stages of each event. This can be alleviated to some extent by restricting Juniors and Veterans to their age group plus one age group above theirs and grade players to their grade plus one more grade.
