PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1997 was an 'eye-opener' for me as President of TTNSW. As the year progressed it became abundantly obvious to me that radical (and I mean <u>radical</u>) change is required or else our sport may face a disatrous future. In a way, this realization has auxilirated me with a new enthusiasm and energy for TTNSW as I am excited by the enormous challenges and opportunites that lay ahead. The events, successes and failures of 1997 as outlined below have served to instill within me a new realistic outlook on where our sport is and where we want to go. Putting it bluntly, 1997 was another year of mediocrity without excitement and innovation; the characteristics of successful sports. If nothing else, 1997 was a watershed for me because in realizing how mediocre we were, I also realized how much potential our sport really has. As of the end of 1997, I am looking at Table Tennis in a different light. With the support of the new Council, Clubs/Associations and members, I will try to set Table Tennis on a new path in 1998 that will change the way we look at our sport forever.

I firstly would like to thank all the Council for their work in 1997. This year we are losing four valuable Councillors; Phil Males, Warren Gray, Doug Flood and Edward Caruana. Phil and Warren have been on the Council now for close to 15 years each. I am sure they will continue to be involved in some capacity and may return at sometime in the future. Their experience and contributions will be sorely missed and it is unfortunate for TTNSW that we are losing over half of our Council in one hit. Good Council members are increasingly difficult to find and I ask all members to consider whether they can spare a couple hours a week to assist the administration and contribute to policy formulation and decision making.

1997 could be called the "Year of Possible Venues". No fewer than 1 definite and 3 possible permanent Table Tennis centres came to the attention of TTNSW. Cabramatta ran two events in 1997 and now has a regular playing clientele. The Department of Sport and Recreation contacted TTNSW and informed us of a possible centre in Crows Nest. This permanent venue will be up and running probably in early 1999. The other possibilities arise out of the Olympics. The first was an approach from Bankstown City Council to Table Tennis Australia about erecting a Table Tennis centre primarily for Olympic training with the view to TTNSW utilising the facility post-2000. Since the Bankstown City Council premises burnt down in late 1997, no further word has been heard on the project. Finally, there is a chance we may obtain a venue at the new Easter Showground at Homebush. The Poultry Shed will be available to us 11 months of the year. A lot of the details need to be worked out on this site, at the moment the project is in the hands of Neil Harwood as Competition Manager for Table Tennis 2000.

Except for the Veterans and Youth, TTNSW had problems this year with State representatives at the Junior and Senior levels. Firstly, for the first time in our history we had no women's team at the Australian Championships. This looked particularly bad after we had won the event in 1996 and NSW copped some criticism from TTA. The lack of female players Australia-wide is a cause for concern and there is no quick-fix to the problem. Half of the States (4) did not have women's teams at the 1997 Australian Championships. Another worrying area is the lack of enthusiasm amongst a significant proportion of our juniors after being selected for State representation. This is one of the 'lack of Table Tennis culture' problems I have written about in *LOOP*. We only had 2 out of the minimum 3 girl players necessary for the Under 17 team and we we had to promote an under 14 boy into the Under 17 Boys team to make-up the 3 players. This decision caused some controversy amongst some people. However, I feel our number one priority was to have a team and the decision was vindicated by our Bronze medal in this event and John Tawadrous (the promoted boy) achieving a National ranking of 9 in the under 17 boys. May I congratulate the Veterans on their contuining enthusiasm for State

representation and their great results. Likewise, our Youth Teams at the Under 20 Nationals performed creditably. Well done to all those who represent NSW.

TTNSW ran a series of grade events for school children sponsorted by STIGA. My thanks to CST and STIGA AB for their support. It is hoped that these events will continue in 1998. We are trying to provide a format for children which allows them to compete at an appropriate level and hopefully entices them to take-up Table Tennis as a serious sport. This event is new to TTNSW and judging by the numbers participating has been somewhat successful. We once again had a good entry at the State Sports Centre for the School Students Championships although entries were down on previous years. Cabramatta TTC also ran a graded event for juniors during their first tournament. The TTNSW Schools Team event ran by Gillian Hutchinson was reasonably well supported. My thanks to Gillian and Andrew Chan for their work in these vital areas. (See their reports for details).

The NSW Department of Sport and Recreation are the main sponsors of TTNSW to the amount of \$31,000 per year and a free office. In 1997, we received a special grant of a further \$5000 for training purposes. Warren Gray and Ron Pickering deserve a special mention for the work they put into this proposal. We have an open and healthy relationship with the NSW Department of Sport and they take a keen interest in our development. I would like to thank all the staff at Sports House for their valuable assisstance throughout the year. Our direct involvement with the Department should increase in 1998 due to a change in funding arrangements. This will mean TTNSW is more accountable for the way it uses its dollars and funding will become performance related. Basically, the relationship will be similar to that of Table Tennis Australia and the Australian Sports Commission.

At the National level, as TTNSW delegate I attended two important meetings in Melbourne in September. The first was a seminar attended by all States to look at the structure of Table Tennis in Australia and how we can best change it so that we can truly go forward as a sport. A special task force was formed that delivered a report in late 1997. This report basically looks at disbanding State Associations and setting up State branches of TTA. The timeline for this restructure should it go ahead is late 1999. At this seminar and the AGM of TTA on the following day, I submitted a proposal for TTA to consider sending 2 or 3 of their full-time staff to Sydney so that we can make a real difference to the sport between now and 2000 while TTA still has the funding. This proposal was unanimously endorsed by all the States on both days. I must confess that I am somewhat disappointed with the apparent inertia from TTA since then. At the time of writing (March 1998) we are still nowhere near kicking-off the project despite us sending TTA a detailed plan of action. It will be interesting to see what eventually becomes of our proposal and the task force's recommendations in the future.

There are so many other areas to report on: the success of the Cabramatta Tournaments was a highlight as the best players in Australia competed for significant prize money. I want to particularly thank Ron Pickering for his hard work throughout the year. The marketing catalogue which Ron designed and now administers has led to a profitable year for equipment sales. Ghiath Khalil has gone from strength to strength with the new A5 format of *LOOP* and Steven Lee and Lester Vibert are gradually improving our events. Congratulations to the Sydney Smashers on making the finals of the National League yet again. The Country League and Umpires Association also seem to be taking steps forward. To all those who support and help Table Tennis NSW, may I offer my sincerest gratitude. Look out for a new TTNSW starting in 1998.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER'S REPORT

Members it gives me pleasure to present my second report as Administration Officer (part time). The past year has been filled with positive improvement in services to Member's, some of which are detailed in this report.

General

Once again the 'Where to play Table Tennis' data base has proved to be an important part of daily operations. It has been fine tuned and its contents is now quite reliable. However, the accuracy of the data relies on a constant and speedy flow of changes to any of the information that it contains.

With the help of Ghiath Khalil, Editor of *Loop* a number of changes to the magazine's format have been introduced resulting in a much easier to handle and read publication. The variety of articles that it contains have received wide approval. To those who have submitted articles a big thank you.

The release of the Members Equipment Catalogue has been another successful initiative with an efficient mail order service to members. The Catalogue has been particularly utilised by members living in the country areas of the state. A total of \$11,244.00 of equipment has been bought and sold, resulting in a net profit of \$1083.67 for Table Tennis NSW, but of equal importance providing an additional service to the member.

The preparation of various entry forms and promotional pamphlets has continued to be an important part of my duties.

I have assisted The Temora Table Tennis Association to affiliate. I am pleased to report that this affiliation has resulted in 60-70 additional players registering.

Department Of Sport And Recreation

The processing of Country Athletes Grant applications has resulted in 11 country Juniors receiving a total of \$3,500.00 from this scheme.

The Department Of Sport And Recreation have announced changes in the way that they do business with all sporting associations from 31 March 1998. No longer will they be handing out annual or biannual amounts of money to sporting associations to conduct their business.

In place will be formal co-operative arrangements (written agreements or contracts) between the Department and sporting associations which identify agreed outcomes to be achieved for the particular period/project.

The funding arrangements will be project driven with the emphasis on 50% funding by the sporting organisation. This means TTNSW will have to provide half the cost of every project undertaken. This can be found by using

existing funds, users contributing half the cost, sponsorship or any combination.

Payment of funds will be conditional on TTNSW agreeing to the following set of binding conditions:-

Purpose (what we intend to do)
Anticipated outcomes
Budget (how the project will be funded)
monitoring/evaluation and audit requirements

On-going payments will be dependant on that :-

Project has commenced
Is of a satisfactory standard
The grant has been accounted for through appropriate financial systems and that costs are verified.
The project aims have been achieved
The outcome is of a satisfactory standard
Appropriate procedures have been met and conditions of the grant have been met.

The focus will be on participation (increasing numbers), talent development and providing quality information to members.

The position of Administration Officer will no longer be directly funded by the Department, instead my hourly wage will have to be incorporated into the budget of each project undertaken by Table Tennis NSW.

Publicity/Sponsorship

Promotional posters have been produced advertising various events and distributed to appropriate organisations.

Unfortunately only a small number of Press Releases were written and distributed last year, this was because of time constraints and the lack of coverage from the media in the past.

Generous sponsorship from *STIGA* was obtained for the School students graded tournaments conducted during 1997.

Conclusion

I visualise my involvement with the Department will increase significantly, but I am confident that our operations will continue satisfactorily. The positive feedback that I have received from the registered members and the general public confirms that I am providing an essential service.

I look forward to this new era in Table Tennis and to working with an enthusiastic and industrious new council for the development of our sport.

VETERANS REPORT

It is pleasing to report that with an effective Committee we have had a very successful year. Veterans table tennis is important competitive and social activity and plays an important role in the promotion of table tennis. Once again we will be using the Burwood Police & Community Youth Centre as our permanent venue for 1998.

Team Challenge

The Teams Challenge was the main event conducted in 1997, with two matches played on the one day once a month. This format allowed some country players to gain teams practise and our lady players the experience of playing against other lady players, which is not readily available in other competitions. Many 'new' veterans came out of the woodwork to compete with some younger players and most of our 'old' veterans to make this a strongly contested competition and congratulations go to the winners of each grade. The Committee has decided to conduct a similar teams challenge in 1998 and to be successful again we need the support of **all** veteran players.

Grade Tournaments.

Five graded tournaments were held during the year with players having plenty of matches on mostly round robin draws and these will be continued throughout 1998 for the benefit of the players who prefer some extra play and who maybe cannot compete in the teams matches.

Representative players.

Congratulations to all players who represented NSW at the Australian veterans Championships in Darwin. Success was achieved in the 0/40 & 0/50 Mens teams with the 0/60 & 0/70 Womens winning silver. Individually NSW was well represented on the podium and probably had one of its most successful years. Leonie Whiteford upset a few seeds on her way to winning the 0/40 Womens title, a first for NSW, Paul Pinkewich and Inh Van Le regained the 0/40 Mens and 0/50 Mens titles respectively. Thanks to Norma Callinan our Team Manager for her helping hand which was appreciated by all players. Thanks also goes to Sue Younie and Carol Cope for their assistance as Coach captains in getting the players to and from the venue on time.

Sponsorship

Our sponsors "ATLANTIS TRAVEL" have provided fares at reasonable rates over the last few years and have also provided tracksuits and shirts to all team members. This year ATLANTIS arranged all air, accommodation and transport bookings with the accommodation apartments proving to be excellent and declared the 'best ever'. Special thanks to all veterans for their time and effort in assisting the Wheelchair Games and Disabled Championships.

During our tournaments canteen facilities were provided a net profit of \$650 but unfortunately the burden of this work was carried by too few people. Thanks Carol Hughes for your tireless efforts most Sundays and your donation of fruit. A special thanks to Jim and Rita Craig for their attendance on B Grade Sundays with homemade cakes and your time in running the facility.

Thank you to those people who arrived early for team and tournament matches and assisted with the erection of tables, nets and barriers as this preparation work for the days play does take time and effort which must be shared around.

Finally our thanks go to our Assistant Secretary Carol Hughes, Vice-President Armida Brugnoli and Treasurer Kevin Cope for their work throughout the year and not forgetting the rest of the Committee who assisted from time to time when needed throughout the year.

The Committee feels proud that we have had a successful year and is confident that it can have another in 1998.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Council of Table Tennis NSW for involving me. Since April I have had an enjoyable learning experience as part of my portfolio. I have learnt a lot from Geoff Henry in the organisation and running of junior tournaments, and the work that needs to be done to help NSW Junior players.

During this year I have been introduced to various officials and members of Table Tennis NSW and getting to know the talented junior players.

Junior Tournaments

This year a number of tournaments were held for our junior players and with great success. As well as the usual trophies for winners and runners-up prize money was offered to encourage more to compete.

The inclusion of the under 20 age group in tournaments aimed at encouraging the under 18, 19 and 20 year old players to continue with Table Tennis rather than dropping out as has been the case in the past.

Squad Training

Six training sessions were conducted by Brett Solo at Greenacre YMCA for our Junior State Representatives for the 1997 Australian Junior Championships held in Croydon, Victoria. Stiga NSW Primary & Secondary School Students Grade Championships

Three tournaments were held during 1997 at Lidcombe, they were efficiently run and were enjoyed by the competitors.

This series concluded with the 1997 Championships on 13/14 December at the State Sports Centre Homebush, with 130 students entering. Although the number of participants were down on previous years the standard of play improved.

All officials, parents and most importantly the players enjoyed the two days of Table Tennis. It is anticipated the 1998 Championships should be bigger and better.

NSW UMPIRES ASSOCIATION REPORT

Although not having a high profile, the Umpires Association is alive and well. Members have officiated at all the NSW tournaments as well as most of the major National Championships, including the Australian Open (Pro Tour) Championships and the first Asian Championships in the past year. Some of our members being appointed to major events including the Oceania Championships, Australian Open (again a pro tour) Championships and the Australian Youth Championships.

The Association also conducted two training seminars in 1997, one in Canberra the other in Penrith.

Our membership includes 4 International Referees (of a world total of only 67), 8 International Umpires, 25 State Umpires and 4 Probationary State Umpires.

Despite strong competition for very few positions, our members are expected to be well represented at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games when the appointments are made.

Following the 2000 Olympics will be the Paralympic Games with the requirement of many more officials, which will give many more of our members the opportunity to officiate and be involved.

Umpires for this event need to be at least National Umpires and people gaining the State Umpires qualification this year could still just be eligible.

To assist people to qualify the association intends to hold both a National Umpires Seminar to allow current State Umpires to upgrade to National status, and another State Umpires Seminar to allow new people to qualify this year providing 5 people are interested.

Dates and venues for these seminars are to be decided. Please let us know if you are interested. There will be a \$10.00 registration charge, refundable on attendance.

COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I present this report of coaching activities for the period January 1997 to March 1998 covering the planing and conduct of coaching and development activities throughout the period.

No specific funding for the position of TTNSW Coaching Director was available although the Development Grant from the Department Of Sport And Recreation subsidised various programs. These included Coach Education, School and Club Promotion and NSW State Development Squad Training. Ron Pickering and I were successful in obtaining a \$5000 special training grant from the NSW Department of Sport.

The Coaching/Development Plan formulated in January/February was unable to be implemented in total. Although the plan had full endorsement of a working committee, The NSW Dept. of Sport and Recreation and Table Tennis Australia. The curtail appointment of a Coaching/Development Officer was not effected. This decision had a diluting effect on the management and execution of the plan and consequently on the achievement of objectives in key performance areas.

I believe that until such an appointment is made the coaching and development strategies to increase the quality and quantity of players will be compromised.

National Coaching Committee

As the NSW representative on the NCC I continued a working relationship with the National Coach Mr. Jerzy Grycan, the NCD Glen Tepper and the National Development Director Ms. Wilhemina Pruyn. I attended Meetings and conferences in Sydney and Melbourne related to National Training Camps, Coach Education, National Schools Championships and Development.

John Panders and I attended an Oceania Olympic Solidarity Course conducted by ITTF over four days in Adelaide. This course was conducted by the English TTA coach Michele Gadal. The course involved a series of lectures and hands-on junior coaching. I would like to thank TTNSW for part-sponsoring John and my expenses.

Coach Education

A level 1 NCAS was conducted at Campbelltown in March with 14 prospective coaches in attendance, with participants from City and Country regions. The course was successful and 8 coaches have completed all tasks and have gained accreditation. Special thanks to Jim Wright for his outstanding effort in the planning and management of the coaching course.

A level 2 Coaching Course will be held in Sydney on the weekend of 6th - 8th March under the direction of the National Coach Jerzy Grycan. The course will cover about 50% of the total Table Tennis specific content of the revised NCAS Level 2 syllabus. The current National Register of Coaches lists the following NSW statistics:-

Level 3 ---- 5 Level 2.---- 3 Level 1 ---- 48

The increased numbers and the quality of services provided by Accredited Coaches will impact on development programs during 1998.

Squad Training

Sessions were conducted for each of the State representative teams at Greenacre YMCA and Fort St. High School. The squad training was conducted by Johnny Zhou, Brett Solo and myself with sencial assistance from Frank Pettigrove, Dave Beaumont and Paul Uttley. The under 17 Boys team comprising John Tawadrous, Adam Green, and Tim Singhal performed well above expectations (seeded #8) and won a bronze medal in the teams event.

Congratulations to all team members.

Olympic Athlete Program

NSW had no members in the OAP after Stella Zhou was unable to commit sufficient time to the program owing to academic obligations. In September 1997 the National Selectors invited 11 year old John Tawadrous to join the OAP Squad. TTNSW endorses the opinions of the Selectors and will provide John with necessary support in recognition of his achievements and commitment.

Development

The Development Management Plan was completed in February 1997 and provided TTNSW with a definite direction and strategies to increase participation within NSW. Unfortunately the plan did not proceed as planned due to critical decisions not being made, as a result of TTA policy not being totally compatible with that of TTNSW. It is hoped that the plan will not become another 'paper tiger' and a lost opportunity for our sport.

Concluding Remarks

I wish to register my recognition and appreciation to all people that have assisted in the areas of coaching and development over the past year from the National to club level of operation. I further wish to thank all coaches, players parents and officials that I have had the priveledge to work with continuously since 1982. In 1997 I was absent from Australia for four months and during 1998 I will be overseas from June. For this reason I will not be seeking re-appointment as the Director of Coaching nor the Council of TTNSW which I have served for 16 years. I consider that some 'new blood' in this important position will provide NSW with some new direction and energy. The position has been very rewarding and most enjoyable, but also very challenging.

Our sport has enormous potential both before and after the Olympics in 2000. It will require astute judgement and critical decision making to fully develop. Enthusiasm and dedication will be the foundation for success, together with accepted business principles underpinning policy and operations.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Ladies & Gentlemen, I present to you the audited financial report of Table Tennis NSW Inc. for the financial year 1st January 1997 to 31st December 1997.

Unfortunately a loss of \$5828-31 was incurred during 1997, however it was predominantly the write-off of old equipment and depreciation of current equipment. With that in mind, the actual monetary loss was \$2672-18. Once again this is mainly due to administration costs.

The cost of running the association is always high and in 1997 a decision to increase mailings to all registered members, except for School/PCYC members, increased our postage bill quite significantly. This action was deemed necessary as the mailing list was not working effectively and members were not being informed of what was happening.

In most other areas we did stay in the black or just about break even. Once again we could not have survived without the assistance of the Department of Sport and Recreation. Subsidies for employment costs and assistance for developmental purposes was used to offset the costs of these programs during the year.

This year we did a substantial stocktake of our office and table tennis equipment. This has resulted in an accurate record of all our equipment being established, and as mentioned above it did result in a lot of equipment being written off as well as current and new equipment being depreciated to an acceptable level. It has achieved the purpose of knowing exactly where we are in regard to equipment.

Table Tennis Australia is working on a Strategic Plan that should revolutionise Table Tennis management in NSW and throughout Australia. This plan, hopefully in 1999 when implemented, will bring direct benefits to NSW in the employment of a NSW Manager and Development Officer. TTNSW will still be around but Table Tennis Australia personnel will undertake most of the administrative and development work.

I will not be continuing as Finance Director for 1998 as my workload in other Table Tennis areas has increased significantly. I feel that this position should be taken over by someone with more time to devote to the job and who also lives in Sydney and is therefore closer to the office,

I thank all of you in NSW for your assistance over the years I have been in the job. I will still be involved with TTNSW in a lesser capacity in the future.
