PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year has been a challenge for most sports, not the least Table Tennis.

Mixed Health messages from Government instrumentalities, and Landlords have meant that our workload increased at the same time as revenues decreased.

We have however come through largely unscathed and determined to push for growth and profit in 2021-22 and beyond.

The past year has seen some successful initiatives.

Beginning with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Table Tennis Australia, which has crystallised a good proportion of our on-going revenue as well as laying out a participation plan for our sport.

Notable achievements through the year have been as follows:

1. We have hit all Government Benchmarks
2. Functioning Sub committees.

Our Media and Tournament Committees, despite the ravages of COVID-19 have performed well.

We are looking at adding a Junior's sub-committee and involving parents in its formation and running.

Our Annual Calendar preparation is an onerous task and will profit from the appointment of additional expertise as a focus group.

3. Budgets and Revenue

Table Tennis NSW has long run under a system of DI-DO or Dollar In - Dollar Out. The result being that we have little in the way of reserves to allocate to funding a permanent center, promoting our sport and keeping our facilities up to date and functioning efficiently.

So, we intend to embrace some considerable change in the way we do business. For the balance of 2022 we will continue to run the business un-changed, but at the same time we will be planning and articulating our strategy for 2023 and beyond.

More on this as the picture develops.

President's Report (Continued)

4. Our Schools Strategy.

We have appointed an experienced consultant (Ross Abbott) and tasked him with increasing the participation of School children in the sport of Table Tennis.

We are having some minor gains at present, but this should increase dramatically post-COVID and into the back end of this year, with a dramatic increase in 2023.

TTNSW Inc.

We began 2021 still under the impacts of the COVID-19 Virus.

We commenced our Calendar for 2021 with GPS Schools and TTA High Performance training and Veterans Challenge all under way.

Table Tennis Australia had already combined Open, Junior Youth and Para Championships to one event to be held at Caloundra in July and the Australian Veterans was re-scheduled for Darwin in October. Teams for the July Championship had been selected in early April and we continued training up until the 2nd last week in June.

By the last week in June, we were once again thrust into lock-down and the Championships again were placed on hold. The Lockdowns continued until October. All Championships were eventually re-scheduled to 2022 - July for the Open, Junior, Youth and Para's at the same venue in Caloundra and the Veterans to Darwin in October.

From March onwards COVID-19 Vaccines had been approved and were scheduled by necessity, i.e., frontline Health workers first, etc. Initially, the time between the 1st and 2nd doses was set at 3 months, then ultimately it was streamlined to a shorter time period. The 3rd vaccine (or boosters) were approved late in 2021 with the time period initially set at 6 months between the 2nd dose and the booster but it was then streamlined to a shorter waiting period.

Some interstate travel was permitted within individual state guidelines.

For the 2022 National Championships due to be held in July it is inevitable that double vaccination and the eligible boosters will be required to travel almost everywhere out of our State. With this in mind, we have followed the Department of Health medical authorities and have travelled down this path in preparation for the 2022 National Championships and for living with COVID.

The Federal Government and Health Authorities and other Government agencies acted swiftly in putting in place legislation to continue to manage the spread. Eventually most restrictions were lifted in December and some air travel commenced - international arrivals were permitted and some domestic travel was permitted.

Our return to Sport was identified by the National Authorities and was in line with the Federal Government template.

I would like to thank our Tournament Committee and all our members for assisting with the new and unusual procedures required to continue playing our game. The Tournament Draws and scheduling processes introduced are outlined in the **State Tournaments Report** appearing on Page 17 of this Annual Report.

Everyone is now used to the new procedures, and everyone was extremely helpful and assisted with a smooth transition on entry, abiding by the social distancing, taking responsibility for their own personal space, assisting with regular cleaning and sanitising of tables and chairs, and checking draws and proceeding to their designated tables.

Secretary's Report (Continued)

The Veterans Teams Challenge Pennant days were also very smoothly completed with total cooperation from the Veterans Committee and the players. However, only half of the Veterans Teams Challenge draw was completed before NSW was thrown back into lockdown.

Throughout the year there were regular updates on the COVID situation as they come to hand and information placed on one or more of our digital platforms.

For 2022 we will be continuing the use of timed draws and, where necessary, using two days for events held at the Sports Halls, Sydney Olympic Park, as well as continuing with the use of the safety protocols for as long as necessary.

The Table Tennis NSW all of Sport Strategic Plan (NSW version) has been working well and due to the success of the grant applications we are able to continue with the initiatives in the Social Media area and across all digital platforms. New sub committees were formed, and hierarchies are now in place across our: Website, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube and Table Tennis Community Board. The Social Media team were in action at tournaments with many cameras and conducted several interviews using the Media area. The Media team have been releasing photos and of-interest articles on a regular basis across several platforms. A big "Thank You" to Slawek, Dylan, Anthony, and David. This is an exciting time as the younger members have taken to these new roles and are also working closely with Karen Zhang (a former NSW Junior based in Sydney) who is currently on the Table Tennis Australia Board.

Most of our committee meetings during the year were held via ZOOM - Thanks to Ted for organising these. Our 2022 AGM is scheduled for 26 March and is tentatively set as a ZOOM meeting unless the conditions at the time enable the holding of a face-to-face meeting at Sports House where social distancing can be maintained.

Some of the changes which continued from 2020 into 2021 are improvements and will be retained. Some of the items we have been trying to secure over the past couple of years are now automatic - i.e., more bins and more floor cleaning. The venue requirement is to have a cleaner on site to wipe down the hard common surfaces. Most bookings at the Sports Halls for 2022 have been maintained as both Saturday and Sunday bookings. This is to ensure social distancing and to ensure that scheduled events do not clash.

I would also like to thank our valuable Major sponsors who have come to our rescue in our time of need: Grants - NSW Office of Sport and Table Tennis World, providing immediately on request, essential equipment necessary to continue safely in our sport.

I have audited the financial statements presented to me for the year ended 31st December, 2021, which showed an operating loss of \$53903 and Equity of \$319,673.


The committee of management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW).

TABLE TENNIS AUSTRALIA - 2021 REPORT

Although 2021 was hampered again by COVID-19, particularly in NSW and Victoria, as a whole table tennis continued to fare much better than most other sports. Play continued throughout the year (unless lockdowns were in place) and the “new normal” became embedded across the country. Ironically, given the ongoing travel difficulties, the biggest achievements of 2021 came on the international stage. Highlights from 2021 include, but are not limited to:

HIGH PERFORMANCE:

- Australia enjoyed a record-breaking Tokyo Paralympic Games, with 11 athletes qualifying to compete and the team claiming 2 gold and 4 silver medals and finishing second on the table tennis medal tally, only behind China. Medals were achieved by: Qian Yang (Gold Class 10 Women's Singles), Lina Lei (Gold Class 9 Women's Singles), Sam von Einem (Silver Class 11 Men's Singles), Ma Lin (Silver Class 9 Men's Singles), Qian Yang / Lina Lei / Melissa Tapper (Silver Class 9-10 Women's Teams), Ma Lin / Joel Coughlan / Nathan Pellissier (Silver Class 9-10 Men's Teams). Moreover, team member Danni Di Toro had the honour of being named as Co-Captain of the Australian Paralympic Team.
- A group of 8 Australian athletes together with John Murphy (National Head Coach - Able-Bodied) undertook a hugely successful European Tour winning 8 gold, 3 silver and 5 bronze medals. As a result, big improvements in world rankings were realised, most notably NSW's Yangzi Liu reaching number 6 in Under 19 Girls and Nicholas Lum reaching number 8 in Under 17 Boys.
- Australia qualified the maximum quota of athletes for the Tokyo Olympic Games, with Jian Fang Lay competing in a record equalling sixth Olympic Games and equalling the best ever Women's Singles result by an Australian by winning through to the fourth round. Along the way she defeated former European Champion Li Qian.
- National Squad training continued to go from strength to strength, with record training hours continuing to be offered in Melbourne and Sydney.
- Player of the Year awards went to: Jian Fang Lay (Senior - Victor Barna Memorial Trophy), Qian Yang (Para - Arthur Wilks Award), Nicholas Lum (Junior - Michael Szabados Award). NOTE: The Ken Cole Trophy (Veterans) was not presented in 2021 due to no national or international events being held.
- Eva Jeler undertook a Coach Development Program with six identified coaches from around Australia, namely: Hongbo Liang (NSW), George Logothetis (Queensland), Franck Roguez (Queensland), Maggie Meng (Victoria), Peter Tretinik (Victoria) and Ajay Suwal (Western Australia).

PARTICIPATION AND DEVELOPMENT:

- The [TTA Equipment and Facilities Grant Program](#) was successfully rolled out for a fourth straight year. 13 clubs / associations from 6 States / Territories received grants including Forestville Table Tennis Association, Illawarra District Table Tennis Association and Kiama Table Tennis Club, which resulted in more than \$114,000 worth of equipment and facilities being injected into the table tennis community. Cumulatively across the four years of the program, more than \$354,000 worth of equipment and facilities has been distributed to 54 clubs / associations across all 8 States / Territories.
- 13 outstanding contributors to the sport were honoured through the [National Volunteer Awards Program](#). From NSW Theo Morsink, Stephen Gillespie, Joy Boyd OAM and Tom Boyd OAM were all recognised. Greg Bungey (SA) had the honour of being awarded the Bev and Brian James Trophy as the 2021 National Volunteer of the Year.
- Membership rebounded strongly to pre-COVID-19 levels, with the 10,000-member mark being surpassed.
- Overall participation rebounded strongly to approach pre-COVID-19 levels, with more than 135,000 participants being realised.
- Our entry level program, Spinnerroos, continued to be rolled out at both club and school level throughout Australia, including some new initiatives such as Girls Only Spinnerroos.

NATIONAL EVENTS:

- The National Hopes Week & Challenge was a huge success, with a record 60 players from 7 States / Territories attending. This event continues to lay the foundation for the next generation of Australian players and will continue to be a key focus moving forward.
- The inaugural TTA Tour - Sydney event was successful, with more than 150 participants and nearly 300 individual event entries. With singles events being held from Men's / Women's through to Under 11 Boys' / Girls', plus Para events, the formula for this pilot event appears to be right and TTA is looking forward to expanding the TTA Tour in 2022.
- Unfortunately, the National Senior, Youth, Junior and Para Championships, plus the National Veterans Championships and the TTA Tour - Melbourne all had to be cancelled due to COVID-19.

RECOGNITION INITIATIVES:

- Undertook the [Official Australian Representatives \(Para\)](#) project, which identified the 73 men and 29 women who have represented Australia at senior level in para competitions, including identifying the complete career record for each athlete.
- 4 icons of Australian table tennis were inducted into the [TTA Hall of Fame](#): Karol Javor (Coaches - posthumously), Fran Keyhoe (Referees and Umpires - posthumously), Graeme Ireland (Referees and Umpires; Administrators) and David Delpratt (Referees and Umpires).
- The 50th anniversary of the Ping Pong Diplomacy Tour was celebrated on 21 April. The three surviving members of the team, Noel Shorter, Paul Pinkewich and Steve Knapp came together to [celebrate the occasion](#).
- The [Top 10 National Rankings](#) lists from 1948-2020 were collated and published.
- TTA's oldest Life Member, Cecil Shaw, [celebrated his 100th birthday on 27 August](#). TTA presented Cecil with a National Team shirt with the wording "100 NOT OUT" on the back to mark the occasion.
- The history of the first ever [National Championships in 1933](#) was collated and published.

GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE:

- TTA's governance rating through the Sport Australia Mandatory Sports Governance Principles Assessment reached a record high. TTA achieved a score of 3.2 out of 4.0, which is significantly higher than other similar sized sports (2.7) and all other sports combined (2.9).
- For the first time, TTA entered into MOUs with 5 State / Territory Associations, namely: Table Tennis ACT, Table Tennis NSW, Table Tennis Northern Territory, Table Tennis Tasmania and Table Tennis Western Australia. Through the MOUs, each party has clearly defined roles and responsibilities and TTA is able to provide a direct financial contribution for the first time ever. TTA is hopeful that MOUs with the remaining State / Territory Associations will be finalised in 2022.
- A fourth consecutive surplus will be achieved and TTA cash reserves continue to grow. This further underlines the strength of TTA's financial reforms and financial management over the past four years, where our business model has continued to stack up under difficult circumstances.

- Australia has significantly increased its reach within ITTF, with multiple people being elected / appointed to key ITTF positions, namely: Graham Symons (ITTF Executive Committee as a Vice President), Graeme Ireland and Scott Houston (ITTF Board of Directors), Alan Hopkins (ITTF Umpires and Referees Committee), Scott Houston (ITTF Veterans Committee).

I offer sincere thanks to everyone who contributed to our great sport throughout 2021; your contribution is both recognised and appreciated. Here's to a successful 2022!

NSW is well represented at the lowest and highest levels of officials. Where we struggle is with representation at the National Level.

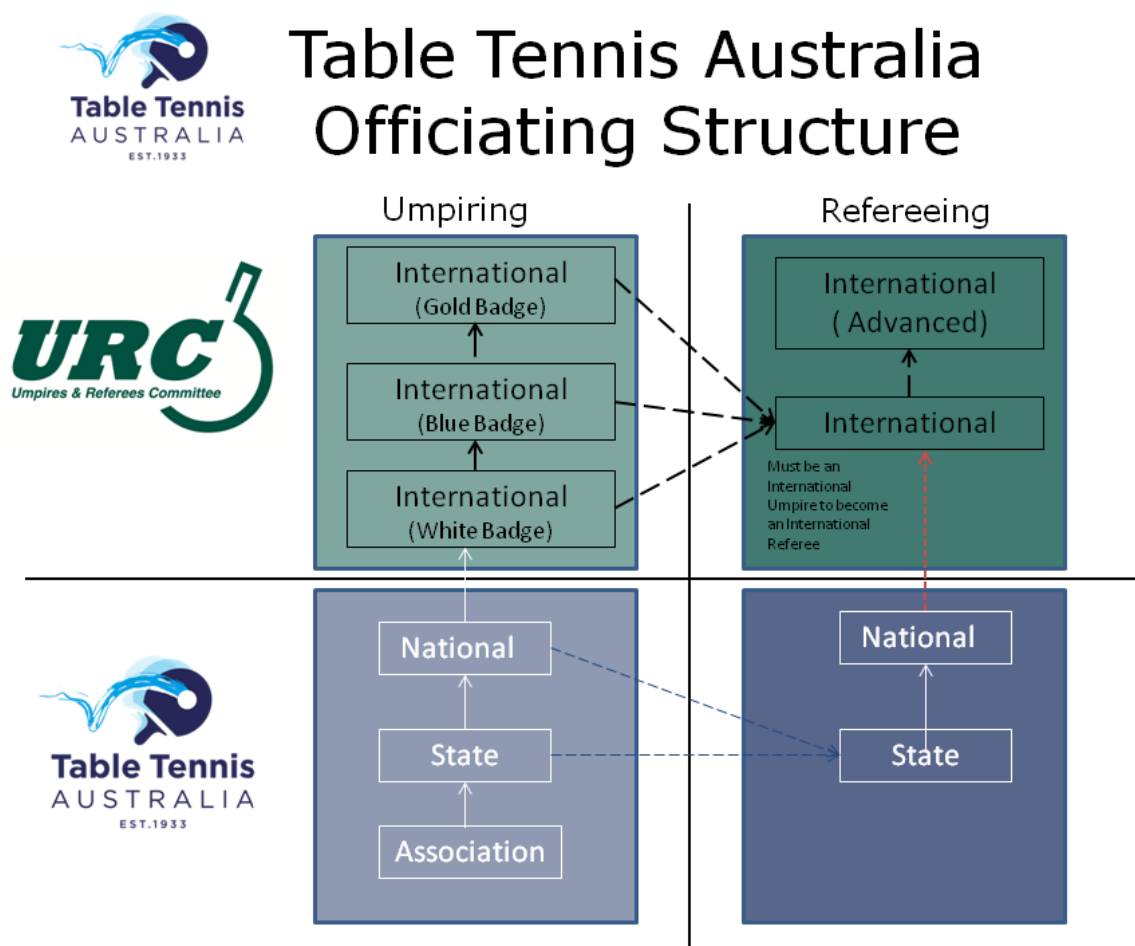
From my point of view, there are two main factors that affect this progression.

STATE TOURNAMENTS REPORT

The various restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 safety protocols saw a number of new operational methods implemented in 2020 and 2021.

All Tournament draws were conducted as fully timed draws with singles events only (i.e., no doubles). All events were timed to play to completion, ensuring a “get in - play - get out” approach. Many tournaments were held over two days to spread out the schedule. Both measures aided in minimising the number of participants in the venue at any one time

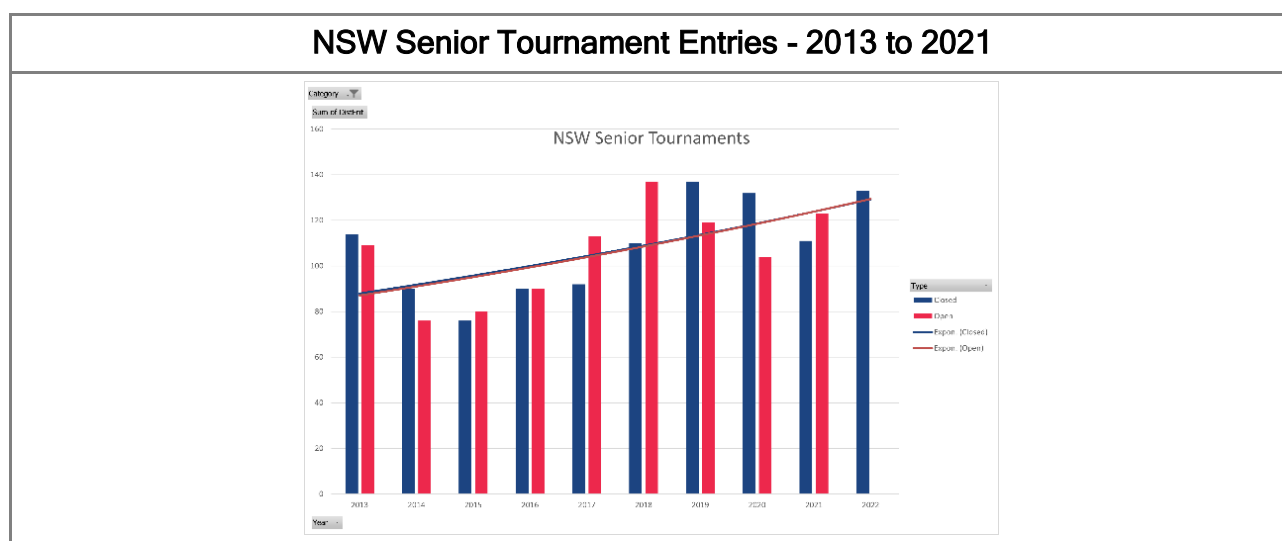
Another operational method that was implemented minimised congestion at the Tournament Control desk. Players were encouraged to go directly to their allocated table. This was achieved by providing real-time results on the TTNSW website which players could then access via their phones to find out their relevant times and tables. Volunteers and Officials delivered the Score Boards, Pens and Balls to the tables.

The continuation of the on-line entry system which was implemented a few years ago, whereby only current registered members can enter events, continues to positively impact the timely payment of TTNSW membership fees.

The continuation of the tournament entry early-bird online payment system, also implemented a few years ago, continues to encourage early entry and early payment which contributes to a massive reduction in manual administration work.

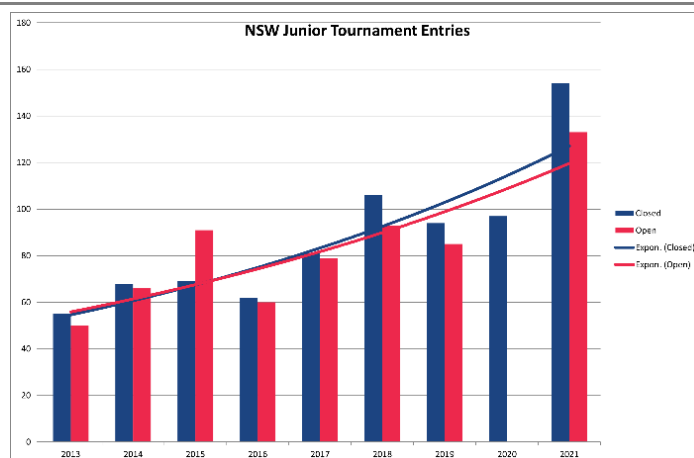

The last table in this report shows the players who have played the most Tournaments during the same period of 2013 to 2021.

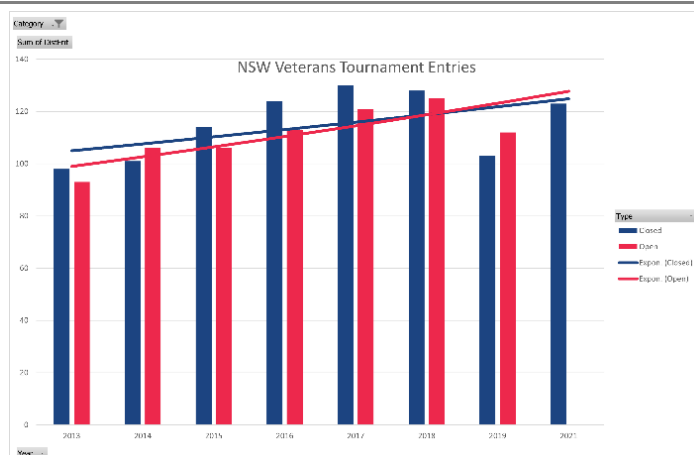
