ANNUAL REPORT

The Fifty-Sixth Annual Report to be presented to Member Association at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Sunday, 14th June, commencing 2.30pm, at Leichhardt Table Tennis Club, Marlborough Street, Leichhardt.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

This year was one of the rare periods in our history when we held no International Matches or National Championships on our home soil.

A year when our Mens senior team finished in 6th place, the worst result in our history. However, at the opposite end of the scale, our Womens senior team won their third successive National Teams title, a feat only bettered by our great womens teams of the 1950-55 era, when we won six Australian Womens Championships without a loss.

Other outstanding performances are listed under their respective headings.

A year when challenging tasks were set by the President, more Committee meetings and a greater involvement in School Table Tennis, or perish. It is pleasing to report that both challenges were taken up and met and efforts of Officials in both areas are continuing.

Olympic Games Involvement

The benefits of Table Tennis being a full Olympic Sport, whilst mainly at the very Elite level, will flow gradually throughout the Sport as time elapses.

In 1992, an Olympic Solidarity Oceania Zone Course will be held at Narrabeen for tournament administrators and coaching of coaches. This will provide NSW officials with the opportunity of taking part in a six-day Course which will see ITTF Rules Committee Chairman, Mr. Colin Clemett, ETTA National Teams Coach, Donald Parker, and his Wife, the world-famous Jill Hammersley as Course experts.

Our congratulations are extended to Catherine Ying Kwok, who has gained selection in the 1992 Australian Olympic Table Tennis team to Barcelona, with Kerri Tepper from Victoria.

Catherine thus becomes NSW's second Olympian, with fellow Novocastrian Gary Haberl.

By the way, if you want to see more Table Tennis on your TV screens, have your members write to Channel 7 requesting same.

Schools Table Tennis

We continue to regard School, Junior and Youth Table Tennis and "grass root" development as our main priorities. We were a little disappointed with the entry in the Secondary Schools competition. It seems in previous years, it was agreed our competition started too close to some school examinations and despite re-evaluating State dates to National dates and after consultation with some school authorities, we regard the dates as still being a major problem in lack of entries.

To overcome this problem, wider ranging discussions will be held and in 1992, a First-term date will be used to run the preliminary rounds. School mail

distribution Centres will be used to reach more schools and greater emphasis placed on Country areas. We must also report on two new developments, firstly the appointment by the Illawarra Table Tennis Association of Mrs. Joy Brown as their part-time Development Officer, concentrating on School Table Tennis, and the introduction of a Primary Schools competition by the Mid Districts Table Tennis Association, both most commendable projects.

This year, our State Office, with assistance from several Metropolitan officials and parents, will take the Primary School activities one or two steps further, schools will be visited and provided with coaching and demonstrations. The Primary Schools competition will be expanded Metropolitan wide and, hopefully, into the Country. However, it must be pointed out that our State Administrators must receive support from all areas, from all Associations, Country League and Metropolitan officials, if we are to make worth-while inroads into the School System.
