PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2007

Well, my second year as President has not been any easier than the first year, however, I have gained a year's experience to manage a demanding schedule of commitments from within the State and Table Tennis Australia.

I am pleased to announce a number of gains achieved through the hard work of affiliated Associations, Clubs and members of the NSW Board and Committees. They deserve our praise for their devotion to table tennis and our thanks for the many hours of unpaid volunteer work.

I am pleased to say NSW TT Inc., has gained recognition in the community for providing a volunteer service to two well known charities namely:

The Children's Hospital at Westmead (event called Teddy Bears Picnic), some 700 kids under the age of 16, visited our stall over a eight- hour period and enjoyed playing on the full size Robot tables as well as the five to eight years old playing on a mini table.

The Variety Club at Convention Centre Darling Harbour, again there were over 400 children under the age of 15.

Both these events could not have been provided without the assistance of some eighteen (18) table tennis players who volunteered their day.

Other City services provided as well as State tournament and club team competitions are monthly coaching for the disabled at Ryde Eastwood Rehabilitation Centre and Mental Health Services at Liverpool. Also one-day events such as Wheel Chair and Paralympic qualifiers.

It must be noted that there are over 1,000 Sydney school children who are not registered, however, TTNSW provides a service in running Schools teams competitions at Homebush, as well as providing coaching at each school.

In the Country area, we are steadily making inroads through the Country League Association, this year there was an increase in number of teams and disabled players attending the Queens Birthday long weekend championships. Country versus City, another fixture that is well attended.

Another Gain for Table Tennis has been that player registration numbers have increased, as follows:

2001 = 583
2002 = 698
2003 = 678
2004 = 703
2005 = 756

2006 = 824
2007 = 985
2008 = our goal is to exceed 1,200 members.

This growth has arisen through achievements made at club and association level, as well as TTNSW staff providing avenues for new players to be involved. Table Tennis NSW Inc. is leading the way to attract new members and inspire the players to attain an elite status, which will build players up to, one day, an Olympic, Paralympic or Commonwealth Games player.

Another goal achieved, was that this year we also set out to simplify and put in plain English the Constitution and the Regulations of TTNSW, this was completed and signed off at the Council Meeting. My special thanks to Leonie Whiteford, Alan Taylor and Ian Finlay for their assistance and patience with me in finalising a matter that has been outstanding for several years.

To the many other volunteers, my thanks.

It is very important that at all times we all promote table tennis and seek volunteers to assist with the challenges that have been placed on TTNSW Inc., in completion of its duties. Without committees, we can not proceed to function and develop to a high standard.

New South Wales has also been heavily involved in the Sydney World Master's Games preparation for 2009. The New South Wales State Government was successful in the bid attempt to host these games. With 30,000 athletes from 100 nations across 28 sports of which Table Tennis is one – the dates for these games are 10th – 17th October 2009.

We have negotiated with the Australian Veteran's Committee and Table Tennis Western Australia to have the Australian Veteran's Championships coincide with these Games for Sydney in 2009. We are in the process of confirming the venue at Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre for both the World Master's and the Australian Veteran's Championships for 2009.

The Australian Veteran's Championships this year again attracted record numbers with –101 teams and 385 entrants – so we are expecting record numbers – for more information on the World Masters Games please check the Website – www.2009worldmastersgames.com

We look forward to continuing our Project Connect Action Plan Stage 2 - (Athletes with Disabilities) to promote and provide more opportunities for these players and look forward to challenge matches with other AWD associations.

JUNIOR DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2007

In 2007, TTNSW provided regular weekly state training sessions (Tuesday nights) at Olympic Park for our junior players. These training sessions were run by Paul Zhao and Amy Chen.

Our elite juniors who are members of the National Squad were exceptionally busy. The weekly routine for the Sydney based players included training on Sunday afternoon, Tuesday nights and competing in the State Pennant on Thursday night.

On top of that they also attended major national and international tournaments in preparation for the Australian Junior Championships.

In April, Belinda Le, Christopher Kwok, Kane Townsend, Wade Townsend and Xiao Wang were part of the NSW Youth team competing in the Australian Youth Championships in Lismore.

In June, Belinda Le, Chermaine Chen, Wade Townsend and Xiao Wang competed against the senior players at the Australian Open Championships in Victoria. In July they travelled to New Zealand for the World Junior Circuit Event, where they competed against top juniors from Japan, Korea, India and Singapore. Whilst in New Zealand Kane and Wade were members of the Australian Junior team and Belinda, Chermaine and Xiao represented NSW in the North Island Championships.

With their scholarships, Belinda Le and Wade Townsend went to New Caledonia, in July, where they took part in the Oceania Youth Training Camp and also competed in the New Caledonia Championships. Kane Townsend also participated in both events.

Back on Australian shores, Xiao rejoined them in Brisbane for the Australian Closed Championships.

October came around and NSW selected a team of 43 juniors, a mixture of the older experienced players and young upcoming talented debutantes (11yr to 18yr old) to play in the Australian Junior Championships in Adelaide. It was a successful week for everyone including team coaches. The players were well behaved and displayed excellent sportsmanship during the Championships.

Our under 13Boys A-team comprising Chitra Ly, Danny Rauv, Kevin Qian and Vincent Tran won the GOLD medal with a 5-4 win over Western Australia. The under 18 Men's and Women's A-teams had to settle for SILVER after losing to the strong Victorian Teams in the final round. The under 13Girls A-team were unlucky, being awarded the BRONZE medal following a count back after 3 teams finished with equal wins.

In the individual event, our under 18 girls dominated the field. It was an all NSW finals for the under 18 Women's Singles event, with Chermaine Chen being the winner and Belinda Le runner-up.

In the under 18 Women's Doubles, Chermaine teamed up with her team mate Madeline to win the Finals defeating Belinda and her partner Ashleigh Stevenson from Queensland.

Chitra Ly reached the semi-final stage of the under 13 Boys Singles event. Chitra then teamed up with Vincent to win the Final of the under 13 boys Doubles. Vincent Tran and mixed doubles partner Irene Fu upset the top seeds to reach the finals of the under 13 mixed doubles.

In conclusion, NSW had a very successful year with the juniors. Special thanks to all coaches and parents for volunteering their time at the Junior Championships. I wish everyone all the best for 2008.

COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2007

1. Appointment of Director of Coaching made in -2007
2. I have proposed a coaching structure for NSW with the Board of Directors, Secretary and NSW President. The proposed coaching structure was approved by the Board's members.
3. The following provides an outline of the NSW Table Tennis proposed coaching structure:
 - The training system is designed to work in with the proposed National Training Centres for high performance program
 - Our common aims/key focus areas are development, participation and competitions
 - The structure creates a bottom up approach to table tennis sport and enables the sport to concentrate its efforts on developing the foundation for future growth, up to the elite level of international standard
 - In developing the coaching structure, we will need to ensure that strategies are put into place to develop and implement into our table tennis sport and create opportunities at all levels to complement proposed high performance programs.

It is proposed to conduct the training system at the Indoor Sports Hall, Olympic Park, Homebush on Tuesday evenings on a weekly basis over a 25-week period.

It is proposed to regularly review all the selected players in the State Squads for their training development programs. In order for the players to maintain their NSW State Squad privilege status, they must attend a minimum of 80% of the designated training sessions and have the right attitude and discipline towards training.

STATE COACHING COMMITTEE:

A small committee is responsible for setting the coaching goals for Table Tennis NSW. It is proposed to include the NSW Coaching Director and the Junior Director, Director for Junior Development, Disabilities Director and Schools Director and any NSW Board Members.

STATE COACHING DIRECTOR: PAUL ZHAO

Paul will be responsible for developing the coaching strategy and managing the implementation of the overall coaching plan for NSW.

COACHING DEVELOPMENT:

A person will be responsible for developing new Level 1 and Level 2 coaches and providing ongoing updates for their coaching knowledge and training skills.

COACHING RESOURCE FOR SCHOOL:

A person will be responsible for offering table tennis coaching services to all NSW schools. The services include, but are not limited to:

- supply of qualified table tennis coaches to schools for their training needs
- promote table tennis as a sport at the grass roots level in schools
- identify potential talented players
- co-ordinate school tournaments

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 5 to 10 new Level 1 coaches or Level 1 coaches in training working in conjunction with the Coaching Development to train Junior players. The purposes are to:

- develop proper basic technical skills
- develop individual playing styles
- groom potential Junior players for State Junior Squad

STATE JUNIOR COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 1 & Level 2 coaches to train the State Junior Squad. The purposes are to:

- consolidate their technical skills
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- groom potential Junior players for State Senior or Youth Squads

SENIOR/YOUTH COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 2 & Level 3 coaches to train the State Senior and Youth Squads. The purposes are to:

- consolidate their technical skills

4. As the NSW Coaching Director, I would like to comment on the above, as the implementer of the NSW coaching structure.

I am able to delegate Assistant coaches for coaching the Junior Development Team. These players provided a useful resource for selecting the Junior Squad.

The Coaching Development for level 1 and level 2 coaches have worked out well in conjunction with the coaching development team to train Junior players. These Coaches were, at the same time, also benefiting as they were provided with ongoing updates for their own coaching knowledge and training skills.

Veteran teams and AWD teams were trained accordingly to improve their skills. NSW Senior and Youth Squad players were originally proposed to train with NSW State Teams where I will consolidate their technical and tactical skills and improve their individual style of playing, in order to groom them into potentially top players where they will then go to National Training Centres for the high performance program.

Unfortunately, some NSW squad players were training directly with National Training Centres, without the process of consolidation and development in their new skills directions.

These state players have not completed NSW training schedules and were not involved in any National Training Centre's sessions. Neither did they attend any combined training sessions with the NSW State Squad Team. For example: Kiet Tran, taking the Australian Senior's ranking of 3rd in 2006, but without training, in 2007 had dropped to the Australian Seniors ranking of no. 6 and also, the same way of failure applied for George Tang. In 2006, he took the Australian Seniors ranking at 4th, yet, in 2007, he had also dropped right down to the Australian Seniors' ranking of 11th, thereby losing his position in the Australian Top 10 Open Men's ranking.

In my view, I believe that he took the wrong training path in his style of playing. Therefore, both men will lose opportunity for the Qualifying Selection of the 2008 the Worlds' Senior Teams Championship.

For Senior Women: Leonie Whiteford, Secretary of NSWTTA, and Les Walczuk, President of NSWTTA had made a correct decision for Vivian Tan to participate and represent NSW Senior Women's teams to compete in 2007 Women Seniors' Championship in Melbourne, Victoria. The Women's Senior team received a Silver medal.

In 2007, Vivian Tan placed 7th in Australian Women's Senior ranking. Chermaine Chen placed 8th; Si Si Zhang placed 9th; Michelle Beaumont placed 10th. Special and outstanding player Chermaine Chen defeated Jian Fang Lay (VIC) 4:3; Chermaine Chen also defeated Stephanie Sang (VIC) 3:0; and lost to Miao Miao (VIC) 2:3. For the first time, our NSW women teams players performed so vigorously well in 2007 Senior Women's Open Championships.

5. Coaching and training was conducted at Homebush State Indoor Sports Centre every Tuesday night weekly from 6.30pm to 9.30pm over 20 weeks. Some alternate Saturday and Sunday sessions 1pm to 5pm for 9 weeks. In total, there were 29 training sessions, totalling 93 hours. Approximately, each training session had between 20 and 50 players in attendance.

Sub-junior players (age 9-11 Years old) averaged 18-23 players attending the training sessions. Junior players (12-15 years old) averaged over 10-15 players attending each training session.

Junior/Youth (Age 16-21 years old) averaged between 8-12 players attending the above training sessions. Seniors/Veteran and AWD players averaged 15-20 players.

In my view, if we want to develop the training sessions further, we should give an avenue to achieve a goal for the players such as to earn a title to enter into State Junior Development Squad, State Junior, Senior /Youth, Veteran, AWD Squad; as many sub-junior, Junior, Senior, Veteran and AWD players may build up a foundation so that future teams may be strong and will consist of many people to battle against other states at an International standard. Future generations may learn from them too. Thus, this would lead to true victory to happen consistently.

In order for the players to maintain their NSW State Squads teams Privilege status, they need to attend or maintain a minimum of 60% to 80% of the training sessions at Homebush State Indoor Sport Centre. These players who have a high attendance record will then be offered on condition, into the Selection Committee for them to be selected as an Australian National Competition Championship Teams player. But, at the moment, for example, 80%-95% Sub-Junior and Junior players with high attendance records in training sessions, did not even have a chance to compete in competition, so they cannot participate in the Australian National Competition Championship.

In my point of view, the Board should set some rules regarding players who are, or will be, in the Australian National Competition Championship Teams, should have high attendance percentage record in training sessions. It is easier to maintain management in Squads and all players and cover the rental of the Hall in Homebush State Indoor Centre. (Note: not including country players- for 60% to 80 % attendance in training session.

6. The coaching & training sessions during the year, in preparation for the National Junior, Senior/Youth, Veteran Championships and Australian Table Tennis Open Championships, were implemented. The results were:

National Training Centre Report 2007

The National Training Centre (NTC) was introduced by TTA late 2006, to provide training for National Squad members (players selected by TTA based on their results). Currently there are 4 NTC (NSW, S.A, Victoria and QLD). The NTC for NSW is based at Fairfield PCYC. Training also takes place at Olympic Park during competition periods.

The first month started off very slowly mainly due to the fact that I had to get to “know” each player individually, before I set up an appropriate training program for them. I mainly set training programs for junior and youth players. Senior members are usually well established athletes who already have their own individual program.

Throughout the season, the squad members not only trained hard individually, but they all united to work together as a team during training, supporting and pushing each other to the limit. This “team effort” was the key to their individual success at national championships.

Currently, our senior members are preparing for the Olympic Trial to be held in March 2008. Some have arranged to train overseas for the next few months leading up to the trial. Our junior squad members are back at training, after 2 weeks break. They are currently working on their off-season program.

Individual report for each squad member

Daryn Lu

The training program set for Daryn was to improve his physical fitness and quality of strokes. Daryn competed well throughout the week at the Australian Youth Championships (AYC).

Unfortunately Daryn was dropped from the National Squad in July, due to his lack of commitment to table tennis after the AYC.

George Tang

To prepare for tournaments, George trains overseas (in Hong Kong, Japan & China) during the off-season and continues with his own training program at the NTC. It was unfortunate for George to be the only senior member to train with the younger squad members throughout the year.

Kiet Tran

Kiet chose to train on his own for most of the year. With the latest squad selection and player's agreement, Kiet now trains once a week at the NTC with his own program.

Michelle Beaumont

Michelle's major tournaments for this year were the AYC and the Australian Open & Closed. The main goal was to break into the top10 in the Women's games.

The training program to prepare for the AYC was concentrated mainly on improving her power game by improving quality of her techniques. We also worked on physical fitness for quicker movement on court.

As a result Michelle competed well at the AYC losing only to the number 1 seed, Claire Campbell-Innes.

Preparation for the Australian Open & Closed was in similar fashion. We also worked on strengthening her weakness that was evident at the most recent AYC.

Michelle was in peak form for the Australian Open, defeating a few S.A players who were ranked in the top10 last year.

Vivian Tan

Vivian Tan was recently selected on the National Squad in September. She attends training once a week at the NTC. Like other senior members, Vivian has her own training program.

Chitra Ly, Madeline Wong & Vincent Tran

Chitra, Madeline and Vincent joined the National Squad in July, 2 months to the Australian Junior Championships (AJC). The 3 new junior squad members had been training with their private coaches, but they don't have any existing training plan for the whole year. With the short time that we had left before the AJC, we mainly concentrated on physical fitness, tactics and match practise to prepare them the best we could for the championship.

Belinda Le

Belinda had 3 major goals for 2007: To improve on her results from previous Australian Youth Championships (AYC), to gain as much competition experience as possible from national/international tournaments while she's in year 11, and to win the U18 Women's title at the Australian Junior Championships (AJC).

To start the year, Belinda's training program was set so that she would be in peak form for the AYC to play her best table tennis. We concentrated mainly on consistency and to further develop her preferred style of play (counter attack, close to the table where she is most comfortable).

Training at high intensity level with other squad members was of great benefit, improving her game rapidly. Unfortunately, Belinda also developed shin splints during the process.

Due to her busy tournaments schedules that she has already committed to, there was not enough time for Belinda to undergo the full recovery/rehabilitation program. We had to modify Belinda's training program to keep her injury under control, thus allowing her to continue training and prepare the best she could for the AJC.

Leading up to the AJC, we scheduled shorter training sessions, throughout the week with at least 2 days break to allow adequate recovery time from each session. The training sessions were also modified with shorter & lighter footwork exercise plus more regular breaks in between exercises.

Immediately after the AJC, Belinda started on her full 6 weeks recovery/rehabilitation program. She will have a bone scan to make sure she is fully recovered before resuming training.

Christopher Kwok

Early in the year, a training plan was set for Chris to prepare for the AYC. Training for Chris was focussed mainly on consistency and footwork.

After the AYC, Chris decided that his study requires more time, and decided to skip the rest of the year. With no intention of competing for the rest of the year, Chris still attends training when he's not too busy with his studies, to be hitting partner for other squad members. Chris will resume training with a proper plan once his HSC is over.

Xiao Wang

After 12 months of "no-play" (yr 12 studies), Xiao's comeback plan was to use the AYC in April to get back into competitive mode. To prepare Xiao for the AYC, training was concentrated on regaining Xiao's physical fitness, footwork, and consistency. Xiao's performance at the AYC was better than he was expecting.

Training after the AYC was planned so that Xiao would be at his peak level of performance in June to compete at the Australian Open and Closed.

Xiao had a good tournament playing his best table tennis defeating a few of the more experienced, higher ranked players.

Training was again set out so that Xiao would re-peak for the AJC in 3 months. Unfortunately, Xiao's relocation to Newcastle during this time made it difficult to train effectively. Although Xiao played well at the AJC, he was a little disappointed with his results due to the fact that he didn't have any wins over the higher ranked players.

Due to distance between their homebase and the NTC, Kane and Wade trained under their parent's guidance throughout 2007.

DISABILITY DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2007

This year a number of events took place that we hope will help develop and promote table tennis to the disabled, as follows:

In April 2007, NSW hosted the Australian Athletes with Disabilities Championship in Lismore. This event took on a whole new format, away from the traditional Friday to Sunday events, with the formal opening welcome on the Thursday. The athletes marched in State order as each player was presented to the crowd.

Congratulations to all the NSW athletes for their participation and efforts, namely Joy Boyd , Leslie Noonan, Phillip Hurst, Mark McAulay and Adam Sanders.

Thank you to the volunteers who supported, coached and contributed to the successful event.

ROYAL REHAB CENTRE AT RYDE: Over several months this year, another programme was implemented to see if a coaching programme could be developed to entice disabled wheelchair people to play table tennis. We were successful in getting a monthly coaching clinic set up, were several wheelchair people attended. My thanks go to Young Seong (Coach Level 1) for his assistance in making the program a success. Also Janyne Parsonage, Sports Development Officer, Wheelchair Sports NSW for organisation of the venue.

NARRABEEN TALENT SEARCH: Besides being an all sports event, a talent search for the Paralympic programme, was also conducted at Narrabeen. From our coaching success at the Royal Ryde Centre, twenty (20) wheelchair entries were received to play Table Tennis. A Round Robin competition was held with the assistance of TTNSW who supplied tables and a Coach. Special thanks to Theo Morsink of SUNS Table Tennis Association, who also provided his service by coordinating the activity for the day.

WILLOUGHBY AND LIVERPOOL TALENT SEARCH: Unfortunately there were no entries for Table Tennis. Disappointing, however, we are in contact with the organiser of the Paralympic talent search and hope to be more proactive at promoting Table Tennis to the public.

MENTAL HEALTH CENTRE AT LIVERPOOL: This area for a number of years has been under the dedication of one person namely, Beryl Davies. TTNSW appreciates the hard work and joy, that has been brought to many people who have, under her guidance, experienced the game of table tennis.

COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS: This event for disabled athletes has now been in operation for the past two years and is attracting new players from the country area. TTNSW are continuing with its support and endeavouring to assist the Country League to promote events State-wide.

TTNSW OBJECTIVE: To find sufficient volunteers to support, coach and guide groups of disabled people in engaging in active sport called Table Tennis.

To provide, where possible, assistance to disabled players, to enable their participation in all NSW tournaments and Australian AWD Championships.

CABARITA BEACH TABLE TENNIS CLUB REPORT 2007

This year has been extremely successful in terms of achieving the aims of the club as stated in the club's constitution; that being, to encourage the youth of the area to play Table Tennis and to promote the sport within the local and surrounding areas.

The first and most successful aspect of this has been the club's involvement in the Active After-School Communities Program which is run in conjunction with the Australian Sports Commission. Initially this involved our Club coaching co-ordinator, Cathy Townsend, running a one hour Table Tennis session for primary age children one afternoon per week at Fingal Head School. This soon turned into two afternoons per week. The success of this program eventuated in Cathy being invited, as a guest speaker, to a State Conference to discuss how Table Tennis can be incorporated into the program and the success of the activities at Fingal Head School. We have now been booked into four different schools and after-school establishments in the Tweed area to run Table Tennis programs.

Fingal Head School eventually won the State award for the Best After-School Activity Provider and when being presented with the award the only activity requested to conduct a demonstration was Table Tennis. Those present for this presentation included the Regional Co-ordinator of the After-School Program and the Federal Minister for the Aged, Justine Elliott.

The interest in Table Tennis in the Fingal Head School eventually grew to a level that our club was asked to perform a Table Tennis demonstration for the entire school, which was carried out by two of our juniors, Wade and Kane Townsend.

In addition to this we have continued to have the local high school, Kingscliff High, use our club's facilities as a Wednesday sport activity. However, as the year progressed we changed the session from being one where the students turned up and played by themselves, to one which was more structured and involved coaching and organised activities. Again this was co-ordinated and run by Cathy and proved extremely successful with more students becoming involved and showing a genuine interest in the sport, some of whom began to turn up to our organised junior and handicap sessions.

A new initiative was in having the local Primary School, Bogangar Primary School, attend the club on a weekly basis. One class would attend for two weeks; then to be replaced by a new class until all classes from year 3 to 5 had attended. This not only introduced many students to the sport but again resulted in the club gaining several new junior members who are still attending our junior coaching sessions. Not only were the students acquainted with the sport but so were all the teachers who saw the benefits of the sport for their students.

The Primary school visit also gave the opportunity for several of our newly accredited and aspiring coaches to gain experience with beginner players of this age group. The coaches involved were Bill Sherwood, Noelene Tauris, Shirley Gray, Doug Gray and Cathy Townsend.

The club also conducted, in conjunction with South Tweed Sports and Bowls Club, a level one coaching course. This led to our club gaining four newly accredited Level 1 coaches, and several others who are still working towards their accreditation. The club has also has two coaches, one who is near completion of their Level Two Accreditation and another who is almost completed their Level Three.

A major challenge for the club was our conducting of the Australian Youth Championships at the Far North Club in conjunction with Table Tennis NSW. This was the first time that this event had been outside of Victoria and from all reports was a great success.

Our success in gaining grants from various government organisations continued this year with the club gaining a Volunteers Grant of approximately \$2500 with which we were able to buy two new Stiga Expert tables, training and competition balls and a kit of bats and balls to be used when visiting schools.

In competitions our club had state representatives at Junior, Senior and Veteran levels. In Veterans, Gil Tauris, Doug Gray, Kayoko Gavindasamy represented NSW at the National Veteran Championships, while Stan Bierzynski represented Queensland. Gil went through the Over 75 team event undefeated, having played every match. Although he did not enter the Individual Singles he was successful in winning the Over 75 Men's Doubles with Cecil Shaw from South Tweed Club. All other players played well and will improve from the experience.

Our two top juniors, Wade and Kane Townsend, again concluded the year with numerous successes. In the State U/21 Championships both boys fought out the final with Wade coming out on top. Wade also won the Men's and Mixed doubles. At the State Junior Closed Championships Wade won the U/18 singles while Kane won the U/15 event, while at the State Junior Open Championships Kane won, both the U/15 and U/18 Boys Singles. Both boys were successful in being selected in National teams to represent at events in New Zealand. Wade was a member of the Australian U/18 team which qualified for the World Junior Championships and again he was selected to represent Australia at this event in the USA in December.

Kane was a member of the two-player U/15 Australian boy's team which played in the World Circuit Cadet event in New Zealand. The Australian team finished with a bronze medal in the team event and also in the Individual doubles. This was an outstanding result as the event attracted teams from many countries including Japan, Korea, India, New Zealand plus several more.

In Senior competitions both Wade and Kane achieved many great results, with

Wade being selected in the NSW Senior A team for the Australian Open Championships. During the year he had wins over four players in the National High Performance squad and won the far North Coast Men's Open Singles defeating National representative George Tang in the final. Kane won four Men's Special events and also made the final of the Men's Open Singles at the Gold Coast Open.

Both boys also travelled to Noumea to compete in the New Caledonian International Event and dominated all the junior events. In addition Wade won a Bronze medal in the Men's Open Singles.

We continued to promote social matches against other clubs in the Far North Coast region, which resulted in the club winning the annual three-way challenge match between Cabarita Beach, Coffs Harbour and Port Macquarie.
