Presidents Report

From Dennis O'Brien

On the occasion of my third AGM as President and reflecting on 2011, we have been able to consolidate on the work of several years. We have seen players representing NSW develop to become a major part of the top elite group within Australia.

We have continued to increase the number of Associations affiliated with our organisation and this increases the number of registered players. We have again been active in trying to promote table tennis in the regional areas, while still maintaining a presence in the metropolitan regions. We have worked closely with the Country League to improve this aspect of our operation.

I am pleased to welcome the new Affiliates from Blayney Table Tennis, Eurobodalla Table Tennis Club, Coffs Harbour Over 50s Table Tennis Club, Kogarah RSL Table Tennis Club, E.L.I.T.E. Table tennis Club and Forestville Table Tennis Club.

The new membership level called "Social" has continued to grow, which reflects the value of introducing this new level. Because of the efforts of TTNSW the national organisation TTA is also making allowances for this level of player and it will be phased in across Australia over the next few years.

The table below indicates the changes within the Levels between 2009 and 2011. In 2011, the number of "pensioners" stayed steady. The drop in "Competition" did continue and this could be for a number of reasons, one we are aware of is that one association accidently enrolled a lot of their members as social instead of Club; this will be corrected in 2012.

The highlight of 2011 was again the excellent results of all our representative players in national tournaments. New South Wales continued to be very successful at national competitions, which reflects well on the effort of the players and their coaches. In the recent Australian Olympic Qualification Tournament, NSW was well represented in both the men and women's groups.

The TTNSW office arrangements still proved to be difficult to maintain on a permanent basis. Of course Ted, Jan and Jason have continued to service the office and the requirements of the organisations. However the ideal of having a permanent person in the office still eludes us. As most of the activities are undertaken on a voluntary base and we receive very little in government support it is hard to make the move to a more permanent arrangement. The base costs for having full time office staff would be over \$65000 per year and this is not an option on our current revenues.

In early February 2012 TTA finally agreed to a national database through the IMG organisation. This move should enable us to have better access to membership information, and allow our Association Members better access to their member base information.

An additional benefit is allowing us to move our web site to a more flexible service, again through IMG. Over 2012 members should start seeing major changes to the way we communicate and disperse information on upcoming events.

One important aspect is that we need as many players as possible to have access to emails. This makes getting information out easier and more effective and cost efficient.

As we have received enough nominations to cover the executive and Board, there will be no election this year. However, we will be calling upon members from time to time to add their considerable experience to benefit the organisation.

I would like to Thank Tony Bo for is input this year and welcome back Q Tien as a Director. Tien brings a lot of experience especially in the AWD area and will be looking after this activity for us in the coming year.

Finally, I would again like to thank all Council and Executive members for their advice and goodwill over the past year. I believe that we will continue to develop this sport in the state and this can only be a benefit for our Affiliate members and players.

Kingscliff High Table Tennis

The club's close ties with the local high school, Kingscliff High, continued this year. The school used the club's facilities for school sport in terms 3 & 4 and were assisted in their sessions by both Cathy and Wade Townsend.

The school's representative team took on the best in NSW and finished just one match from being State Champions.

Team coach and Deputy Principal, Mr Ken Allison said before the team left for Sydney, he thought they would be happy to finish in the top five and really happy to be in the top three. He said the school team had received a lot of support from the Cabarita Table Tennis Club.

The team of Year 12 students Dean Kerrison and Kane Townsend, Year 10 student Matthew Keyte and Max Williamson from Year 9, went down four matches to one to James Ruse High in the State Final at the Homebush Olympic Sports Hall in Sydney. Both Kane and Max are members of Cabarita Beach Club and all members of the team trained at the club during the season.

The team went through the early rounds of the Combined High School knock-out competition to become North Coast Champions and make it through to the final 10 schools in the State. The school has a long tradition in Table Tennis; winning the State title in 2006.

The boys' finals campaign got off to a slow start, with the team only just winning the first round in Sydney against South Western Sydney team, Cecil Hill High School. However, they recovered well to win all three of their opening matches and fight their way to the final, with Kane winning all of his games except the doubles in the Grand Final against James Ruse. The other players also lost very few games to steer the team into second in the State.

Another great achievement for the school!

New Coaches Accredited

The year also saw three newly accredited coaches qualify for their Level One National certificate. Congratulations to Kayoko Govindasami, Trent Townsend and Keryn Hunt.

AWD National Squad

Also a fantastic achievement was achieved by club member Jackson Meyn who has shown enormous determination and commitment to be selected in the National AWD High Performance squad.

Australia Day Sporting Achievement Award

Member Kane Townsend's consistent results at a State, National and International level resulted in him being named the Tweed Shire Australia Day Individual Sporting Achiever of the year. He was named as a member of the Australian Shadow Olympic Squad (along with brother, Wade) made up of 15 players from around Australia. He was a member of the Australian Under 18 Team which qualified first in the Oceania Qualifying Round for the World Junior Championship Finals and was undefeated in the singles.

He won the silver medal in both the singles and doubles in the Under 18 World Junior Circuit Event held in Guam in April and won a Silver Medal in Australian Closed Men's Doubles (again with Wade) while making it to the quarter finals in the Australian Closed Men's singles. He won a Gold Medal in the NSW Open Under 18 Boy's Doubles and Singles and a Bronze Medal for the Australia Open Under 21 Men's Doubles (again with Wade) and Singles. He also won the bronze medal in the U/18 Australian Open boys Singles, losing in 6 close games to the eventual winner from Korea in the semi-final. At this event he also won the U/18 boys doubles. A great year!

Club Sessions

The club has continued its Wednesday night individual coaching session. The Monday afternoon junior training session and the Saturday Rotating Doubles continue to be a success, however with some added promotion hopefully some new players will be found to add more variety to these days. Also, the Monday night invitational training squad is set to resume again in 2012.

State & National Performances

The club has continued to impress at a competitive level with many state representatives in Junior, Senior and Veteran categories. Along with Wade and Kane's results the other two highlights would be Jake Duffy's move into the National U/15 team where he represented Australia in Guam and both Jake and Ben Houghton achieving outstanding results at the National Junior Championships finishing number 1 & 2 in the Order of Merit for U/15 and combining to win the U/15 boys doubles.

Congratulations to Cathy Townsend, who was appointed as National Manager of the Australian team which travelled to Guam for the World Junior Circuit and World Junior qualifying events. To add to this Cathy also qualified to become an AWD classifier after attending a five day course in Korea.

Active After School Communities Program

The AASC Program continued to grow in the region with Kayoko Govindasami running programs in several schools.

Sister Club - ITS Mitaka, Japan
