TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT to be presented to members at the Annual Meeting to be held in Room No.3 of the Railways Institute, Devonshire Street, on Friday, 8th March, 1963.

Ladies and Gentlemen.

It gives me great pleasure to present this the Twenty-Seventh Annual Report of the N.S.W. Table Tennis Association, reviewing our many activities for the year 1962.

TWENTY-SEVENTH STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The touring New Zealand team of Murray Dunn and Alan Tomlinson, plus Australian Champion Victor Hirsch and South Australian star Murray Thomson, made this the strongest field ever to compete for a State title.

A record number of 43 events were played with excellent entries in nearly all events.

M. Wilcox successfully defended his title by defeating V. Hirsch while A. O'Brien of Victoria won her first State title by defeating M. Ralph. Outstanding wins were recorded by N.S.W. Juniors, B. Wilson of Goulburn and V. Wheller of Sydney who each won four titles. The visiting New Zealanders, M. Dunn and A. Tomlinson, recorded a win in the Men's Doubles when they defeated our Test combination of M. Wilcox and V. Hirsch.

The championships were originally planned to be held at the Alexandria Table Tennis Centre but, due to the sudden closing of this Centre, events were transferred to the Petersham, Rockdale and Balmain Table Tennis Clubs. I would particularly like to thank all the competitors for their co-operation in helping these championships to success.

Back in Sydney they played Australia in the Second Test at the A.M.P. Building, Sydney Cove, which they won 3-2 and so drew the series. Matches were also played against New South Wales, Sydney and an invitation knock-out tournament at Cronulla. They also competed in the State Championships, Dunn reaching the Quarter-finals and then combining with Tomlinson to win the Doubles.

My own thanks go out to all members of this Council, affiliated Associations and players for the help and co-operation given to me throughout the year.

SUMMARY

Reviewing the activities over the year one finds the game is broadening on a National basis and on a State wide basis, taking in the International Tours and increase in affiliated bodies but at the same time there is a lethargy to do things promptly. The late submission of entries for Championships and Team Competitions makes it difficult to judge and arrange events. The failure to complete fixtures and matches is unsportsmanlike, a trend which is being closely watched. The Competition Rules are not studied closely and uncalled for difficulties arise from this cause.

The failure to pay entry fees promptly cause further work to be thrown on your Treasurer and Committee.

On the other side the promotion of the game through TV has been good, screenings in the past twelve months have shown extracts from Test Matches, State Championships, Australian Championships, coaching and instruction and a special match showing the Australian Team. Exhibitions in stores and clubs and other organisations have helped show the game to a wide audience.

Dress is still very mixed but it is improving, the lower grades still lag behind in this respect.

We now have a New South Wales Umpires' Association headed by Messrs. G. Brandis, D. McDonnell, G. Jones. They did sterling work during the State Championships and the New Zealand Tour. We need more umpires for the Australian Championships in September so contact either the State Secretary or the Umpire Association for information.

Country affairs have been very close this year and I may recommend three meetings per year between Country Representatives and your Executive Officers. Country players achieved good rankings this year but there is a distinct shortage of lady players and it is up to Country Associations to look into this matter urgently.
