#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The leading event for 1985 was most certainly the visit to NSW by the National Teams from China and Korea. The triangular international match staged at the State Sports Centre at Homebush Bay attracted our biggest crowd for over 12 years with nearly 1500 enthusiasts being treated to a feast of Table Tennis in what is a world-class venue for a one table match.

Once again, this year has seen an increase in participation in tournaments, especially in the Grade events. The highlight of the tournament calendar was again the State Open which was the strongest Open Tournament held in Australia, with players from Victoria, South Australia and New Zealand taking part.

A party of Grade players from Auckland, New Zealand, visited this State. We hope this first visit will develop into an annual exchange visit between Sydney and Auckland.

The Association finances continue to be managed well and we are now in a sound, but certainly not affluent, situation. This was in spite of the very late notification of Government Grants in June for the year commencing on the 1st January. This placed a severe strain on our cash flow and meant deferral or cancellation of some events.

Our squads and teams have been training regularly at the State Sports Centre which with 15 tables, was also the venue for the State Closed and Open Tournaments. However, for these type of events, the venue does not provide the standard of facilities required by Table Tennis.

Once again we have attempted to obtain some input to the development of our sport from the players. However, only one or two players attended a players meeting and no nominations were received when we called for a players representative on Council. This is most disappointing because it is the players who are constantly saying what should or should not be done.

During the year we have been fortunate to obtain sponsorship from a number of organisations which ensured we were able to stage a number of events successfully. Our particular thanks go to The Commonwealth Bank, Lend Lease, Marco Polo Tours, Acton Table Tennis, Combined Sports Traders and T.T. & T. Enterprises for their assistance. Of course, the major contribution came from the NSW Government through their Grant aid - without this help, our Association would not be able to function.

#### ANNUAL REPORT

The Fiftieth Annual Report to be presented to Affiliated Associations at the Annual General Meeting to be held at Sports House, 157 Gloucester St., Sydney, on Sunday, 24th November, 1985, commencing 2.00pm.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

During the past twelve months, the NSW Association increased its activity and undertakings in most areas of the sport, some quite substantially. Our financial turnover has reached the staggering figure of \$231,000 and before we proceed any further, just let me emphasise this fact:

#### A FINANCIAL TURNOVER OF ALMOST A & MILLION DOLLARS

To look at the work involved, the writing of receipts, drawing cheques, Banking and the accountancy factors, throws a large workload on the Treasurer and his assistants but that is just part of the story.

The larger the financial turnover results from either running more events and/or a larger participation in general. We only had two additional major events this year compared with 1984, but our results show a 25% increase in our financial turnover.

Therefore, one does not have to think about our scene too much to appreciate the additional office and administration work and the additional demands on members of the Executive.

This was the second year under the 'new' Constitution and again, it must be reported that Association activities in the main were handled in a more business like manner. But we must also look at what is happening around us. Surely we must ask whether we have gone far enough. One must look at the Australian Association's Board of Management and ask — is this for us?

The Constitution gave more opportunities for Country administrators to be involved in the decision making of the State Body, less meetings, more productivity than the old fashioned monthly meetings, with hours spent over minutes, correspondence, etc. This has proved most beneficial. Council meetings held every two months, have been well attended and far more efficient than in the past.

This is a compliment to all members of the Council but special tribute must be paid to the Country Leagues appointed Representatives and other Country Officials, who undertake long journeys, spend most of the day at a Council meeting and all at their own expense. The same naturally applies to the Metropolitan League nominees, who have the advantage of less travel, time and money wise.

I hope all players understand and appreciate the non-paid efforts of all these dedicated Officials.

The players registration scheme continues through the Australian Association although at times and in some areas, problems do exist. In regard to this subject, I quote the President of the Australian Association, Mr.L.H. Wharmby, who recently wrote:

"There is an urgent need for all Associations to seek out unregistered

Associations, Club and players and to do their utmost to persuade them to register. There is the same need to recruit new players.

Nearly all sporting bodies are suffering the same problems and reducing numbers of registered players.

There is not a great deal administrators at the top can do - this is a matter of the grass roots and those who are in touch with the grass roots.

Some Associations are experimenting with playing formats to good effect. We must not fall into the trap of doing the same old thing which was acceptable 20 years ago and therefore should be acceptable now. I am afraid that attitude won't wash with the youth of today. Experiment, try new things, be flexible and try to build the numbers up. It will naturally benefit your Club, your Association and ultimately your Australian Association."

Membership of the NSWTTA carries automatic membership of the Australian Table Tennis Association, the Oceania Federation, the Commonwealth Table Tennis Association and the International Table Tennis Federation, all for a mere \$7 per year.

World-wide benefits were enjoyed this year by Gary Haberl (Newcastle), Andrea Campbell (Wagga Wagga), Mark Palmay (Eastern Suburbs), Shane Woseen (Newcastle), Bret Solo (City of Sydney), Karla Liddle (Manly-Warringah), David Swanton (City of Sydney), the Astolfi brothers (Canberra) and Andrew and Wendy Phipps (Manly-Warringah). It enabled NSW to invite players from Auckland who played in Grade, Veterans, Womens and Open matches. They also played at the Wentworthville Leagues Club, as well as the NSW State Championships. Therefore, we had over a dozen or more members, not all champions, who enjoyed this international benefit by being registered.

#### INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

The ITTF again altered the regulation covering bat rubber colours but for all other than Open Grades, this new regulation does not come into effect until 1988. Then the only colours bat rubber sheets will come in will be red and black which should arrest the problem of different coloured rubbers, etc. (unless further international changes are made).

As mentioned earlier, we had many players taking part in international affairs and we will sponsor teams and players to the 1986 Auckland Open Championships as part of a reciprocal plan with the Auckland TTA. So if any player wishes to go to the Auckland Championships, regardless of standard, there is the opportunity for you.

Gary Haberl (Newcastle) represented Australia at the 1985 Commonwealth and World Championships and our sincere congratulations are hereby extended to Gary on this high honour. Our State Director of Coaching, Jae Hwa Lee, was Captain of the Mens teams at these Championships - congratulations Jae.

Gary also was nominated by the Australian Selectors to take part in the Oceania Zone World Cup Qualifying tournament held at the Eastern Suburbs Leagues Club, the other nomination being Tommy Danielsson from Victoria. Two representatives, Peter Jackson and Malcolm Temperley, from New Zealand completed the field and the event was won by Tommy Danielsson.

#### OLYMPIC GAMES

We still await confirmation from the ITTF of the number of representatives that Oceania will have in the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul but it still appears

that there will be two men and one woman who will receive the magnificent honour of being amongst the first Table Tennis Olympians.

Training squads will be selected shortly, both National and State Squads.

On the National level, funds are available for training and pre-Olympic games matches from Olympic Grants.

#### AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time, three National events were played in the one City over a two week period. The Junior Championships opened the programme in Hobart, followed by the Australian Closed Men and Women Singles and in the last week, the Senior Teams and individual Open titles.

Results were average, the Men for the second year in succession taking second place but this year it was much closer, with a 4-5 loss and Wayne Heginbotham having a match point against Rod Carlyle but losing narrowly in 3. Gary Haberl accounted for Tommy Danielsson, thus maintaining an outstanding effort in team matches for the State. Over the last five seasons, Gary has recorded the amazing figures of 99 wins and 2 losses in junior and senior teams.

Unfortunately, our Senior Womens team finished 5th, the lowest position on record for a State Womens team.

Junior results may not have pleased all but were gratifying when one considers the ages of our interstate players, we lose hardly any player in the next 12 months and it is with great anticipation that we look forward to vastly improved results in 1986.

One point of warning at this stage, we need a large influx of women and junior girl players. We just do not have the numbers of women and girls playing the sport to produce teams of acceptable standards for our State.

The National rankings were bitterly disappointing in general, and in the Senior men in particular. Wayne Heginbotham had a 10/5 team average, won the NSW Closed, lost only to players ranked above him and yet was not ranked, a major blunder by the National Selectors. #### AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### NSW STATE OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1985 State Open witnessed one of the largest and highest standard entry for many, many years. Indeed, one would have to go back to the late 50's, early 60's, to see such a galaxy of overseas and interstate players. Jackson, Temperley (New Zealand), Danielsson, Jachabuk, Carlyle (Victoria), Javor, Ward (SA), joined Haberl, Pinkewich and Heginbotham in the Mens Singles.

Grade, Women and Veterans events had entries from Auckland and a handful of Victorian juniors made the trip to test our best.

These entries raised the standard of play and created intense interest in most all of the 32 events contested.

#### NSW CLOSED CHAMPIONSHIPS

This event was played in February and although so early in the year, resulted in a near record entry. Wayne Heginbotham was a worthy winner of the Mens Singles, the first victory in a very good year for Wayne. This championship was the first of many Table Tennis events played at the State Sports Centre, Homebush.

This venue, rated as a major indoor stadium by World standards, proved an enigma for Table Tennis officials. The international series played in August showed the State Sports Centre as the best venue our sport has ever used but for State Championships, there are problems. It is hoped that these can be eliminated after talks with Centre administrators held recently.

#### CHINA/KOREA/AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVES INTERNATIONAL

On August 20th, the Association staged one of its most successful international promotions at the State Sports Centre. The appearance of World ranked players, Wang Hui Yuan (China, World Gold Medallist 1985, Winner World Masters 1985), Hui Jun (China, World No. 20), Ahe Jae Hyung (Korea, World No. 42) and three Australian Champions, Kim Young Hyun who won the Australian Open in 1982, and NSW's own Paul Pinkewich and Gary Haberl, drew a very large crowd, the largest in Australia for probably 20 years.

Good sponsorship and some magnificent backup work by these sponsors, added value all round and the venue at Homebush was as good as could be obtained anywhere in the world.

Both the Chinese and Korean Consul Generals were present and the NSW State Government was represented by the Minister for Sport, Mr.M. Cleary, MP.

The players made it an almost perfect night, with some really top-class Table Tennis, a programme any Association in any part of the World would have been proud of, with Wang Hui Yuan (China) and Paul Pinkewich producing outstanding displays of our sport, featuring rallies with players retrieving smashes from outside the barriers.

The NSWTTA Executive were most grateful for the messages of congratulations received from far and wide, as into the staging of this fixture went hundreds of hours of hard work from a large number of people.

#### UNDER 14/UNDER 12 BOYS AND GIRLS - MATCHES AGAINST VICTORIA

This interstate series continues to provide a necessary vehicle for the young players in both States to blood them for the progression into interstate junior ranks.

The 1984 series, as usual, was played in Wagga Wagga at the Police Youth Club and our thanks are extended to all parties who make this event so successful, especially the officials of the Wagga Wagga Table Tennis Association and the Police Youth Club.

NSW retained the Riverina Trophy for the second year in succession but it must be noted that Victoria continues to dominate the Under 15 year events. Can we ask what happens in the following 12 months?

#### OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS PLAYED IN NEW SOUTH WALES IN 1985

There were 12 Championships played throughout the State during the year, apart from the NSW Open and Closed Championships mentioned above. They ranged from - Tamworth in the North to Canberra in the South to Parkes in the West.

Special mention must be made of the Parkes Championships, now a regular yearly event which takes place during the BP Parkes Festival of Sport, and the Tamworth Open played in August as part of the CBFC Games.

It is felt that our sport gains much from being associated with such multisports events, bringing it to the notice of media sources, business houses and the general sporting public that otherwise may not notice Table Tennis. To take part in the mini-Games events gets over the message that Table Tennis is part of the sporting world, a fact we all know but some outsiders may just not realise.

#### PUBLICITY

It is with regret that we must again report that we failed to attract the services of an Honorary Publicity Officer. This most important facet was therefore left in the hands of those that could do it when they could, plus time from our part-time staff.

Could we again appeal for assistance in this field. This is probably one of the most rewarding of all amateur sporting posts, you will meet all parts of the media, you will get all the assistance possible, you will come into contact with stars of other sports and there are many other benefits to the person or persons who wish to see the sport of Table Tennis featured more regularly in newspapers, on television and radio.

Without a Publicity Officer of our own, we employed the services of Sports Media Services, who were responsible for the valuable publicity obtained during our State and International tournaments.

#### POSITIONS VACANT

In the preceding paragraph, it was mentioned that the NSWTTA has a position available as Publicity Officer. This is not the only area where assistance is needed to continue to improve all facets of administration, tournament control, etc. Recently it was commented that "you have never asked us to do this". Well, this is notice that we need your support; don't just be one of the critics, they are easy to find. Why not give some constructive support. Contact our Office and we will welcome your enquiry. As with most amateur sports, it is a case of too few hands to carry out the one hundred and one tasks associated with the conducting of a sport.

#### UMPIRES

The New South Wales Umpires continued to work hard during the year, providing Tournament Referees for all Open tournaments and assisting Associations in running Championships. Their umpiring was, as usual, of very high standard, with the highlight being their performance at the International tournament at the State Sports Centre.

We now have 3 International and 3 National Umpires, 12 State Umpires, 8 Probationary State Umpires and 4 Probationary Members. Actualy Working

A special tribute is paid to 12 year old Rebecca Bellamy for passing her State examination, Ian Finlay for obtaining his National badge, Stuart Scott for officially umpiring at the World and Commonwealth Championships and Rhonda Scott an invited Umpire at the Commonwealth Championships.

#### AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

At the ATTA General Personal Meeting held recently in Hobart, Mr.Keith Bowler and Mr. Phil Males were again elected Vice-President and Hon. Treasurer respectively. Our congratulations to both gentlemen.

#### TREASURER'S COMMENT

For the Financial Year ending 30 September 1985 the NSWTTA had a net balance sheet surplus of \$1341.21. This is quite a reasonable result considering our many & varied activities during the year, however before the end of the calender year that surplus will be quickly used up.

A pleasing aspect is the increase of our reserve fund by \$5032.89. This is done by allocation of 5% of all general account income received each calender month to the reserve account. The money is held aside for emergencies and future projects. Unfortunately we may have to dip into this fund next year as the government is cutting back on grants, especially for assistance to national & state championships, therefore we may have to meet the extra expense required to send state teams away, or generate sponsorship from other sources.

The NSW open & closed were both a success financially and in the running of them. We appreciate the assistance of our sponsor, the Commonwealth Bank, and the Eastern Suburbs Leagues Club who hosted the Oceania playoff in conjunction with the open.

Two items not yet finalised for the year are the 1985 Australian championships in Hobart and Veterans championship in Brisbane. These will be completed soon, I hope.

The China/Korea/Australia International Match was by far our most ambitious undertaking for the year. There are one or two items still outstanding from this, but we may just come out in front by a few dollars. Our thanks to the sponsors, Commonwealth Bank and Marco Polo Travel.

With the item Training & Coaching, this currently shows a net credit figure however we still have several amounts outstanding for hiring fees to the State Sports Centre which will take this into defecit. Next year this will be split to show separate Training & Coaching amounts.

Our major expenditure is of course, administration costs. ie; postage, stationery, telephone etc. This is the biggest drain on any Association's funds but one which is very necessary. Because our office staff are part time and only work two days a week, it was necessary on some accasions to bring in other personnel to assist during peak periods. This is shown under general administration.

As you will note I have all the records set up on a computer which makes life a bit easier for me. I hope next year to expand this into other avenue's of the Association's work which will hopefully assist our office staff with their workload.
