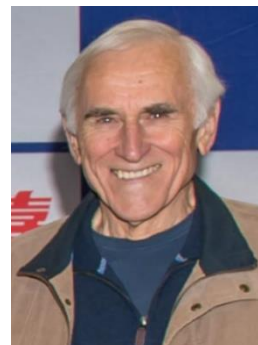

The organisation (TTNSW) has begun the journey of re-establishing itself as an efficient and professional entity.



Over the last 12 months the current Board has made inroads into setting the stage for sustainability and growth.

To those ends we appointed a CEO to take the reins and lay the groundwork for TTNSW's day-to-day operations. My thanks to Leonie Whiteford for taking on the job of steadying the ship in the wake of the tragic death of Ted Davis, and for the staunch support of Ian Finlay our Treasurer and Stephen Gillespie our Tournament Director.

We also appointed a manager to oversee growth in the one area that was sorely lacking; our junior cohort. Subsequently our school's business has grown substantially as a result. The Board wishes to record its appreciation to Ross Abbott for his dedication and vision.

Of course, while planning is underway for the future, the day-to-day business goes on thanks to the efforts of our volunteer Board members, without whom the business would struggle.

While it has been pleasing to see signs of growth, the past year has also given the Board time to reflect on how to do things better. As well, there is a move in Government circles to focus on Gender diversity, particularly as it influences the many NGO's and Not for Profits (NFPs) that fall under its remit. TTNSW is of course an NFP, dependent on Government grants and oversight.

That being the case, the Board is planning to use the coming year as a time of review and recalibration.

We will be examining our structure with close regard to how we appoint Directors, who we appoint as Directors and what we expect from our Directors.

We will also pay close attention to how best we can use our willing player volunteers to manage the growth we believe will be generated over the next 12 months.

Finally, I would like to thank our many playing groups and affiliates, who by their participation make our chosen sport a vibrant and engaging part of our lives, and I look forward to the next 12 months, and to delivering a more efficient and financially stronger Table Tennis NSW.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

2023 began a new era in Sports Management and reporting structures across all pathways and partnerships.

We welcome the opportunity to actively participate and workshop policies and development programs with our strategic partners - NSW Office of Sport and Table Tennis Australia.

All 97 Sports in NSW have benefited from a campaign by another Sport Partner, "Sport NSW", who lobbied heavily with both State Government parties to orchestrate a NSW Office of Sport redesign which was well and truly overdue. The election promise is well under way for the redesign of the NSW Office of Sport - Organisational Support Program. This will bring all sports in NSW into closer alignment with all other States and Territories in Australia. A huge thanks to Stuart Hodge and his team at Sport NSW for a highly successful campaign which is deeply appreciated by Table Tennis NSW, giving us transparency, and providing opportunities to grow our sport.

We have been working closely with Table Tennis Australia across many platforms to achieve mutually beneficial outcomes and reach targets.

We enjoy a new strategic Plan 2023-25 aligned with Table Tennis Australia and have also entered a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which was developed in lieu of hosting National events. Part of the MOU provides additional funding to engage our school's Development Officer in a full-time role. Other benefits include:

Table Tennis Australia:

- Pays the per player fee for registered members to use Ratings Central Australia to upload their members results.
- Provides High Performance training for NSW members who are in National Squads.
- Runs programs for Spinnerroos and Para Multi Sport Come & Try days.
- Administers the TTA Equipment grants to clubs.
- Covers the Annual fee for Revolutionise Sport.
- Manages the Sporting Schools Program.
- Provides Annual Volunteer Awards.
- Manages the National Insurance Program.

We have been actively involved in workshops for the membership model review, actively involved in both the Gender Equity Strategy and the Women & Girls Action Plan and have attended monthly meetings with Table Tennis Australia to workshop ideas between States and TTA Staff (with CEOs or operational members from other States and Territories.)

Chief Executive Officer's Report (Continued)

The new Ways of Working initiative has been highly successful with the use of a facilitator who contacts each State to gather pre-meeting information. Being able to benefit from each other's different skill sets is an extremely important tool as we work towards a more collaborative sport.

NSW achieved good results at all the National Championships. We provided teams for all divisions of Juniors, Open and Youth, for several Teams for Para and for most age groups for Veterans. Detailed results are viewable elsewhere in this Annual Report.

Table Tennis NSW congratulates all players selected to represent Australia at International events both here in Australia and overseas.

Our social media team has been making gradual progress across a number of social media platforms.

The majority of our workforce are all volunteers, so a huge congratulations to all who contribute countless hours of work behind the scenes. Our tournament committee usually spends 12 hours a day over 2 days to deliver our highly successful tournaments. Our tournament numbers have increased significantly in the Junior and Open tournaments while the Veterans are level in the tournament numbers. We can always use additional helpers on tournament days.

We thank our valuable major sponsors who continue to support us: NSW Office of Sport, Table Tennis Australia, Table Tennis World and ACY Securities. These sponsors provide important contributions, so we are able to grow our sport.

I have audited the financial statements presented to me for the year ended 31st December, 2023, which showed an operating loss of \$36,396 and Equity of \$274,120.


The committee of management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW).

TABLE TENNIS AUSTRALIA - 2023 REPORT

Australian table tennis has overcome the challenges of the last 6 years and has emerged stronger than ever: in membership numbers; participation; international performance in both para and AB; and strengthened governance and financial performance.

To survive and thrive as a sport in Australia we must face up to new challenges: increasing competition in our efforts to engage with the younger generation; intense competition for available government grant assistance; the need to be more professional in our pitches for much needed commercial sponsorship; the imperative to significantly raise the profile of our sport; and the imperative to adapt our membership model and program offerings to meet the circumstances and preferences of new generations.

Table Tennis Australia looks forward to tackling these challenges in partnership with State/territory Associations and Clubs.

Some of the highlights from 2023 include:

HIGH PERFORMANCE AND PATHWAYS:

- Our best ever World Youth Championships results from 2022 were almost repeated. The Australian Team returned from Slovenia with 1 Bronze medal and 2 quarter-finals.
- The ITTF-Oceania Championships, which were held in Townsville, were dominated once again by Australia. We won 24 of 28 possible Gold medals and 7 of 8 World Championship qualifications. Aditya Sareen became the youngest winner of the Men's Singles in history at 15 years of age.
- The ITTF-Oceania Para Regional Championships, which were held in Honiara, Solomon Islands, and which was the qualifying event for the 2024 Paralympic Games was also dominated by Australia. The AUS Para Team won 9 x Gold, 6 x Silver and 6 x Bronze medals.
- At the Oceania Olympic Team and Mixed Doubles Qualification Tournament Australia won the maximum athlete quota for Paris 2024, 3 male and 3 female athletes.
- Australian Para athletes competed in 10 x International Para events and won a total of 26 x Gold, 3 x Silver and 9 x Bronze medals across all events.
- Australian athletes competed in a record 33 international events throughout the year, winning a record 125 medals.
- 7 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 100 world rankings (senior), the most ever, including Yangzi Liu (WR27 in Women's) and Nicholas Lum (WR34 in Men's) improving their previous career-best rankings.
- 5 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 10 world rankings (Para), including Qian Yang who once again finished 2023 ranked as number 1 in the world (Class 10 Women's).
- During the year, Aditya Sareen became the first ever Australian to reach number 1 in the world rankings in able-bodied Under 15 Boys Singles.

- National Squad training continued to go from strength to strength, with record training hours continuing to be offered in Melbourne and Sydney.
- Hopes Programs and Talent ID initiatives were held in 6 States/Territories, attracting more than 230 participants and serving as an important vehicle in providing opportunities for all parts of the high-performance pathway.
- The Para Pathways Program continued to support 12 centres in 7 States/Territories, delivering 150 new participants; The National Para Pathway Camp was once again conducted at the National Para Training Centre in Melbourne in August with 14 x talent identified athletes invited to attend.
- 11 x new para-athletes were classified, and 55 x entries were received ahead of the 2023 National Championships. The provisional classification process continued to be successfully rolled out across all States/Territories.
- Player of the Year awards went to: Yangzi Liu (NSW) (Senior - Victor Barna Memorial Trophy), Qian Yang (VIC) (Para - Arthur Wilks Award), Aditya Sareen (VIC) (Junior - Michael Szabados Award), and Julie Coombes (SA) (Veterans - Ken Cole Trophy).

PARTICIPATION AND DEVELOPMENT:

- The TTA Equipment and Facilities Grant Program was successfully rolled out for a sixth consecutive year. 16 clubs/associations from 7 States/Territories received grants, which resulted in more than \$101,000 worth of equipment and facilities being injected into the table tennis community, including Port Sorell Table Tennis Club. Cumulatively across the six years of the program to date, more than \$540,000 worth of equipment and facilities have been distributed to 85 clubs/associations across all 8 States/Territories.
- 17 outstanding contributors to the sport were honoured through the National Volunteer and Coaches Awards Program. Hot Shot Table Tennis Club (WA) was named Club/Association of the Year. Marie Pinkewich (NSW) had the honour of being awarded the Bev and Brian James Trophy as the 2023 National Volunteer of the Year.
- Membership rebounded strongly to exceed pre-COVID-19 numbers with 11,478 members being recorded through 2023.
- Our entry level program, Spinnerroos, continued to be rolled out at both club and school level throughout Australia.
- Our Sporting Schools program continued to be rolled out across Australia, with more than 22,000 students undertaking the program.

NATIONAL EVENTS:

- 2023 saw 8 highly successful national events delivered across 6 States/Territories.
- The National Senior, Youth, Junior and Para Championships were combined into one all-inclusive event once again. The event attracted 500 competitors and 2,056 individual event entries from all States/Territories.

- The National Veterans Championships was played and attracted 419 competitors and 1,837 individual event entries from all States/Territories and New Zealand.
- After a pilot event in 2021, the TTA Tour was expanded to cover 4 events in 2023 (Canberra, Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane). Overall, the event series was a roaring success, attracting 629 competitors and more than 1,304 individual event entries from 7 States/Territories plus New Zealand, Fiji and Pakistan.
- The National Hopes Week & Challenge attracted 74 entries from 7 States/Territories and continues to set the benchmark in terms of sourcing the next generation of players.
- 7 national events were livestreamed with outstanding statistics being generated. 91,000 unique viewers and 118,000 total views watched 318,000 minutes (5,300 hours) of footage in more than 30 countries. Social media posts (Facebook) reached 482,000 people across more than 206 posts. Finally, 560,000 website hits were achieved.

GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE:

- The 2023-2025 TTA Strategic Plan is currently being implemented. TTA is working with all States/Territories to ensure that State/Territory Strategic Plans align with TTA's whilst maintaining a localised focus where beneficial. This will ensure that a unified strategic direction is in place, and we are working together to achieve the strategic objectives nationally.
- The Strategic Plan will be reviewed in early 2024 to ensure that it remains relevant, meeting the needs of the business and broader ecosystem.
- A sixth consecutive surplus was delivered and the TTA Cash Reserves Target was met in 2023.
- Importantly, with the TTA Cash Reserves target being met, it is anticipated that the need to generate surplus results will diminish, meaning more resources can be put into further developing the sport.

RECOGNITION:

Scott Houston completed his term as TTA CEO at the end of May 2023. Scott started as acting CEO in mid-2017, having resigned his board position to take on the role following the resignation of the previous CEO, and was appointed to the position in early 2018. Scott played a key role in TAA's recovery from a \$650,000 "black hole" in 2017, significant inherited governance deficits and the challenges of COVID-19. We express our deep appreciation for Scott's contribution to Australian table tennis and wish him the best in his future endeavours.

John Murphy also left the role of Head Coach AB in the first half of 2023, having filled the role for over 4 and a half years. John played a significant role in Australia's improved AB performance at the international level, including the Tokyo Olympics and Birmingham Commonwealth Games, and particularly in Australia's growing international strength at the junior level.

Four players made their international debut (Able-Bodied) and were recognised as Official Australian Representatives. Congratulations to Aditya Sareen, Connie Psihogios, Danni-Elle Townsend and Lennard Properjohn. The Official Australian Representative tallies now sit at 79 (Able-Bodied Men), 72 (Able-Bodied Women), 74 (Para Men) and 31 (Para Women).

An icon of Australian veterans table tennis was inducted into the TTA Hall of Fame: Buddy Reid (Veterans). Congratulations Buddy, you are indeed a most worthy inductee.

Sincere thanks go to all funding partners and peak bodies, namely the Australian Sports Commission and the AIS, Commonwealth Games Australia, Australian Olympic Committee, Paralympics Australia, ITTF and ITTF-Oceania. TTA enjoys a positive working relationship with all parties and looks forward to this continuing in 2024 and beyond.

Thank you also to all TTA's commercial partners. In particular, our long-term partners Nittaku and DHS, plus Table Tennis World through the backing of Paul Pinkewich, plus all others who supported TTA throughout the year.

Thanks is also extended to the State/Territory Associations for working collaboratively to improve our sport for all. Since I joined TTA in late 2023 it has become obvious to me that the willingness to work together and maximise our resources is strong, and I have no doubt that through continuing to work closely we can make significant contributions to the sport that we all care so much about.

The commitment at the club/association and State/Territory level, by volunteers and staff, to grow participation and deliver local competitions and activities is also recognised. Without the ongoing support and time from this passionate group of people, our sport would not be able to achieve the great results that it does. Your involvement and enthusiasm is greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank the dedicated TTA staff, who in a year of change in leadership have gone above and beyond to ensure that the organisation continued to not only deliver on core business but grow and deliver great outcomes.

Finally, my thanks to the TTA Board, who provide leadership and guidance to the TTA CEO and staff. TTA is in the enviable position of having such strong leadership, ensuring that the sport of table tennis is in good hands.

Thank you once again to everyone for your contribution to our great game throughout 2023. Thank you also for welcoming me into the Table Tennis community, it is a privilege to serve you all.

SCHOOLS REPORT

Schools returned to a more normal and settled environment but were still impacted by staff shortages that restricted the willingness or capability to engage in extra curriculum activity.

SCHOOL KIT

After the initial development of a school kit, the kit has been trialled at a variety of (mainly) primary schools within the Sydney area. A number of kits have been purchased. Each kit is at a profit. This stock has been replenished and ready for schools to continue this initiative in 2024. Our school promotional email is now on our website and will be developed to distribute to various school sport organisers and to school sport associations. The model was also presented at district school sports meetings, and at our school events. Our TOPS program is given to each school that trials a kit to assist each teacher engage students more effectively.

SCHOOL EVENTS

Primary and secondary school events as per previous years were organised again this year.

The primary event had an increase in numbers again this year with 44 tables needed and this is expected to grow again 2024.

Some events were restructured to cater for the increase in participation numbers.

Sydney Secondary Catholic Sports Association:

- 4 district events in term 2 and a finals day in term 3.
- Over 500 students.

Independent Christian Schools:

- 100 students with discussions about a change in structure to increase to 150.

Western Sydney Catholic Schools:

- A planned event for term 4 did not proceed due to lack of numbers. Evaluations showing that this may have been the wrong time of the year.

Broken Bay:

- Looking to run a small event in 2024. Will need to train a teacher to convene or use Xpoint¹.

¹ Xpoint - Software tournament management system that is User Pays with a small percentage to go to the organising group.

Schools Report (Continued)

GPS Schools:

- Began a small term home school event in term 4 and will continue in term 1. Will look to use Xpoint as a means to coordinate.

HYUNDAI

With John Alexander no longer being involved, the Bennelong Cup did not happen this year. A meeting with Hyundai is being planned for 2024 to see if their support can continue into the future.

CLONTARF (INDIGENOUS)

All Clontarf Secondary School Academies are involved in table tennis activities. There are currently 32 in NSW with the possibility of more in the future. A successful event was held this year with teams coming from all regions of NSW, including the mid north coast, south coast and western. An event has been scheduled for 2024 at Sydney Olympic Park.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM 2023

In partnership with Sydney Catholic School Sport, school holiday programs were conducted again in 2023. Due to Sydney Olympic Park not allowing this type of days to be held at their venue, alternate venues were discussed with the managers of the Sydney Catholic School Sports Association. Marist College Eastwood will now be the venue moving forward. Eight tables were purchased by the Catholic Schools to be used for each school holiday period and will also be used by the school to run school and inter-school events. Through a sponsorship agreement with Table Tennis World, a percentage of the sale of each table is put back into revenue. Approximately 40 students attended this holiday program, and this number is expected to grow in 2024. Information about our programs is distributed to each player on the day.

NSW SCHOOL SPORT UNIT

After discussions with the head of Strategic Planning, Table Tennis will be added to the teachers' resource section on their website that caters for teachers looking for new programs to implement.

PARA SCHOOL PROGRAMS

9 Multi-Disability School Sport Days have been delivered in partnership with the NSW Schools Sports Unit. This resulted in 1080 participants. This is an average of 20 students per session and each day has 6 sessions. Information about our programs is distributed to each school on the day.

VETERANS REPORT

The Veterans Committee of Peter Wood, Leonie Whiteford, Ian Finlay, Beverley Clackson, Tony Aduckiewicz, Cyrus Pestonji, Carol Cope and Jennifer Aduckiewicz is a hard-working group of players who work well together to ensure the best outcomes for our Veterans community. They have seen us through the difficult times of COVID and led us into a new Veterans Challenge structure in 2023. We are sorry to see Peter give up his role for 2024 but welcome the return of David Clackson as our President.

The move to 5 Divisions of Veterans Challenge with teams based on Ratings Central points has been highly successful. It produced a much closer competition and excellent team spirit. Winners and Runners-up of each Division were very closely fought, and many were not determined until the very last match. Congratulations to all. Of course, very special thanks go to Ian Finlay for running the competition so efficiently and to Beverley Clackson for her timely updating of all Ratings Central points. I am sure you can appreciate the extraordinary task these two people take on each month. Thanks also to the Division Coordinators of Cyrus Pestonji (Division 1), Beverley Clackson (Divisions 2, 3 and 4) and Jennifer Aduckiewicz (Division 5) for ensuring all teams had sufficient players. Clearly it has been well received by the players because we have seen a significant increase in expressions of interest to play in the competition in 2024; such that all teams are full with up to 8 players. We may need to look at increasing the number of divisions further in 2025.

The 2023 National Veterans Championships were played in Canberra. Once again NSW enjoyed outstanding success. Thanks to all those players who made themselves available to represent the State. We had 17 new players in the NSW Team this year all of whom had fulfilled the NSW Selection criteria as published on the TTNSW website. The outstanding NSW results at the National Veterans Championships are published in full on the TTNSW website but it is worth repeating that NSW won 5 Team gold medals, 2 silver and 5 bronze medals along with 18 Individual gold medals across singles, doubles, and mixed doubles. Special congratulations to those NSW players who won Pinky Best Player Awards: Bill Robson, Inh Van Le, Kate Webber, Joy Boyd, and Bernie Kuiper. What an exceptional result.

Unfortunately, several NSW players passed away last year. In particular, both Ken Cole and Leslie Noonan will be greatly missed. Ken had a lifelong involvement in Table Tennis in Juniors, Seniors, and Veterans. He was one of the original founding members involved in setting up Veterans in Australia and served as President of TTNSW and the President of Australian Veterans Table Tennis. The significance of Ken's contribution to Veterans table tennis was recognised by TTA at the Teams medals ceremony. Leslie Noonan never let her hearing impairment interfere with her commitment to our sport. May they rest in peace.

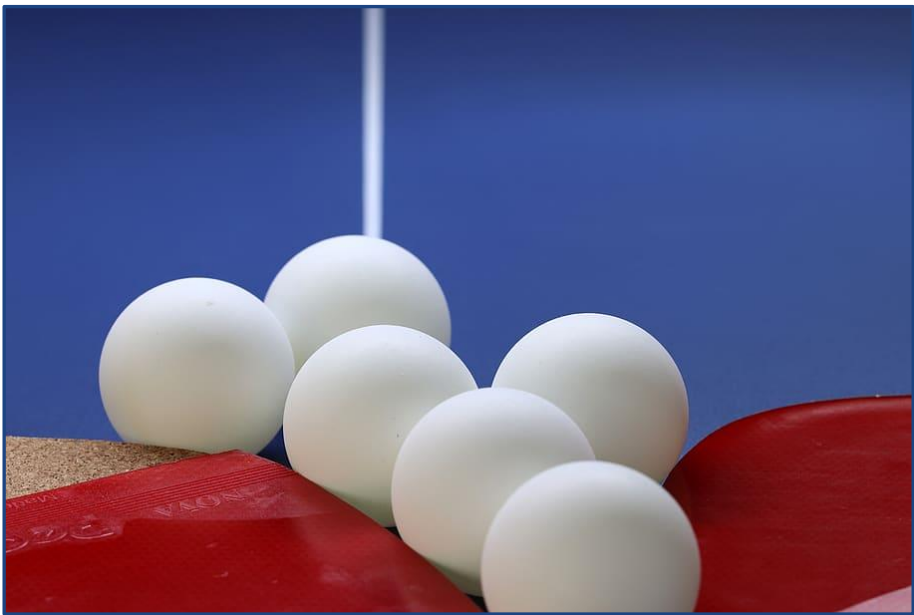
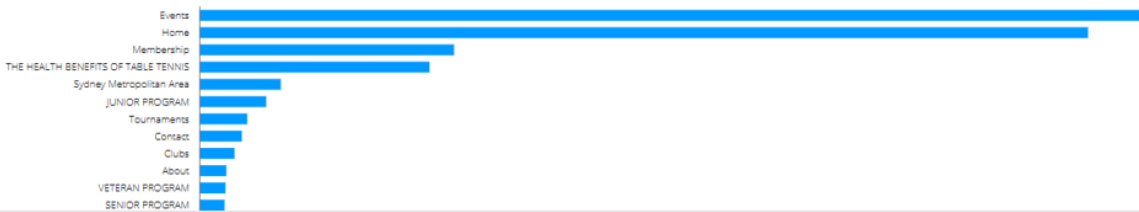

2023 Report

In 2023, we have grown our social media channels to 1000 subscribers on YouTube and close to 1500 followers on Instagram. We have consistently 50,000 impressions per month on Instagram. We aim to achieve 2000 subscribers by the end of 2024 on YouTube and 2000 followers on Instagram. Our YouTube Platform has increased subscribers by achieving gradual growth and an aggregate 165,850 views. In 2024, we aim to re-purpose and publish content from 2022, 2023 and 2024 to significantly grow our audiences and viewership. 2024 looks like a promising year for us.

In 2023, we covered photography and videography at the NSW Closed Championships, NSW Junior Closed Championships, National Championships and ACY NSW Open Championships. We hope to continue to support the growth of the grassroots community in 2024 through our social media promotions.

In 2023, we would like to thank WEDO Media for the exhibition booth as an Event Partner / Leading Authority at the 2023 Sydney Family Expo. Our booth at the event allowed Table Tennis NSW to engage with Asian and Australian communities and businesses. Our Sponsor, ACY Securities, was also an exhibitor at the event. Other renowned brands present included Alibaba's Taobao, Tencent's Fintech MooMoo Trading App, HelloFresh, Medibank, and Yakult. Chinese Australian Media platforms such as Sydney Impressions and Sydney Today were also present.

In 2024, we plan to create a campaign around Women's and Girls Programs. We aim to support the policy to increase female participation and integrate the Olympics as a trending topic. We are fortunate to have Ambassadors such as Michelle Bromley and Tracy Feng as Olympians and Commonwealth Games representatives. We hope to involve them in this campaign.

In 2023, I participated in the Australian American Technology, Creative, Advertising and Media Conference and Expo SXSW - South by South-West Sydney. SXSW has signed a 5-to-10-year contract with the Australian Government. There were numerous corporate sponsors of the Expo including WPP Advertising, QMS Advertising, CSIRO, Commonwealth Bank, Suntory, Channel 7, Porsche, and Qantas. With over 1000 cross-industry conferences the entire week, I gained insight about advertising, sports media, startups, technology, arts and media, events, event production.

Startmate also conducted their first DEMO Day for Australian startups looking to innovate in the Australian and global technology landscape. I attended one of the thousands of conferences held that week about the 2023 Women's World Cup, as a fantastic example of women's empowerment and changing branding perceptions through advertising in Australia. In 2022 and 2023, we were so fortunate to have the Table Tennis Australia Corporate Cup in Sydney that included Australian powerhouse startups including Canva and Atlassian and big tech companies such as Google.

In 2024, SBS Australia started creating collaborative content with us on social media for the 2024 World Table Tennis Championships and promoted Michelle Bromley through interviews.

As the workload increases and our audience increases, we seek to find more editors, photographers and videographers that can help during events and post-events for production, editing and content curation.

In 2024, our YouTube Channel goal is to become a monetised YouTube Google Partner but more importantly output more value to our community, participants and athletes through engaging our audiences through a conversation.

In 2023 and 2024, we have attended the Universities Orientation Weeks for UNSW, USYD, University of Technology Sydney, Macquarie University and worked with the student table tennis clubs. A few athletes volunteered with filming, interviews and speaking to university students to gain subscribers and volunteers. In 2024, there has been a significant increase in corporate stalls at O-Weeks, including Samsung, RedBull, Optus, Vodafone, HungryPanda, Doordash, Fantuan Delivery, Optiver, Suntory.

We are currently working on creating content to engage university audiences and potentially looking at event creation in 2024. We hope to engage more local and international students from all around the world to participate in Table Tennis. We see a potential market for increasing participation for the ages 19-30 with Table Tennis NSW. As table tennis is growing significantly in New South Wales, we aim to allow our social media platforms to cater to and engage the audiences effectively.

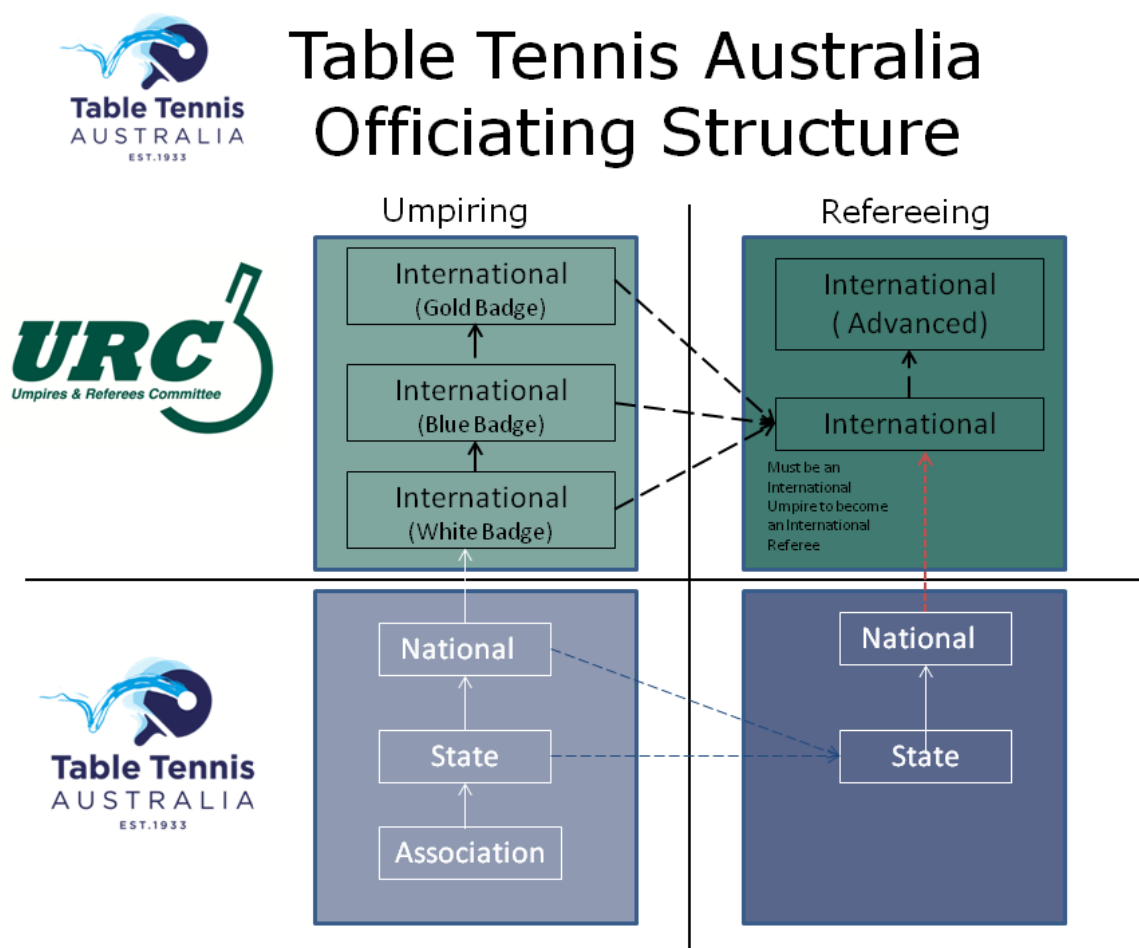

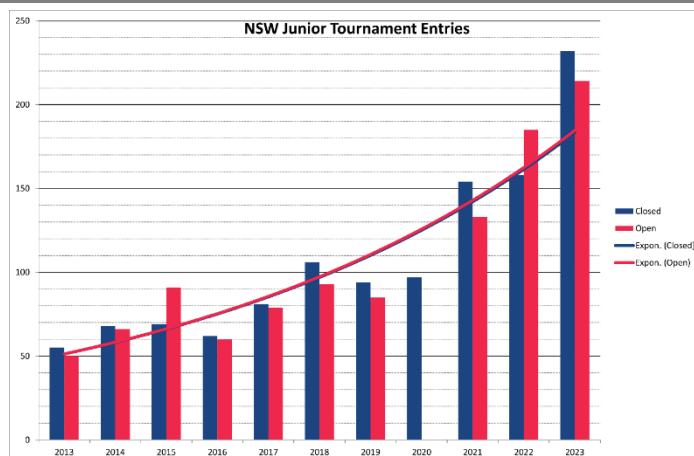
Over the page are 3 graphs showing the number of participants in TTNSW Tournaments over the last 10 years.

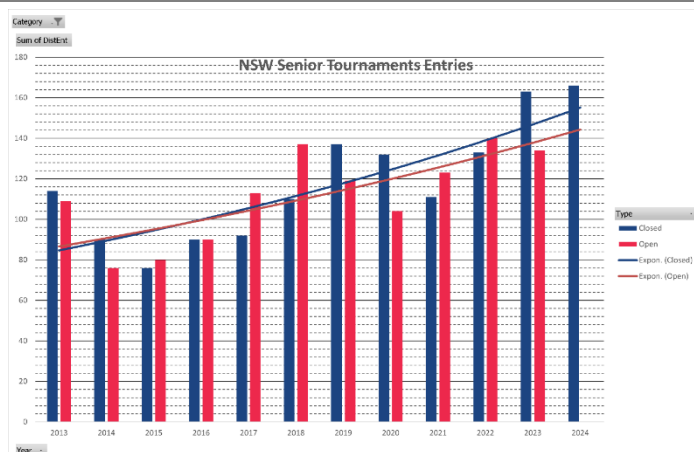

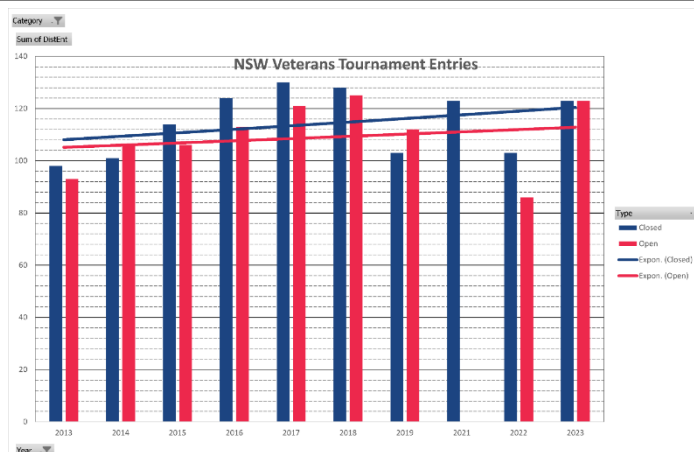
NSW Junior Tournament Entries - 2013 to 2023

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAM MANAGER'S REPORT

What a successful National Championships - Open, Youth, Junior and Para.

NSW fielded: 15 Women's/Girls Teams, 14 Men's/Boys Teams and 5 Para Teams; a total of 34 teams - plus athletes selected in President's Teams.

The standard of athletes across all age groups from Open to U11s and Para was of a very high standard across all states - which is highlighted by the player statistics after the team matches.

100% - there were 23 players - 10 x NSW; 10 x VIC; 2 x SA and 1 x QLD

90% - there were 10 players - 3 x NSW; 3 x QLD; 2 x SA and 2 x VIC

The U11 girls team competition was so close there were no players with 100% or 90% - but 4 x girls achieved 80%; 2 x VIC; 1 x NSW and 1 x WA.

These figures indicate an even spread across all states. What an outstanding achievement by all these players. Congratulations to all those players and their coaching staff.

The Teams medals achieved by NSW: 5 x GOLD, 8 x Silver and 4 x Bronze; a total of 17 Teams medals. Along with these there were 11 x 4th places.

Singles events - again showed extremely closely fought events: NSW players won 20 singles medal matches: 5 x GOLD, 9 x SILVER and 6 x BRONZE.

NSW took the GOLD medal in the following Singles events:

- Men's Open Singles - Xuqui Lin
- Women's Open Singles - Yangzi Liu
- U13 Girls Singles - Daisy Xie
- U23 Standing 6-10 Para Singles - Ian Kim
- Class 2-3 Wheelchair Singles - Jessy Chen

Doubles events - NSW players won 33 doubles medal matches: 5 x GOLD, 12 x SILVER and 16 x BRONZE.

Combining the Teams and Individuals medals, NSW took away a staggering 70 medals.

Star NSW representative, Yangzi Liu, was the recipient of the following two awards:

- Women's Best Player Award
- Victor Barna Award - Australian Senior Player of the Year

The Michael Szabados Award for the Australian Junior Player of the Year was awarded to Victorian player, Aditya Sareen.

Both Yangzi and Aditya have had exceptional results overseas, putting Table Tennis in Australia on the map in the world of Table Tennis - both achieving amazing results. Congratulations to both players. Anyone who was privileged enough to see these players in action witnessed some incredible table tennis.

No Championships are successful without the dedicated Volunteers - parents, players, officials and TTA Staff. A huge thank you to those people.

The week commenced on Friday 30th June with BUMP-IN and the unpacking and assembly of the DHS/Nittaku equipment from the container. A big thank you to the WA and QLD Team Managers along with Clarence's father for assembling the 15 x DHS tables from the container.

Many parents and volunteers assisted NSW to install the reinforcing plates on all of NSW's 135 x black STIGA barriers - the plates were provided by Douglas Flood. These volunteers then unpacked and assembled the 330 x Nittaku barriers - an enormous task. Most of the large tasks were completed by lunchtime (many hands make light work). All these volunteers are behind the scenes and are invaluable in making a successful championship - these efforts do not go unnoticed and congratulations to all involved. Of course, to Brian and Bev James and the tournament committee - congratulations.

The BUMP-OUT, again, a big thank you to the WA and QLD Team Managers for assisting and to Table Tennis Victoria players who were also assisting.

To Connie and Simon, a huge thank you for organising the NSW team dinner at Waterview - another successful event which would not have been possible without dedicated volunteers, and to Anita and Kate for manning the entrance desk.

To Michael Li who volunteered as First Aid officer - (required to be at the first aid desk for most of the Championships), and for arranging VIPs to attend both the Team Dinner and medals ceremonies.

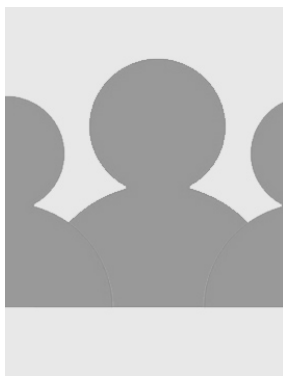

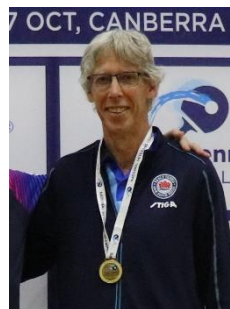

MEMBER ASSOCIATION REPORTS

KIAMA TABLE TENNIS CLUB

Statistically:

- We had 30 new players register with our club throughout the year which brought our total of Registered members to 82 plus 4 who register at Wollongong, bringing our total active club members to 86. (We actually finished the year with 95 players on our books with whom we hope to commence the 2024 year with.)
- We play twice a week for three hours each day (12:00 noon to 3:00 pm). Our average weekly attendance went from 35 in Jan to 45 at the years end for each day.
- Our highest point was in the fourth quarter when we had 958 people having attended over that quarter with the average attendance in December being 45.

- This year we extended our days of play to include Monday Nights (6:30 to 8:30 pm) to accommodate for people who work and for school kids and families.
- Our trial run resulted in an average attendance over 6 weeks of 22 people. We will continue to offer this to our community throughout 2024.

Events:

- We had 4 internal competitions; Summer, Easter, Winter, each attended by 40 people, and our Christmas one was attended by 52!!
- We had 2 inter-Club competitions with Goulburn (March in Goulburn and September in Kiama).
- Two of our elderly members attended the National Veterans Championships in Canberra in October and came away with two Silver and three bronze medals!!
- Socially, we held a Christmas in July function where around 60 people attended and a Christmas party in December attended by 72 people.

We are excited at the prospects of the New Year with everyone being keen to help, play and socialise with each other and welcome new people into the club.

Our biggest concern is "STORAGE!!"

No doubt we will need another table soon and storing it in the Leisure Centre will be a problem. (Good problem to have ... but still a problem.)
