We, the Committee of the New South Wales Table Tennis, have pleasure in placing before you the Association's third Annual Report and Financial Statement.

This report is a recollection of the measure of success with which our efforts were rewarded during the 1932 season insofar as the main object of the association is concerned - "The promotion and control of the game of Table Tennis" - The success achieved is not due to individual effort but to the combined efforts of the committee and co-operation of members of the association.

We thank all who assisted in the promotion and control of the season's competitions and social activities and ask members and prospective members to look forward to the coming season with high hopes for enjoyable nights.

#### TEAMS' COMPETITION.

Twenty-eight teams in all participated in the Teams' competitions, an increase of six on the previous year. Of this number, owing to the high standard of play now prevalent, only seven teams entered the "A" grade competition. This competition was keenly contested and the winners were in doubt until the last round. Y.M.C.A. No. 1 and Y.M.C.A. No. 2 had lost only one match each and the final match was watched with interest. The latter team won the match 9 to 7 and the competition by 26 points to the formers 24. Hordernians were third.

The "B" grade which was divided into three divisions of seven provided many bright displays. The standard of play was generally very good. After the first round the competition was frequently said to be "a one horse race", for the Postal Institute had won all their matches so decisively. Other teams, however, did not let up because of the outstanding performances of this one team and were always confident that the tables would be turned. Postal however continued in their winning way and won the competition after beating Transport No. 1 in the final. Messrs. Bostock and Emmett are to be congratulated on their remarkable performances of winning all games played in the competition.

#### CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Unprecedented interest was taken in last year's Annual Championships. Not only was the number of entries received a pleasing feature of these events, but also the keen play and encouraging interest taken by spectators on each of the three night's play.

The main event, the Open Singles, attracted the interest of 33 of the State's best players, most of whom retained brilliant form throughout the competition. Fifty-two entries were received for the "B" grade singles, twenty-two for the Open Doubles and eleven for the Ladies' Singles.

VICTORIA v. N.S.W.  
Successful Interstate Match.

At the Y.M.C.A. Assembly Hall on June 24th last three hundred of Sydney's table tennis enthusiasts witnessed the first Interstate match between this state and Victoria. We are proud to know that although the number of exponents of the sport in this state is comparatively small to the number in Queensland and Victoria, the attendance at this match was greater than has been seen at any Interstate game in Australia. Thanks is due to Sydney's Daily newspapers for the publicity given and to the Cinesound Review Co. and Fox Movietone News for filming and recording "talkies" of this match.

The match resulted in favour of the visitors by 9 games 319 points to 7 games 320 points. Gibson and Colyer of the visitors and Green of the local team played brilliantly. The N.S.W. team was: C. Silk (captain), M. Green, V. Veinberg and J. Hyde.

It is hoped that similar matches will be staged annually.

ANNUAL DANCE.

At the Association's Annual Dance held on Oct. 19th, at the Torii Cafe, the presentation of cups to the season's prize-winners was made by our President Mr. H. Vizzard. The attendance was very disappointing and resulted in the loss of a sum in the vicinity of £5. Members are requested to remember in future that their support is urgently needed in the association's social activities. It is necessary that a social function of some kind be held for the presentation of prizes.

ENSUING YEAR.

This year it is expected that the Teams' competition will be conducted in three grades, "A", "B" and "C". Continued support is necessary before the committee is able to provide competitions to suit the requirements of every player and it is hoped that members will endeavour to encourage the sport to the best of their ability.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The Victoria Table Tennis Association has invited teams from Queensland, N.S.W. and South Australia to Melbourne this year to participate in the Australian Championships and to form an Australian Council. It is hoped that this state will see its way clear to have a team represented.
