In 1977 the N. S. W. T. T. A. undertook to stage the Wills' Masters' Invitation Tournament. This was a first in as much that it was completely televised and shown all over Australia at a later date in a 16 week series. The response to this Tournament by spectators and the television viewers was very heartening and the sponsors have agreed to stage this again in 1978.

To the sponsors W. D. & H. O. Wills, we are deeply indebted, without their help financially and administratively, it would have been impossible. Also to the Australian Broadcasting Commission sporting team headed by John O'Reilly and Ron May for their first rate technical knowledge and professional approach in the way that the series was presented for television to the public.

Finally, to the man who made all of this possible - Noel Shorter our Secretary. He had the foresight to make a dream become possible, but not before he wished that maybe it was just a dream.

Due to that unfortunate air-strike, a number of top players from overseas became stranded and worse still, some of them couldn't come at all, due to the week delay because of other tournament commitments. To his credit, Noel used all of his professional know-how and gave us the greatest tournament yet seen in N. S. W. and possibly in Australia.

Once again the N. S. W. T. T. A. has to thank the Department of Sport & Recreation for the Government grants which are given to our sport. Their financial assistance and advice has been quite invaluable in the areas of coaching, major tournaments and the cost of sending State Teams interstate for Championships.

At times coaching appears to be a very formidable task and a forgotten one. There are many such people who have given up many hours to pass on their knowledge. To Bob Hawkins and Joy Brown, who have worked very hard within the Police Boys' Clubs and have arranged camps where players can receive the knowledge from these people and then become coaches, after sitting for Coaching Certificates, we are deeply indebted. I sincerely hope that in future years that this aspect of the game, which is most important, will receive more financial help and that more players will come forward to give their time and advice for the help of newer players in our game.

Our State Teams performed indifferently at the Australian Championships held in Perth. Undoubtedly our Women's team put up an outstanding performance to just lose to Victoria in the final, with victory just a point or two away in a couple of matches. Barbara Kearney, although beaten early in the Women's Singles, received the No. 1 ranking in Australia, with an undefeated record in the team events. Mary Cannon our top junior performed with maturity more expected from a top senior with a great effort to reach the quarter finals of the singles and finish with No. 6 seeding in the Women's and No. 1 in the Juniors. Lyn McKeough and Julie Bush both did their part for the team with some fine efforts during the week.

Paul Pinkewich again lost in the men's singles final. This title has eluded Paul, but he lost no admirers of his ability with a dogged and determined effort before losing 21-13, 18-21, 11-21, 16-21 to Robbie Javor of Victoria.

In closing, I would like to thank all Council Members for their support throughout the year and to wish all players the very best for the 1978 Season.

The Forty-Second Annual Report to be presented to members at the A.G. M. to be held at the Table Tennis Centre on Sunday 12th March, 1978 at 2.00 p.m.

Ladies & Gentlemen,

This 42nd Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year 1977. The year was highlighted by the successful staging of the first Wills' International Championship at the Summer Hills Centre. This event brought together leading Australian players, together with International stars from Japan, England and New Zealand. All matches were recast and shown on national television over 16 weeks, thus gaining tremendous publicity for Table Tennis. In one of the best matches ever seen in Australia, Denis Neale (England) defeated Toshiaki Furukawa (Japan) in the final.

N. S. W. players Paul Pinkewich and Bob Tuckett represented Australia at the World and Commonwealth Championships. Paul became the first Australian to play 100 International Matches and was presented with a memento by the A. T. T. A. in recognition of his services.

### N. S. W. Open Championships

Once again this year, Championships were played at Summer Hill with a large entry, including interstate players Neil Ward and Laurie Skeate.

Paul Pinkewich won the Mens Singles for the 5th time, defeating Bob Tuckett in the final. The losing semi finalists were Warren Vickery and Keith Jorgenson.

Barbara Kearney won her 2nd State Singles title, once again beating Joy Brown in the final.

The pairing of Paul Pinkewich/Bob Tuckett and Lynn McKeough/Julie Bush won the Open Doubles.

The junior boys singles was won by Neil Ward (SA0, beating Warren Vickery in the final.

Vera Sikora defeated Mary Cannon in the junior girls.

There was a large entry in the grade events this year with a very high standard of play.

### Overseas and Interstate Tournaments

Several N. S. W. players participated in tournaments outside the State during 1977. Paul Pinkewich won the New Zealand Open and was runner-up in the Queensland Open, whilst Warren Vickery won both the New Zealand and Queensland Junior Boys titles. Glen Brown won the New Zealand Under 16 Boys Title.

### Michael Szabados Award, 1977.

The award for the person considered to have done the most for table tennis in the State during the year has been shared by Messrs. Bob Hawkins and Paul Pinkewich.

Bob has made a tremendous contribution to the game with his work in the Police Boys' Clubs and always assists with conducting and umpiring at tournaments.

Paul played his 100th International Match for Australia during the year and won the N. S. W. Mens' Singles for the fifth time.

### Publicity

There was an increase in publicity for table tennis during the year, as a result of the Wills International Tournament. Other television coverage and more newspaper space was obtained.

Our Publicity Officer, Mr. Terry Halling worked very hard during the year and we are grateful for his assistance.

### Coaching

Coaching in N. S. W. during 1977 was more organised than in previous years. Coaching camps were run in Wagga, Canberra, Narrabri, Camp MacKay (Police Boys) and Newcastle. A coaching seminar was conducted in October at Camp MacKay. Coaching of coaches courses were run in Sutherland Shire and Wagga. The biggest problem at present is, that coaches who have coaching degrees are not doing much towards the Scheme, but we hope to renew their interest in participating in coaching ventures this year. Our thanks to Coaching Co-Ordinator, Mrs. Joy Brown, for her assistance with the coaching scheme.

### Promotion

The second Combined High Schools' Competition was conducted under the guidance of Mr. David Jones, Sportsmaster at Cambridge Park High School.

Paul Pinkewich, Warren Vickery and Philip Gebauer played exhibition matches at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, whilst several players gave demonstrations at the R. A. S. Spring Fair.

Exhibition matches were also held in Clubs and Shopping Centres throughout the State.

### Social Activities

The social highlight of the year was the Reception for the Wills International Tournament. Many members of the press, radio and television were present, as well as executives from W. D. & H. O. Wills.

### Thanks

The thanks of this Association is extended to all the people, firms and organisations who have assisted in so many ways throughout the year.

In particular, I would like to thank the Aquatic Club, Summer Hill Table Tennis Centre and Western Suburbs Leagues Club for providing rooms for Meetings.

As this will be my final report as Association Secretary, I wish to express my thanks to the players and members of Council for their assistance over the last two years.
