The 1978 Wills International Table Tennis Tournament was held in the Recording Hall of the Sydney Opera House early in May and my special thanks go to our sponsor, W.D. & H.O. Wills, for providing us with the necessary funds to stage the first sporting event held in this world-famous building.

Once again, the Australian Broadcasting Commission recorded the tournament for showing on national television and my appreciation is extended to them for providing our sport with the opportunity to be seen by so many people.

To the members of the Wills Tournament Committee, Keith Bowler, Eric Coster, Maureen King, George Saharov, Noel Shorter and Bob Wilson of W.D. & H.O. Wills, congratulations on a job well done.

The visit by players from the Mie Table Tennis Association of Japan was an overnight affair, as these players were en route to New Zealand for that country's Nationals. Special thanks are extended to the St. George Police Citizens Boys Club for their hospitality.

New South Wales had the honour to host the first Samboy National Under 15 Championships and my sincere appreciation is extended to the sponsor, A.P.D. Snack Foods Pty. Ltd., also Peter J. Allen & Associates, Blacktown Police Citizens Boys Club, Bob Hawkins and to the many friends of table tennis for their support and assistance. The promotional advantages gained from this tournament should be sufficient reason for our Association to fully support the 1979 Championships. Gary Haberl from Newcastle, the eventual Boys winner, no doubt will agree with me on this point.

The visit by the New Zealand National Junior Team to Sydney following their participation in the Australian Nationals, provided much needed match competition for our Juniors and I trust this will be the first of many such visits. Our visitors are to be congratulated on their conduct and co-operation and were a credit to the nation they represented.

The Australian Table Tennis Association for their foresight and Dr. John Jackson of South Australia for his personal effort, are to be congratulated in obtaining for Australia the services of a Delegation of Coaches from the Peoples Republic of China as part of the 1978 Cultural Exchange Programme. The Delegation included four of the top coaches from our sport's leading nation and I am sure that the experience gained by our coaches will be of immense value to the participants of our sport.

The 1978 Caltex New South Wales Open was highlighted by Vera Sikora's third successive Junior Girls' Singles Title win and the wonderful support given by Caltex Oil (Australia) Pty. Ltd. My appreciation is extended to the CX-3 people for their support of our Major Championship.

Paul Pinkewich is to be sincerely congratulated on winning the title that has previously eluded him, the Men's National Singles Championship of Australia. Topping off this great effort, Paul then went on to win the first Oceania Men's Singles title and his own personal effort was a contributing factor in Australia gaining 4th place in the Men's team event at the recent Asian Championships.

It is not possible to thank everyone who has assisted table tennis over the past twelve months, however, I would be remiss if I did not single out for special mention our Secretary, Mrs. Maureen King, for her splendend effort, our Treasurer, Mr. Fred Richardson, for his excellent book-keeping, our conscientious Publicity Officer, Mr. Terry Halling, for his effort in this very tough field

and last, but by no means least, Mrs. Joy Brown, for her support and co-operation and complete involvement throughout the year.

In spite of the success of the above events, 1978 was a very turbulent year and as this Association enters its 44th year, I can only hope that the petty jealousies, vindictiveness, apathy, self-interest and parochial attitudes I have become aware of, will cease and there will be a coming together of individuals, organisations and affiliated associations for the general good of the sport in this State. Otherwise, I fear for the future of the game that we all profess to love.

This event brought together leading Australian players, together with International stars from Japan, England and Sweden. All matches were recast and shown on national television over 12 weeks, thus gaining further outstanding publicity for Table Tennis. The final was a tremendous event between Kjell Johansson and Stellan Bengtsson with Bengtsson being the eventual winner.
