PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The year 1971 will be well remembered by the table tennis fraternity of New South Wales if only for the fact that we had a successful visit by an English team and that Mr. Park Sung In, world renowned coach from South Korea, made such a big impact on us with his training techniques and his engaging personality.

Apart from these two highlights we had what could be termed a successful year. The magnitude of our programme, which sorely taxed the resources of our small committee, left its mark, and there were many who relished the thought of a well earned rest over the festive season. Our Senior and Junior teams travelled to Perth and our sub-junior players to Adelaide. Although our finances were strained to the limit, some well organised fund raising activities kept us buoyant and we should feel satisfied with our "end of year funds position" in consideration of the enormous expenditure undertaken.

Our first meeting for some time of the Country Associations was held in Sydney during November and this enabled us to produce a format for our proposed five year plan for the improvement of table tennis in New South Wales. A similar meeting will be held early this year for all Metropolitan Associations with the same objective in mind.

When one considers the activities which took place during 1971 we could almost draw the conclusion that 1972 will be somewhat of a breeze. Our expenses should be kept to a minimum as our senior and junior teams will travel to Melbourne and the sub-junior events will be held in Sydney. This however, gives the opportunity of making 1972 a domestic year with the first priority being that of putting our house in order. The incoming Committee must be conscious of this and the following endeavours, some of which have already been undertaken, must come to fruition.

- 1. We must continue to foster and develop a closer liaison with our Country and Metropolitan Associations.
- We must ensure that the registration of all organisations playing table tennis in New South Wales becomes effective.
- 3. We must ensure that there will be a substantial increase in the numbers of people registered and playing table tennis in New South Wales. This of course will depend largely on the outcome of our current negotiations with unregistered organisations.
- 4. We must ensure that there is a reformation of our Umpires' Association.
 - We must ensure that we establish a realistic building programme, the funds for which are based on a regular source of income.

To supplement the above we are hopeful that Mr. Park Sung In and his wife, formerly Choi Jung Sook will be returning to New South Wales early this year. They have been offered a contract which has been accepted by them in principle, and we are now awaiting confirmation from Immigration of permanent residency approval.

There were many people who have assisted the promotion of table tennis in New South Wales during 1971, too countless to name, and to whom I am extremely indebted. May I say that without their help the task of running table tennis in New South Wales, at times quite frustrating, would have been impossible. There were also others whose main theme seemed to be the provocation of officialdom and a reluctance to forget the good old days of talking too much and doing too little. For New South Wales to once more be a major force in table tennis we will need the co-operation of all Associations, their players and officials. If the present establishment is not sufficiently geared to meet these requirements then we should seriously start thinking of forgetting them and starting afresh — after all we have little to lose and a lot to gain.

In closing may I take this opportunity of wishing those people who will control table tennis in New South Wales during 1972, as yet unnamed, every success in their many endeavours.

NEW SOUTH WALES TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION ANNUAL REPORT

The thirty-sixth Annual Report to be presented to members at the Annual General Meeting, to be held at the Third Floor Training Room, A.M.P. Society Building, Sydney Cove, on Wednesday 2nd February, 1972.

Ladies and Gentlemen -

This, the thirty-sixth Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year 1971.

The Association has had a good year but it has not been without its problems. We have been fortunate in having a more active Committee and we hope that this trend will continue during 1972.

Finance

As can be seen from this Report our activities have been numerous with the result that our finances have been stretched to their limits. Despite this, we are pleased that we have concluded the year with a sound financial basis for our many proposals during 1972.

It will be necessary during the ensuing year for the Association to plan very carefully and completely for all of its activities in order that the financial position be strengthened.

World Championships and Commonwealth Championships

Paul Pinkewich and Noel Shorter, as Non Playing Captain of the Mens team, were selected from New South Wales to represent Australia overseas.

Their tour commenced with the inaugural Commonwealth Championships in Singapore followed by the World Championships in Japan. At the conclusion of these events, the Australian party, which included Stephen Knapp, were invited to China for a 12 day visit. This visit was not only a chance in a life time for the players but also for the sport of table tennis to hit the headlines of the World press.

Our representatives learnt a great deal from their trip overseas and this knowledge is now being passed on to the local players.

Australian National Championships

The host city for this years Championship was Perth.

Team Championship

New South Wales and Victoria both won their first matches easily and met on the final morning of the Teams Championship. Both teams were confident of winning but New South Wales came to the fore with a repeat of their 8-1 success last year in Sydney to win the Spalding Shield.

Our Womens team was not as strong as it was last year and despite the efforts of our players, who did everything possible to stave off their opponents, we slipped to third position.

The Junior Boys team improved on its 1970 position. They were defeated only in their final match against Victoria to finish second. This was a good performance and the event showed the improvement of our Junior standard.

Although our Girls team did not win a match, they went close to winning on a couple of occasions. They also showed some improvement.

Singles and Doubles Events

New South Wales players were prominent in the Individual events.

In the Mens Singles Doug Cowell lost to Sutherland (V) in an "expedite" match, whilst Stephen Knapp was defeated in the fifth game by the title holder Wuvanich (V), who then went on to defeat Lee Mun Chew in the semi-final and also to defeat Paul Pinkewich in the final. Pinkewich who had been installed as the favourite by many knowledgeable critics had earlier beaten Tuckett (V) in the quarter-final and Leong (W.A.) in the semi-final.

Joy Brown once again proved her steadiness by reaching the sem-final in the Womens Singles before losing to former New South Wales player Ann McMahon in four. Together with Ann in the Womens Doubles and with Paul Pinkewich in the Mixed Doubles Joy again reached the semi-final stages.

In the Junior Boys events Stephen Knapp proved that he was the best player in Australia in this class. He swept all opposition aside to win his first National title.

Later in the same evening Stephen combined with Wuvanich (V) to win the Mens Doubles title from the previous holders Pinkewich (NSW) and Lee Mun Chew (NSW).

Player of the Year Awards

It was a great honour for New South Wales and the players that both the Junior and Senior "Player of the Year" Awards should have favoured New South Wales.

Congratulations are extended to Stephen Knapp on his winning the Michael Szabados Award for Juniors and to Paul Pinkewich on his winning the Victor Barna Award for Seniors.

The measure of success that New South Wales attained during the exciting week in Perth was attributable not only to the playing ability of the players themselves but also to the wonderful team spirit that prevailed throughout the whole party. This undoubtedly helped all players to give of their best.

Congratulations are extended to all of the players who irrespective of their winning or losing, played and conducted themselves with credit to New South Wales and Australia.

I have examined the accounts of the New South Wales Table Tennis Association for the year ended 31st December, 1971, and have obtained all the information and explanations required, subject to production of a statement from the New South Wales Permanent Building Society and a similar statement from Ansett Airlines of Australia.

In my opinion, the Balance Sheet and Statement of Income and Expenditure are properly drawn up so as to give a true and fair view of the affairs of the Association according to the best of my information and the explanations given me and as shown by the books of the Association.

Australian Sub-Junior Championships

The Championships were the first of such National titles held in the new South Australian Table Tennis Centre, in Adelaide.

All representatives played well at the Championships and have shown improvement since their return from Adelaide.

This was the first year in which we were able to field teams in all events and we hope that we will be able to continue to compete regularly in the future.

Bill Robson was the outstanding player for New South Wales. In reversing his defeat by Robbie Javor (V) in Hobart in 1970, he became the first New South Welshman to win the Under 14 Boys Singles Championship of Australia. Congratulations Bill.

New South Wales Championships

International players Joy Brown and Paul Pinkewich dominated the State Championships which were marred by the poor number of entries.

We were pleased to have the English touring team of Tony Clayton and Brian Burn take part. They won the Mens Doubles title from the previous holders, Lee Mun Chew and Paul Pinkewich.

In the Mens Singles, Pinkewich reached the final by defeating Clayton (England) in the semi-final. His opponent was the other Englishman, Brian Burn, who had defeated Doug Cowell (3-1) in the quarter-final and Stephen Knapp (3-0) in the semi-final. Knapp had earlier caused the upset of the tournament by defeating three times winner, Lee Mun Chew. In another surprise result Peter Hay defeated George Livesey (3-2).

For Joy Brown it was "fourth time lucky" when she defeated Fay Smith in the final of the Womens Singles after being runner-up in 1964, 1966 and 1967. Joy then partnered Fay to win the Womens Doubles, and followed up by partnering Paul Pinkewich to win the Mixed Doubles to conclude a very successful Championship.

Congratulations are extended to the winners and runners-up in all events.

Tour of Park Sung In

Those who came into contact with him, including players from four country centres and many city players and officials in New South Wales found him to be a genuine, sincere person with patience and an outstanding knowledge of our game, fitting him as a Table Tennis coach of unique ability. It can be seen from the advancement of the skill of many players who took part in his coaching courses that their games have improved remarkably. We are indeed grateful to the Rothmans Sports Foundation for bringing such a Gentleman to our shores.

Michael Szabados Award for 1971

The Award for the person who was considered to have done the most for Table Tennis in this State during the year has been awarded to Joy Brown.

Joy has had an exceptionally good playing year winning the treble at the State Championships and reaching the semi-final stages or all three events at the National titles in Perth. Besides these achievements she has won fourteen other titles during the year.

One of her ambitions in Table Tennis was to attain No. 1 ranking in New South Wales and 1971 has seen this ambition fulfilled.

As Assistant Secretary of the New South Wales Table Tennis Association she is always on hand in the promotion of every function that is staged during the year and each job is administered in a pleasant and willing manner. Her attention to administrative business dealt with by the Executive Council is unflagging and valuable.

In her capacity as a Coach, she commands the respect of many of our Junior players with whom Joy, together with husband Ray, spend many long hours.

Joy always has the good of the game at heart and we hope that the many hours of hard work that she has put into the sport have been made worthwhile.
