COUNTRY TEAM VISITS

Mesdames M. Wood (Goul.) D. Selmes (Goul.) and Misses K. Kolleth (A.C.T.) A. Stevenson were chosen to represent N.S.W. Country to tour Victoria in May. Three matches were played against Country Teams, our teams being successful in each match. The final match against a combined Victorian Country side was won by Victoria 6 - 5. Mrs. Selmes was undefeated on the tour.

During the same period, our Country Association were hosts to the Victorian Men's Country Team who played at Cootamundra, Gunning, Goulburn, Maitland and Newcastle. After defeating all these teams, they played against a combined N.S.W. Country Team and N.S.W. won 6 - 5.

JAPANESE WOMEN'S TEAM

N.S.W. joined with Victoria in being the only Australian States to present another Japanese Team, this time a Women's side. A test match Japan v. Australia was staged and despite the fact that no N.S.W. representatives particapated, a capacity crowd packed the Macabbean Hall. Japan were represented by Miss Kimiyo Matsuzaki and Miss Kazuko Yamaizumi. Australia's Team was Suzy Javor (Vic) and Leone Murphy (Q'ld), Japan recorded a 5 Rubbers to Nil victory.

AUSTRALIAN TEAM TOUR OF NEW ZEALAND

An Australian Team comprising G. Jennings and M. Wilcox were selected by the A.T.T.A. to represent Australia in a 16 match tour of New Zealand. This tour was our Country's most successful ever, as every match was won, including one test against New Zealand. Both of these N.S.W. players are to be congratulated on their excellent efforts.

N.S.W. JUNIOR TABLE TENNIS

Special attention was paid to this important section of the game this year and prior to selection of the team to compete in the Australian Junior Championships, Junior Trials were conducted in Sydney in conjunction with the St. George Championships. Of particular interest was the selection of two country boys in the Junior Team.

PUBLICITY

Whilst no improvement can be reported with the "Big Four", Sydney daily newspapers overall the publicity given to our sport in other mediums increased considerably. Television featured a special tournament with three matches being staged over three consecutive Saturday Sporting programmes. A recording of highlights of the Women's Test Match, Japan vs. Australia was made and shown throughout Australia. A direct telecast was made of the semifinals and final night of the N.S.W. State Championships. Newreels were made of the Japan vs. Australia Women's match and also of members of the Australian World Championship Team at training. Both of these newsreels were distributed throughout Australia.

The Executive Committee decided to introduce a News Sheet, the first edition of which will be available this month.

ASSOCIATION HEADQUARTERS

A Sub-committee, comprising the office bearers of the Executive Committee met on a number of occasions and spent many hours discussing plans for the obtaining of suitable headquarters. It was decided to approach various Commonwealth and State government departments, council and local bodies in an effort to obtain land and or buildings.

An interview was obtained with the Minister of Transport, and in addition approaches were made to the following:

A number of sites were inspected, however, none proved suitable. Despite some quite sympathetic hearings, no definite assistance could be obtained. However, the retiring committee will strongly advise the incoming executive to continue these approaches.
