The Primary School Championship is played in age groupings – Infants, Junior is Years 3 & 4, and Senior is Years 5 & 6. The morning session sees all players involved in a school team's round robin with group winners going on to the Challenge Cup Knockout Stage in the afternoon. Gold, silver and bronze medals are presented to winning teams. Students who do not make it through to the Knockout Stage are entered in

the Repechage singles event with certificates awarded to winners and runner-up in each age division – Infants, Junior and Senior.

This year saw the biggest entry we have had with nearly 200 students representing 15 schools. It was good to see so many parents come to encourage their children play. Some good skills are being developed and the children demonstrated good sportsmanship. I watched some close games and was impressed with the support shown by the teachers. It was also good to see a number of girls holding their own against the boys. Special thanks go to Pauline Chen who ran the Infants competition where 20 little champions showed off their skills. It was a credit to Mr Finlay that most of the matches finished on time. The future of NSW table tennis is in good hands.

Wow! What a great year for NSW Veteran's Table Tennis which gives us great pleasure to write this report.

Again, our excellent Veteran's Committee has worked tirelessly on our behalf to maintain a high standard across 4 Divisions of Veterans Challenge. All credit to Gillian Hutchinson, Beverley Clackson and Jennifer Aduckiewicz who, as Grade Coordinators, managed to ensure full teams across all division with no team forfeits in 2018. Credit also to the 2018 team captains who did a great job of organising their teams. I can assure you that this takes a lot of effort and many emails and phone calls. As a result, Ian Finlay, our Treasurer, has informed us that this is the first year that Vets collected all the monies payable for the team's competition.

As always, special commendation goes to Ian Finlay who, not only runs the tournament and collects the fees but also enters the results into Ratings Central. We are very lucky to have our results kept up to date as these impact on tournament seedings even at a National level.

Speaking of Nationals, 2018 was a stunning year for NSW players. It was the best year that we can remember. Almost every NSW A team won a medal with the 0/75 NSW Men's Teams winning Gold and Bronze medals. The Individual results were also stunning. Almost 50% of the NSW Veterans Team were named in the Order of Merit lists. Eriko Morden, Michael Bowrey, Wayne Heginbotham, Paul Pinkewich and Rose Veerhuis all named as No 1 in the Order of Merit. Many players also enjoyed their personal best performances. In the Individual Events, NSW claimed 12 gold medals, 10 silver and 13 bronze medals. Congratulations also to David Clackson, Ted Davis and Beryl Davies who were NSW Team Managers this year. We are looking forward to the next championships at the St Clair Recreation Centre, Woodville in South Australia.

Once again, we celebrated the Veterans' Christmas party at Canterbury Hurlstone Park RSL Club. They have looked after us with excellent food and a great venue for many years now, so keep the last Sunday in November free to join us in 2019. This is a special occasion where the 2018 NSW Rankings are announced and the Veteran's Challenge prizes are distributed. It is also a time to recognise our best players for the year. St George and Sutherland Shire Table Tennis Association's 2018-2019 Annual Report

Background

STGSSTTA plays its weekly pennant at Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre (HALC), cnr King Georges Road & Forest Road, Hurstville on Tuesday nights between 7:00pm and 10:30pm. It runs 2 pennants each year, the Summer Pennant from early February to late June and the Winter Pennant from mid-July to early December.

There are around 400 people that have played in the pennants over the last few years. They cover a broad and diverse spectrum ranging from novices playing their first competition to the best players in Australia, from 10 year olds just starting their table tennis careers to over 80 year old veterans and are from all cultural, ethnic and religious backgrounds.

The Association also runs a social night each Friday from 7:30pm to 9:30pm. Anyone is welcome to come along and have a hit and the hall is usually full of people. They vary from individuals seeking to improve their skills to family groups enjoying the night out together.

STGSSTTA is committed to:

- Providing a safe and inviting environment where people can compete against others but still enjoy themselves;
- Increasing the membership of table tennis in our local area;
- Increasing the profile of table tennis in our local area;
- Nurturing junior development by providing sponsorship to players making representative teams; and
- Recognising the playing achievements of our athletes at all levels.

Recent History

The Association has had a remarkable period of growth over the last 12 months. The last 3 pennants have been:

- 2018 Summer Pennant, with 184 players in 40 teams, competing in 4 Grades.
- 2018 Winter Pennant, with 190 players in 38 teams, competing in 5 Grades.
- 2019 Summer Pennant, with 225 players in 46 teams, competing in 5 Grades.

Further, the Association secured sponsorship for Premier Grade for the last 2 pennants, which has added even more intensity to the competition with prizemoney awarded to the winner, runner-up and third place teams. The 2018 Winter Pennant was sponsored by The One, the same company sponsoring the NSW Open Championships and the 2019 Summer Pennant is being sponsored by the Imperial Dynasty Restaurant, located in Club Central, Hurstville.

Problems and Solutions

Success can bring its own problems and in our case, it is the lack of space needed to increase the number of tables required to accommodate the growing number of players and teams. The Association makes every effort to accommodate all players and teams that want to play in our competition. It can take the Committee over 2 weeks to settle the makeup of each pennant once players/teams have entered so that we achieve a fair and equitable outcome for all players as well as a strong and viable competition.

This growth in players and teams over the last 12 months has stretched our resources to the limit and the Committee has had to come up with creative solutions to allow everyone to play, e.g. the use of byes in grades, fitting extra players into teams that only entered with a few members and a list of reserve players on call when needed.

The maximum number of tables we can fit into our current area is 17. To increase the number of teams for the 2018 Summer Pennant, the Association hired an additional room at HALC. Hiring the Mind & Body Room each week is expensive and the room is not ideal for table tennis but it gives us space for an additional 3 tables. As we continued to grow, we sought an additional area for the 2019 Summer Pennant and found it at Oatley, courtesy of the Oatley Active Table Tennis Club. Again, it is not an ideal situation but we can accommodate an additional 4 teams as a result.

The Association continues to explore other options at HALC to allow for further expansion, such as changing to Monday nights if it meant obtaining extra space. Unfortunately, we have not been successful but we will continue to explore all possible options and to lobby the local council and both local State and Federal members of Parliament for assistance. One possibility is that HALC is scheduled to be expanded in the next couple of years and we hope additional space will become available when it is completed.

Reasons for Success

The Association's weekly pennants are popular and continue to grow because:

- The pennants are run efficiently and we look after the interests of the players;
- The atmosphere in the venue is electric with approximately 200 players and supporters there each week;
- Players like playing in one venue on the same night each week;
- The early finish allows juniors still at school, people starting work early and those players travelling long distances, to get home at a reasonable hour; and

- The strength of the competition and the standard of play continues to rise, with strong levels of competition sustained over the whole pennant.

Player Achievements

The strength of our competition can be seen by the quality of the players playing in our last 3 pennants and some of their recent achievements:

Athletes selected in the 2019 National Squad (Able-Bodied) – multiple age groups, i.e. seniors and juniors – Tier 1: Kane Townsend, Chris Yan, Alex Lee, Michelle Bromley, Tracy Feng, Sue Bin Oh; Tier 2: Bob Liang, Alex Yeung, Hwan Bae.

Table Tennis Australia has just released its National Rankings for February 2019 for Seniors, Youth, i.e. U/21s, and Juniors, i.e. U/18s, U/15s, U/13s & U/11s. Of the 20 ranked male players from NSW, 16 or 80% are playing in the 2019 Summer Pennant. Some important rankings are Chris Yan, ranked No. 2 in Seniors, Alex Lee ranked No. 1 in U/18s, Clarence Cheng, Won Bae and Jeffrey Guo ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively in U/13s and Won Bae ranked No.1 in U/11s. Of the 20 ranked female players from NSW, 8 or 40% are playing in the 2019 Summer Pennant. Some important rankings are Sue Bin Oh ranked 7th in U/21s and 4th in U/18s and Celine Chen ranked 4th in U/15s and 2nd in U/13s.
