Another year of Table Tennis activity has ended and it affords me great pleasure in presenting this, the 15th Annual Report of the N.S.W. Table Tennis Association.

TEAMS' PREMIERSHIPS. The teams' competitions once again attracted a large entry. The A. Reserve Grade, which had not been played for a few years, was reintroduced, and proved very popular. The Men's A and A. Reserve Grades, and Ladies A. Grade were again conducted on a similar basis to that of the International Swaythling Cup, three singles players on each side playing each other, the best of three singles games, with one best of three games of Doubles.

The paper was sent out to all Club Secretaries, Affiliated Associations and each State Association in Australia. It is hoped the publication will be continued in 1951, and the Association welcomes articles or items of news that may be of interest to others.

CITY OF SYDNEY AND METROPOLITAN CHAMPIONSHIPS were again conducted and proved a great success.
