# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

In the President's Report of 1971 I made a number of observations and recommendations which I felt would promote an overall improvement in the structure and status of the game throughout New South Wales. In recapitulation of this report I am pleased to advise that a number of these recommendations have now passed the initial stage and I can see a much brighter year in 1973 than some I have witnessed in years gone by.

My initial impression of what 1972 would be like, was, that it would be "somewhat of a domestic year". There were no overseas trips planned nor any tours to be made of Australia and it seemed that most of the year would be spent in placing our house in order. How wrong I was! The Peoples Republic of China put paid to these thoughts when it was unexpectedly announced that its first-ever delegation would make a lightning trip to Australia. The work associated with this tour made great inroads into the time available by officials and I feel sure that more domestic duties would have been accomplished had we been able to utilise the time as we had originally planned.

Our aims for 1972 were as follows:

- 1. To continue to foster and develop a closer liaison with our Country and Metropolitan Associations.
- 2. To ensure that the registration of all organisations playing Table Tennis in New South Wales became effective.
- 3. To ensure that there would be a substantial increase in the numbers of people registered and playing Table Tennis in New South Wales.
- 4. To see that there was a reformation of our Umpires' Association.
- 5. To establish a realistic building programme, the funds for which were based on a regular source of income.

The groundwork for the fulfilment of these aims are now firmly established. We had our second affiliated associations meeting in December and although some associations were conspicuous by their absence it was a further step in the right direction. The recommendations which emanated from this meeting can only improve the relationship of all associations throughout New South Wales.

No less than eleven new associations became affiliated and this brought the total in 1972 to 26, only one short of the all-time record for New South Wales. Our registered membership almost doubled and as these results were achieved prior to the much-publicised Chinese tour we can look forward to a further continuation of interest in our game.

A Building Programme Committee was established and has been active in looking at ways and means of establishing our own premises.

The Umpires' Association is yet to commence but the groundwork is completed and hopefully it will be operative in the early part of this year.

The highlight of the past twelve months undoubtedly was the previously mentioned tour by the Peoples' Republic of China. This was a tour of mammoth proportions, riddled with political intrigue, both heartbreaking, yet not without humour, demanding on officialdom to an extreme, and in the end an unqualified success. Unfortunately, New South Wales were the main sufferers in the drama which developed and it was most disappointing when one of the Sydney matches was cancelled and we suffered a loss of gate receipts totalling \$12,000.

In closing, may I thank all those people who have assisted the New South Wales Association throughout the past year, too countless to name, and to whom I am deeply indebted. To my committee may I just say this: "Thank you for your co-operation and continued efforts in spite of many setbacks. There was a time during the Chinese tour when I could easily have thrown in the sponge and but for your support at the critical stage this may have reached fruition. I believe we now have the nucleus of a progressive and active Council which will more than meet the demands required in the year ahead."

#### LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

This, the thirty-seventh Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year 1972.

The Association had an extremely busy year which was highlighted by the visit to Australia of the Peoples' Republic of China Table Tennis delegation.

We were fortunate enough to be able to secure the new Hordern Pavilion as the playing venue, enabling large crowds to see our visitors.

The tour was not without its problems, and we owe our thanks to the A.T.T.A. for their part in the negotiations to enable the tour to continue after one session had been cancelled.

The Australian T.T.A. selected Anne McMahon (S.A.) and Paul Pinkewich (N.S.W.) to travel around the Commonwealth with the Chinese team and these two, together with Joy Brown, Fay Smith, Stephen Knapp and Lee Mun Chew, played against the visitors in Sydney.

# TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIP:

In the men's event, both N.S.W. and Victoria one again coasted through their early matches. N.S.W., superbly fit both mentally and physically, had some anxious moments against the home State. Stephen Knapp remained undefeated in the teams matches and was the backbone of our 6-3 victory to win the Spalding Shield for the third year in succession.

The women's team improved on their 1971 position to finish second this year. Joy Brown was the "star" and became only the second woman since the war to win 15 rubbers in an interstate series. Her three wins against Victoria were all we could manage, and thus the home State retained the shield.

Our young junior boys retained second position. This augurs well for the future as we now have a strong basis to work on for a few years to come. Credit must go to their coach, Noel Shorter, who has coached all of their players within the last two years, and moulded these young lads into a fine team.

The junior girls team were unable to win a match but Glenda Mason, in particular, showed that with more practice she could become a good player.

#### SINGLES AND DOUBLES EVENTS:

Paul Pinkewich once again reached the final of the Men's Singles only to be denied the title by Charlie Wuvanich (V.) in an exciting and tense final.

Paul had earlier defeated Peter Powell (SA.) and Bob Tuckett (V.) in a semi-final. Tuckett beat Lee Mun Chew to reach that stage.

Stephen Knapp qualified to play Wuvanich in the second semi-final and after a fast encounter lost in the fifth game after having several match points.

In a repeat of last year's Men's Doubles, Stephen Knapp and C. Wuvanich defeated P. Pinkewich and Lee Mun Chew.

Joy Brown and Fay Smith reached the semi-final of the Women's Doubles but lost to V. Woodward and R. Greenwood (V.) in the fifth game.

#### PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARDS:

Once again NS.W was prominent in the awards for 1972. Our Assistant Secretary, Joy Brown, was a worthy winner of the Victor Barna Award which climaxed a very good year for Joy. She was making her 10th appearance for the State and went through her teams matches without defeat.

Congratulations are extended to all the players who, irrespective of their winning or losing, played and conducted themselves with credit to their State.

Glenda Mason was the most successful player in the girls ranks, winning the majority of her matches.

Martin Stern did well at his first attempt of coaching with the girls team.

It was pleasing to see all States represented at this carnival for the first time.

Paul Pinkewich retained his Men's Singles and Mixed Doubles title this year only days after returning from a training trip to Japan.
