Jennings and J. Klesman represented N.S.W. Once again England was victorious. Exhibitions were also played at Wollongong and Cootamundra. The attendance at all matches was most satisfactory, and the spectators witnessed excellent exhibitions.

### INTERSTATE MATCH. N.S.W. VERSUS QUEENSLAND.

On 26th November, a Queensland team visited Sydney to play N.S.W. The Queensland team was P. Anderson, H. Porter, and C. Shaw. N.S.W. was represented by M. Dankin, B. Griffin, G. Jennings, and J. Klesman. Queensland was victorious by 6 games to 5. The attendance was very disappointing. All Clubs were advised that they would see the leading players in Australia in action, in this match, but very few players availed themselves of the opportunity.
