#### WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 1954.

Three N.S.W. players, W. Hodge, G. Jennings and L. Laza, expressed their intention of going to England at their own expense, to play in the World Championships. The matter was referred to the Australian Selectors and the players were chosen to represent Australia in the Swaythling Cup, which will be played in London in March, 1954. The N.S.W. Association gave the three players £100 between them, to help towards their expenses, in addition exhibitions were arranged at which £50 was collected, and divided among the three players.

#### HEADQUARTERS CLUB.

The Association opened their own Headquarters Club at 731 Darling Street, Rozelle. Four tables were used at first, but in an endeavour to make more playing space, one table was later removed. Unfortunately, we did not receive the support we expected, which resulted in a loss of £35 for our eight months tenancy during 1953. Members of the Executive Council attended each night, to conduct the business on behalf of the Association.

## COUNTRY ASSOCIATIONS.

During the year some of our top grade players visited Dubbo, Orange, Goulburn, Maitland, and Woy Woy. Their exhibitions were much appreciated by spectators and players in the various towns.
