PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2008

Another year has passed and the duties and demands of not only myself but, also the Council Members, Affiliated Associations and Volunteers has grown and is being continually met.

During 2008 we have on top of our normal state run tournaments, taken on the responsibility of planning and organising for two high profile events namely:

2009 World Masters Games 2009 Australian Veterans Championships

These events will assist in raising the profile of table tennis in the media and help to further promote our game.

These two events have challenged our capacity as well as those of our affiliated association, St George & Sutherland Association, who have diligently worked with us on the viability of the Hurstville centre to meet international playing standards for the above events. The work is still continuing.

NSW Affiliated Associations, Clubs and members of the NSW Board and Committees, all deserve our praise for their devotion to table tennis and my thanks for the many hours they have laboured to promote the sport of table tennis to all the community.

We were pleased to welcome three new Affiliated Associations this year with Cabra-Vale Diggers Table Tennis Club; Orange Table Tennis Association and Pittwater Uniting Church Table Tennis Club joining our ranks.

Once again, I am pleased to say NSW TT Inc., has gained recognition in the community for providing an excellent volunteer service to two well known charities, namely:

The Children's Hospital at Westmead (event called Teddy Bears' Picnic), over 900 children and their parents visited our stall over an eight- hour period and enjoyed playing on the full size robot tables as well as the five to eight year old's playing on a miniature sized table.

Also, The Variety Club at Convention Centre Darling Harbour, again there were well over 800 children under the age of 16.

Both these events could not have been provided without the assistance of some twenty (20) table tennis players who volunteered their day to assist.

TTNSW is also involved with organising coaching and equipment for the disabled at Ryde Eastwood Rehabilitation Centre and Mental Health Services at Liverpool. Also, one-day events such as Wheel Chair and Paralympic qualifiers.

One of the major events we are involved in attracts over 1,000 school children in the

form of managing metropolitan school teams competitions for girls and boys at Homebush. The events are run over several days and, are very challenging events to plan and communication skills essential to make things happen on time.

In the country area, we are assisted by the Country League Association, who manage two big events namely, the Country Championship as well as the Country versus City teams challenge. Thank you for your efforts.

In 2008, over 15 players passed their coaching level certificates. We encourage everyone to at least pass a Level 1 coaching course and proceed to the next level. There is always a demand for coaches to help teach at various schools across the State. Our next goal for 2009 is to increase the number of umpires.

It is very important that, at all times, everyone promotes table tennis and encourages volunteers to assist with the challenges which are continually being placed on TTNSW Inc., in the completion of its duties. Without dedicated people to join various committees, we cannot continue to function and develop to a high standard.

Remember that TTNSW does not receive sufficient funding, to handle the ever increasing costs. We depend on our player members and their spouses to register and/or play in tournaments.

New South Wales has been heavily involved in the 2009 Sydney World Masters' Games preparation for the last four years.

In conjunction with the SWMGOC, most preparation is already in place. We are pleased to advise that Hurstville Council approved a lighting upgrade for the Johnny Warren Stadium at the Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre (HALC). This upgrade was completed in the 2^{nd} week of January 2009.

The Games are expecting 30,000 athletes from 100 nations across 28 sports, of which, Table Tennis is one. The dates for these games are 10th – 17th October 2009.

NSW will also be hosting the Australian Veterans' Championships to coincide with these Games 17th October to 24th October at HALC. We are have confirmed the venue at Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre for both the World Masters' and the Australian Veterans Championships for 2009.

We are expecting record numbers for both events. We plan to have up to 31 new ITTF approved standard tables & new court surrounds. For more information on the World Masters' Games please check the Website: www.2009worldmastersgames.com

Information packs were distributed to the State delegates at the 2008 Australian Veterans' Championship in Perth.

COUNTRY LEAGUE REPORT 2008

During the past year the Country League has been examining the way it operates and has put in place a number of initiatives.

COACHING:

After examining coaching opportunities and the lack of face-to-face coaching in country areas, the executive sought a good quality DVD that, in particular, demonstrated how to play all the shots as well as footwork and strategies. As a result, the Killerspin, "Success in Table Tennis", featuring Zoran Primorac, was purchased. A copy has been supplied to each country association to assist in developing player standards.

FUTURE COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Conducting the Country Championships has become a massive logistical task over the last few years as the venue has moved all around the state in an effort to promote the sport. The results have been varied, in that, if we go too far north we have very few southern players and vice versa. After examining the costs over the past 10 years and the impact the strategy of taking table tennis to some of these venues, it was determined that there was little benefit at all and a lot of effort by a few people.

A central venue that would allow roughly equal travel time was considered the best option, as it typically meant an increase in entries of 10 to 12 teams. A plan was devised to have a central venue locked in for at least three years in advance and to hold the event each year at the same venue which had all the tables and barriers.

Homebush was considered, but it is impractical for this type of event and too costly. Hurstville was considered but tables would need to be carted and the venue cost too high. Central Coast was selected as it had the tables and the size and cost-wise was one of the cheapest venues. However, after discussions with the management, we found that we couldn't get this venue every June long weekend, but could get it each year if we held it at Easter.

The country Championships first started in 1954 being held on the Easter weekend at the Balmain Table Tennis Centre and continued till 1963, when Summer Hill venue in Sydney became available but, only on the June long weekend.

Easter had a lot of advantages in running the country championships, providing more time to hold events and potentially better travel times for players. This proposal of going back to Easter was then

discussed by the country delegates at the AGM in June and put to all the players during the medal presentation on the Sunday afternoon.

From the feedback about going back to Easter, particularly the resistance to playing this weekend no matter what format and how much relevance players put towards having individual events, finally swayed the Committee into choosing an ordinary weekend close to the June long weekend but, with teams only at Central Coast where we will be able to accommodate 50 teams. So, in 2009 the Country Championships will be held on the weekend of the 30th and 31st May.

Central Coast have applied to get funding to upgrade their lighting and the country league will make a one off purchase of barriers which will be kept at the venue.

OTHER EVENTS:

A northern region teams challenge was held at Lismore in August, including teams from Queensland. This proved to be an outstanding success, and the idea is to promote similar team challenges in the southern regions and out west.

The Country League is also considering another team challenge which could be on a club basis but have Sydney, Victorian and Queensland teams play against NSW country associations to be held later in the year, each year at the Central Coast venue. At this stage, nothing has been organised for 2009.

The 55th 2008 Country Championships were held at St Stanislaus College, Bathurst, over the June long weekend.

Bathurst Association did a fantastic job in promoting the event, through their local media and included getting two of Australia's Olympic representatives for demonstrations, William Henzell and David Zalcberg. However, William injured himself before the main evening events, and Michelle Beaumont, as an Australian representative and a participant in the championships, then stepped in to fill in for William and with David Zalcberg, provided some entertaining table tennis for the spectators.

Even a fire alarm didn't deter the function on the Saturday night.

COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2008

- 1. Appointment of Director of Coaching renewed in 2008
- 2. I have begun to implement a Coaching Structure for NSW after consultation with the Board of Directors, Secretary and NSW President. The Proposed Coaching Structure was approved with the Board members in 2007.
- 3. The following provides an outline of the NSW Table Tennis Proposed Coaching Structure:
 - 1. The training system is designed to work in with the proposed National Training Centres for high performance program
 - 2. Our common aims-key focus areas are development, participation and competitions
 - 3. The structure creates a bottom up approach to table tennis sport and enables the sport to concentrate its efforts on developing the foundation for future growth, up to the elite level of international standard.
 - 4. In developing the Coaching Structure, we need to ensure that strategies are developing and implemented into our table tennis sport by creating opportunities at all levels complemented by a proposed high performance program.

In 2008, the training sessions were conducted at the Indoor Sports Halls, Olympic Park, Homebush on Tuesday evenings, some Saturdays and Sundays, a total of 35 sessions, over 114 hours with approximately 1054 participating players. Every session we had about 30-40 players attending the training session.

In 2008, I had a coaching agreement for NTC (National Training Centre) with TTNSW President, Les Walczuk, that I had attended all National Squad training sessions at PCYC. My task was to entail "specific training" for all National Squad members. The training schedule was in March to November 2008. There were 2 session training times from 12noon-2pm and 4pm-6pm. We had 46 training sessions - 92 hours in total. The training sessions included various technical skills and competition tactics. The training programs were specifically designed and individually tailored, in order to improve their overall skills by 60%. If sufficient times are allowed, their overall improvement will increase to 80%.

In 2007, it was proposed to review all the selected players in the NSW State Squads for

their regularl training programs. In order for the players to maintain their NSW State Squads privilege status, they must attend a minimum of 80% of the designated training sessions and have the right attitude and discipline towards regular training.

In 2008, we found that some NSW junior squad players were not disciplined enough to attend the regular training but, we still selected these players to represent the NSW State team for the Australian Junior Open Championship.

In contrast, a lot of sub-junior players and junior players who had attended 85% of the regular training sessions with good discipline and attitude were not given a chance to be selected to represent the NSW State team to compete in the Australian Junior Open Championship.

I hope, in 2009, we will select NSW State team players based on 3 main criteria - firstly, results from NSW Junior Closed Championships. Secondly, results from NSW Open Championships. Thirdly, their regular training sessions should be over 80% with good discipline and attitude plus. In addition, they are potential players and all can have a fair opportunity for selection into NSW State team for Australian Junior Open Championship.

STATE COACHING DIRECTOR, PAUL ZHAO:

Responsible for developing the coaching strategy and managing the implementation of the overall coaching plan for NSW.

COACHING DEVELOPMENT:

A person responsible for developing new Level 1 and Level 2 Coaches and provide an ongoing update for their coaching knowledge and training skills.

COACHING RESOURCE FOR SCHOOLS:

A person who is responsible for offering table tennis coaching services to all NSW schools. The services include but, not limited to:

- supply qualified table tennis coaches to schools for their training needs
- promote table tennis as a sport at the grass root level in schools
- identify potential talented players
- co-ordinate school tournaments

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 5 to 10 new Level 1 Coaches or Level 1 Coaches in training,

working in conjunction with the Coaching Development team to train Junior players. The purposes are to:

- develop proper basic technical skills
- develop individual playing styles
- groom potential Junior players for State Junior Squad

STATE JUNIOR COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 1 & Level 2 coaches to train the State Junior Squad. The purposes are to:

- consolidate their technical skills
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- groom potential Junior players for State Senior or Youth Squads

SENIOR/YOUTH COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 2 & Level 3 Coaches to train State Senior and Youth Squads. The purposes are to:

- consolidate their technical skills
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- improve their combined techniques, tactics and mind use in competitions
- groom potential Senior & Youth players for National Training Centre

VETERANS' COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 2 & Level 3 Coaches to train the Veteran Squad. The purposes are to:


- consolidate their technical skills
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- improve their combined techniques, tactics and mind use in competitions

AWD COACHING TEAM:

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experienced Level 1, Level 2 & Level 3 Coaches to

train AWD Players. The purposes are to:

- develop their unique playing style
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- improve their combined techniques, tactics and mind use in competitions



- 4. As the NSW Coaching Director, I would like to comment on the above, as the implementer of the NSW coaching structure. I am able to delegate Assistant Coaches for coaching the Junior Development Team. These players provide a useful resource for selecting the Junior Squad. The coaching development for Level 1 and Level 2 Coaches has worked out well in conjunction with the coaching development team to train Junior players. These coaches have, at the same time, benefited as they were provided with ongoing updates for their own coaching knowledge and training skills. Veteran teams and AWD teams were trained accordingly, to improve their skills.
- 5. NSW Senior and Youth Squad players were combined with NSW State Squad Teams training together. I will consolidate their technical, tactic skills and improve their individual style of playing, in order to groom them into top potential players where they will then go to National Training Centres for the high

6. performance program. Unfortunately, some NSW junior squad players went training directly with National Training Centres, without the process of consolidation and development in their new skills directions. These state players have not completed NSW State training schedules and they were not supposed to be involved in any National Training Centre's sessions. Some of the players did not attend any combined training sessions with the NSW State Squad Team.

In my view, I believe this confusion should be avoided. As a coaching director, I would like to have a clear NSW State Coaching Director and the National Squad coaching job description. Therefore we can decide whether these coachings can be combined or should be complementing each other or separate, all for the benefit and performance of the NSW State Squad players.

SYDNEY UPPER NORTH SHORE ANNUAL REPORT 2008

FAILED ATTEMPT TO START METROPOLITAN LEAGUE IN 2008

It is with regret that the attempt by the Sydney Upper North Shore (SUNS) Table Tennis Association President to start a Metropolitan League has failed because of lack of interest.

Twelve (12) invitations were sent in November, 2007 to the following affiliated Table Tennis Associations: Bathurst, Central Coast, Hurricane, Illawarra, Newcastle, Nepean, Insurance, Spears Sport, Sutherland, Sydney Northern Districts, Western Sydney and Wah Sing, with copies to Table Tennis New South Wales and Table Tennis Australia.

Four (4) replies were gratefully received with Bathurst, Illawarra and Sydney Northern Districts in favour and Nepean rejecting.

This was a very disappointing result as it was an attempt to promote table tennis on a regional basis by suggesting a 10-12 week competition in the second half of the year, depending on participants, on a home-and-away basis on weekends, initially, for top teams only.

It would open opportunities for sponsorship as well as finally creating a chance to report results in the major papers. If sufficient entries would have been received, a meeting was promised to discuss other issues like, venues; prize money; trophies, expansion to a second division. It was even suggested to extend this initiative to the NSW Country Affiliates and to promote, via Table Tennis Australia, this idea to other states so that, in the end, state champions could play off for a National Title.

Despite the silence and the limited reaction to this proposal, I believe that getting such a competition going is the only way to get away from the limited regional interest pursued by individual associations and promote table tennis as a worthwhile sport to take up by the population in general.

Organised table tennis seems to be centred on the top players with the individual associations left to run things their own way, often in competition with other affiliates.

By working in the future on a proper league set up from the top down, in all areas possible, table tennis will strengthen its position enormously.

We need not only regular meetings between affiliated associations but, also co-ordinated co-operation to bring table tennis to the forefront.

The challenge is – who wants to join this initiative and make it work? I am proposing to put this issue on the agenda for discussion at the Table Tennis NSW Annual General Meeting.

Re: Fees for Pennant Players

At our last Committee Meeting, we received a submission concerning TTNSW fees, Indications were made that our largest Club, Wenty Leagues Club is considering withdrawing from Table Tennis Western Sydney inc. Competitions due to the level of TTNSW Fees.

Concerns were raised at the level of fees for Non Tournament playing Pennant players. Discussions at our Meeting resulted in a motion being passed instructing me to forward this letter.

TTWS requests that fees for non Tournament playing Pennant players be reduced to 50% of current level. Consideration should be given to this request, considering the current financial Downturn causing hardship (especially in the socio-economical challenged Suburbs of Western Sydney.)

There is also a perception of paying 'Money for nothing 'amongst non Tournament playing Pennant Players, whom can not see any value in being affiliated with TTNSW.

After the recent collapse of several T.T. Clubs in our District, the committee of TTWS can not Ignore the concerns raised, at the risk of losing another (our districts largest) Club from our Competitions.

We hope TTNSW gives this request due consideration, as ignoring these concerns can only lead to a further erosion of Members & Competitions in our Sport of Table Tennis.
