#### ANNUAL REPORT

The Forty-First Annual Report to be presented to members at the Annual General Meeting, to be held at the Travelodge Motel, Camperdown, on Tuesday 15th February, 1977, at 7.00 p.m.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

This, the forty-first Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year, 1976.

The Association had an extremely busy year which was highlighted by the Australian National Championships in August-September at the Alexandria Basketball Stadium. Record entries were received.

Despite the fact that many Council members were inexperienced in staging an event of this size, the Championships Committee was able to introduce some new ideas and make improvements in other areas.

On the playing side, N.S.W. was very successful, winning two of the four teams events and two of the seven individual events.

The following players represented N.S.W. in the teams events —

WOMEN: M. Cannon, P. Hopkin (Capt.), B. Kearney, L. McKeough, V. Sikora.

JUNIOR BOYS: G. Brown, P. Gebauer, W. Heginbotham, G. Jonsson, W. Vickery, N. Shorter (N.P.C.).

JUNIOR GIRLS: M. Cannon, V. Sikora, K. Stephenson, M. McGreevy (N.P.C.).

#### **TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS**

In the men's event, N.S.W. regained the Spalding Shield with a 5-4 win over Victoria in the final match. Paul Pinkewich, captaining the State for the first time, won all three matches in this tie, and was well supported by Bob Tuckett.

The women's team improved their position to finish second this year, but were no match for Victoria who took the Ron Jones' Shield for the 19th consecutive time.

Our junior boys dominated their teams matches and recorded possibly our easiest ever win this event. Philip Gebauer was undefeated, and received strong support from Wayne Heginbotham and Warren Vickery.

The junior girls finished fourth, which was a creditable performance, considering that all three players were also sub-juniors.

#### INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

Paul Pinkewich was again runner-up in the Men's Singles, losing to Stephen Knapp (Victoria) who clinched his third Australian Singles' Title.

Paul defeated team-mate Bob Tuckett in the semi-final and Richard Lee (N.Z.) in the

quarter-final. Bob defeated Garry Munday (Victoria) in his quarter final.

Other good performances in this event were recorded by Warren Vickery who extended Stephen Knapp in the third round and Philip Gebauer who lost to Garry Munday after leading two games to love.

In the men's doubles, Paul Pinkewich and Bob Tuckett regained the title they last won in 1974, defeating Richard Lee and Jeff McCabe (Victoria) in the final.

In winning the women's singles, Barbara Kearney provided N.S.W. with our first victory in this event since 1956. After losing the first game 21-3, Barbara defeated Vicki Woodward (Victoria) in an exciting final.

Our junior boys were unable to produce their best form in the singles event. Philip Gebauer was runner-up to Neil Ward (S.A.).

#### PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

At the conclusion of the Championships, the Victor Barna Award for the outstanding player of 1976 was presented to Stephen Knapp.

The Michael Szabados Award for the outstanding junior player was presented to Neil

Ward.

Congratulations are extended to both these players.

#### **AUSTRALIAN SUB JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The 1976 Championships were staged in Adelaide. The N.S.W. teams were: BOYS UNDER 16: B. Griffin, R. Haberl, R. Oeskay, S. Peden, W. Vickery, E. Coster (N.P.C.).

Warren Vickery was the outstanding player in the boys' team events, spearheading N.S.W. to a comfortable victory in the Under 16 Section. Warren received good support from Bret Griffin and Steve Peden.

After losing to Queensland on the second day, our Under 14 boys recovered to win on a count-back. Glen Brown lost only two singles and Gary Haberl three, Gary's performance being regarded as outstanding for a 10-year-old.

Full credit must go to the Association's Coach, Eric Coster for his outstanding captaincy of these teams.

Despite finishing equal first, our Under 16 girls' team was placed third on a count-back. The Under 14 girls finished fourth.

#### INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

Once again, N.S.W. had plenty of success. Glen Brown won the Under 14 boys' singles, defeating Scott Campbell (Q'ld.) in the final. Mary Cannon was our first ever sub-junior

girl winner when she took out the Under 16 singles from Pam Whitehouse (O'ld.).

In the Under 16 boys' singles, Warren Vickery narrowly lost the final to Neil Ward (.S.A.).

Bret Griffin and Vera Sikora won the Under 16 mixed doubles.

Congratulations to all players on an excellent performance.

#### AUSTRALIAN TEAM TO WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Two N.S.W. players, Paul Pinkewich and Bob Tuckett were selected in the Australian Team for the 1977 World and Commonwealth Championships. For Paul, it will be his 6th "Worlds", and he is expected to become the first Australian to play 100 internationals for his country when Australia plays in the prestigeous Division 1 — a tremendous achievement.

Other team members are -

MEN: Robbie Javor, Steve Knapp (Victoria) and Neil Ward (S.A.).

WOMEN: Ann Middleton (S.A.), Helen Morrow, Kerry Thompson and Vicki Woodward (Victoria).

#### N.S.W. CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year's State Championships were played at the Summer Hill Centre. A very large entry was received.

Bob Tuckett took out his first major Championship when he defeated Andrew Savige (Victoria) in the final. Andrew defeated Warren Vickery in an excellent semi-final after upsetting Paul Pinkewich in the quarter final. Bob accounted for Rod Sutherland in his semi-final.

The women's singles was won by Barbara Kearney who defeated former champion Joy Brown in the final.

The long-established pairings of Paul Pinkewich — Bob Tuckett and Joy Brown — Fay Smith won the men's and women's doubles respectively.

Warren Vickery became the first player to win the N.S.W. and Victorian Under 16 and 18 Junior Titles in one season. He defeated Wayne Heginbotham in the Junior Boys' final.

The grade events were re-introduced this year and the good response was most encouraging. There were many excellent matches in all grades.

Several N.S.W. players participated in tournaments outside the State during 1976. Paul Pinkewich, in winning the City of Adelaide and South Australian Open collected the largest cash prizes yet offered in Australia.

In winning the "Ansett Airlines Tournament of Champions" in Melbourne, Bob Tuckett accounted for the cream of Australian Table Tennis to win the Men's Singles.

Other excellent performances were recorded by Warren Vickery, a semi finalist in the N.Z. Men's Singles and winner of the Victorian Junior Singles; and Philip Gebauer, winner of the City of Adelaide and New Zealand Junior Singles.

#### MICHAEL SZABADOS AWARD, 1976

The award for the person who was considered to have done the most for Table Tennis in this State during the year has been awarded to Mrs. Sue Griggs.

Apart from being a ranked player for several years, Sue was Chairwoman of the Fund Raising Sub-Committee and did outstanding work in this field. In addition, Sue was the manageress of the State teams this year.

#### **PUBLICITY**

Despite continued difficulty in obtaining newspaper space, there was a slight increase in publicity of our sport in 1976. The Association engaged a firm of Public Relations Consultants for the Australian Championships, and a reasonably good coverage of press, television and radio was received.

Thanks to the efforts of our publicity officer, Mr. Terry Halling, the monthly Newsletter appeared regularly.

The N.S.W. Public Service Association magazine "Table Top" re-appeared after a year's absence. There were three issues.

#### COACHING

The coaching scheme set up by Mr. Eric Coster continued to develop this year. Altogether there are now 90 registered coaches in New South Wales.

A panel of five coaches with Miss Pat Hopkin as co-ordinator was set up to administer the Coaching Scheme, and assess new applicants.

In the practical field, excellent work was done in the Police Boys' Clubs by Messrs. R. Hawkins, M. McGreevy, T. Halling, Mrs. J. Brown and others, whilst Miss C. Hughes continued her work at Willoughby Youth Club.

P. Pinkewich conducted a training camp for juniors in January, whilst R. Tuckett and P. Hopkin were active in various country centres throughout the year.

#### PROMOTION

There was an increase in the promotion of Table Tennis this year, the most significant event being the running of a combined High Schools Competition for the first time. Credit for the success of this competition goes to the co-ordinator, Mr. David Jones, sportsmaster at Granville High School, Sydney.

Paul Pinkewich and Bob Tuckett played exhibition matches at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, and a total crowd of approximately 40,000 watched the seventy two matches played. Exhibition matches were also held in clubs and shopping centres throughout the State.

#### **FUND RAISING**

The Fund Raising Sub-Committee, chaired by Mrs. Sue Griggs, did outstanding work throughout the year. As a result, the Council was able to take new incentives in regard to interstate trips for State teams, and improvement of playing conditions and trophies for various championships.

A grant of \$1,215 was received from the N.S.W. Department of Sport and Recreation, towards the costs of staging the N.S.W. and Australian Championships and sending the sub-junior teams to Adelaide. The Association is most grateful for this assistance.

#### SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

A number of social functions were held throughout the year, the highlight being the Australian Championships Presentation Dinner Dance at the Chevron Hotel.

The end of year Christmas Party was held at the Mandarin Restaurant and was well supported. Mr. Barry Brown is to be congratulated on his meticulous organisation of these functions.

#### THANKS

The thanks of this Association is extended to all the people, firms and organisations who have assisted us in so many ways throughout the year.

In particular, I would like to thank the Aquatic Club and Canterbury—Hurlstone Park R.S.L. Club for providing rooms for council meetings, and to the N.S.W. Table Tennis Centre for their co-operation with tournaments, competitions and training sessions.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to Assistant Secretary, Mrs. Barbara Gebauer for her untiring help, and to the other members of Council for their excellent work throughout the year.
