The ATTA embarked on a National Registration Scheme this year and as with all new things they bring new challenges and not without some problems, we have now sorted out our registration problems with the new system and you will find that the system from the start of next year will be very smooth. The National Ranking system should be up and running by the start of next year as well. Watch for the new format for Australian Championships which will be held in September each year and will include Junior, Youth, Senior and Club Teams starting from 1994.

So you can see that not only have we been busy but also the ATTA and they have also given us extra to do this year which has made us busier.

This coming year will be even busier, our executive have met and laid plans for great change for NSW which are fully supported by the ATTA, while the way we have done things in the past may have served us well in the past, it is taking us nowhere at the moment, most of our budget is spent on administration and very little on development, we must reverse this trend, if we spend on development in particularly in the schools then our numbers will increase, we will then have increased revenue and numbers that will require administration, it seems simple but let me assure you it will take 5 years to reverse the trend and it means being able to fund a full time Development Officer.

In closing I wish to thank all of you that gave of your valuable time and yes Money this year in aid of our sport, without you it would not have been possible.

ANNUAL REPORT

The Fifty-Seventh Annual Report of the NSWTTA Inc., to be presented to Member Associations at the 1993 Annual General Meeting to be held on Sunday, 27th June, commencing 3.00pm, at Leichhardt Table Tennis Club, Marlborough Street, LEICHHARDT.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

For the second year in succession, NSW did not host any National or International events.

We participated in the Australian Senior Championships in Hobart, entering Men and Womens teams, the Junior Championships in Mackay, with Boys teams in Under 17 and Under 15 sections and an Under 15 Girls Teams, and in the Australian Veterans Championships in Canberra, with Men and Womens teams in all Age Divisions, Over 40, Over 50, Over 60, Over 70.

The State Association also conducted Open and Closed Championships for Senior, Junior, Veterans and Grade Players and all events were well patronised.

Results or a Summary, of all National and State Championships are listed in Appendix "A".

ATTA Registration Scheme

On January 1st, 1993, the ATTA introduced a new Players Registration Scheme which incorporated players in all States. A brief summary of this Scheme is that it is based on a three-tier system:

- AAA For players and officials who wish to participate at International or National Level, or open events in Championships within the State.
- AA Players and officials who compete in State events other than Open Grades - inter-Association or inter-Club matches.
- A School players and players who wish to maintain membership category but who do not wish, or have the right, to play in any International, National, State, Regional, Local or Club competitions.

The costs are higher for AAA registered players than the AA Category, with only a nominal fee charged for A Category players.

Naturally, benefits are far greater for the highest Category and are scaled down.

This scheme seems to have been generally well accepted in NSW.

Consumer Affairs

As you may be aware, the NSWTTA is an incorporated body registered under the Associations Incorporation Act. This entails far greater responsibilities on our Executive members and more especially, our Public Officer, as the Act demands strict attention to a defined time schedule for registering our annual financial statements and other matters, such as changes to our Constitution. The Public Officer of the Association is Mr. P. Males.

A condition of incorporation is that the Association has a Public Liability Cover and our cover amounts to \$2M. Affiliated Associations can be covered under this Policy and should advise our Office if they require this cover.

Legal Officer

The Association's Legal Officer is Mr.J. Menczel, of the Law Firm of Rishworth, Dodd & Menczel, and we sincerely thank Mr. Menczel for his work on our behalf.

Coaching

An active Coaching Programme for all State Squads and State Teams has been conducted by the NSW State Director of Coaching, Mr. Noel Shorter, and his coaching staff.

Emphasis was given to State Junior and Senior Squads and Teams but coaching was also extended to Under 12 and Under 14 teams, to assist with their annual match against Victoria. Our State Veterans teams also received assistance.

Schools Competition

A most successful Secondary Schools Tournament was conducted with an entry of 50 school teams. This was by far the highest number of entries we have received in the seven years we have been conducting a school teams competition. We extend our congratulations to Mrs. Gillian Hutchinson and her assistants for conducting this Championship.

The CHS also conduct a teams and individual tournament and we have provided officials to assist them organise these events.

Annual Competition NSW v Vic. - Under 14/Under 12

This yearly event was held in 1992 at the spacious Albury Indoor Stadium for both boys and girls teams.

Although Victoria was too strong, this event provides our youngsters with a taste of Interstate Table Tennis and shows them what is needed to progress up the ladder.

Umpires

A small but dedicated, group of Umpires continue to control umpiring, under the Presidency of Mr. Ian Finlay, with Mr. Maurie Poole, Secretary.

Veterans Table Tennis

One of the more active Associations in this State is the Veterans Association, who conduct regular Veteran events in various age groups and also graded events. Mr.T. Boyd is the Association's President and Mrs.J. Brown, the Secretary.

All Veterans are gearing up for major events in 1993 and 1994. The Australian Veterans Championships will be staged in NSW at the BHP Centre, Unanderra, whilst the 1994 World Veterans Championships being conducted at the Royal Exhibition Building, Melbourne, April 22nd - 27th, where up to 2000 players and supporters are expected from all parts of the World. This event will draw some of the all-time greats of the sport, such as Surbek, Jiang Ji Liang and, maybe, the three-time World Champion, Chuang Tse Tung.

World Over 80 Veterans Champion

The first ever NSW born World Champion, Dot de Low's deeds have been acknowledged in "Loop" but, again, we would like to congratulate Dot on her excellent achievement.

Retirement of Hon. Treasurer

We would like to record the retirement of our Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Jim Canavan, and thank him for his services over the last two years.

We hope to see Jim battling on in the Veterans events, as he has done up until now.

Stephen Kelen

Another Veteran to achieve World recognition is NSW resident and many years an Australian, Stephen Kelen, a Vice-Patron of our Association.

Stephen, an ex-Hungarian International, has been awarded ITTF membership of the Hall of Fame, restricted to players winning at least five Gold Medals. Stephen, a member of the great Hungarian teams of the late 1920's and 30's, won the World Mixed Doubles Championship in 1929 and 1933 and was a member of the Hungarian Swaythling Cup Team who won that event in 1929, 1930, 1931, 1933 and 1935.

1993 World Youth Championships

NSW gained representation in the 1st World Youth Championships played in Tokyo, Japan, in January, 1993, when Alwyn Altuneg was selected as a member of Australia's Womens Youth Team.

This event, contested by 28 selected teams from Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, North America and Oceania, saw some new Rules trialled, e.g., games were best 11 points, service changing after each point. In individual events, matches were best of 7 games to the quarter-finals, then best of 9.

Total prize money was US\$100,000 but, regrettably, Alwyn or any other Australian did not share this pot of gold but little wonder, when China had 1993 Olympic Womens Singles Gold Medalist, Deng Yaping, as a team member.

Oceania Zone Olympic Solidarity Course

The NSW Table Tennis Association, on behalf of the Australian Association and the Oceania Table Tennis Federation, hosted this Course at the NSW Academy of Sport, August 15-21, 1992. Nine countries were represented and the main seminars were conducted in tournament administration and coaching of coaches. Mr. Colin Clemett, Chairman of the ITTF Rules Committee, and leading English Coaches, Donald Parker and Jill Hammersley, were the principal lecturers and the Course was judged an outstanding success.

Appreciation

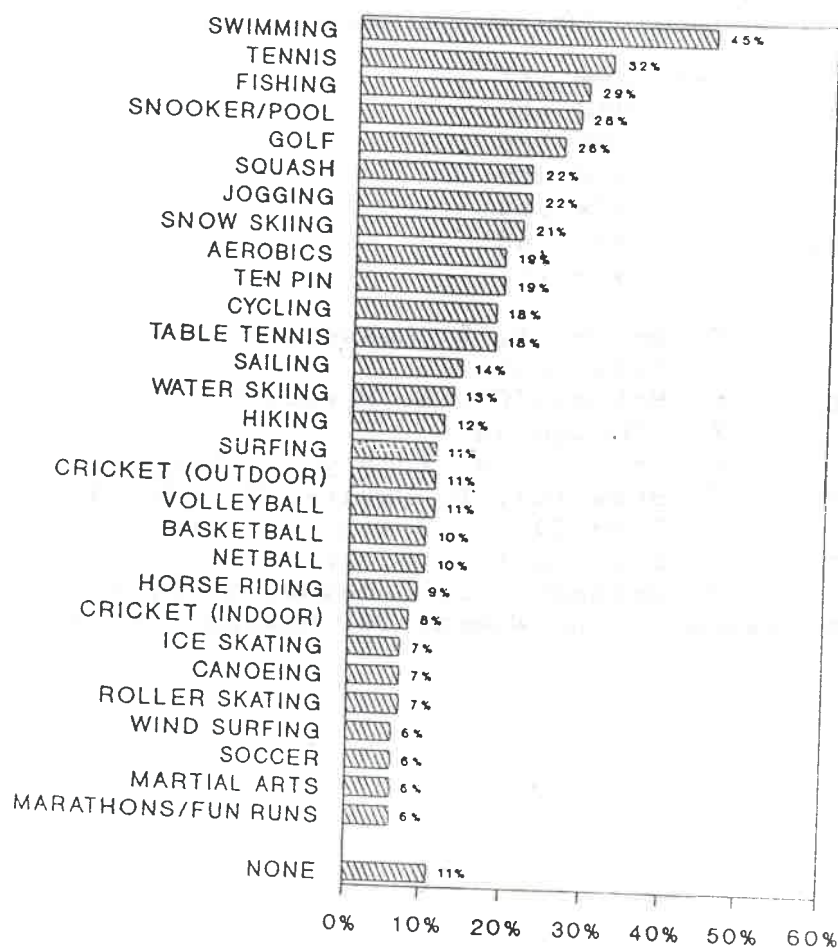
We thank our sponsors, International Table Tennis, Combined Sports Traders and Stiga for their assistance during the year.


TREASURER'S REPORT
