NEW SOUTH WALES TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATIONCHANGES TO A.T.T.A. RULES AND REGULATIONS

No. 4 The Racket. For the purpose of Law 4, note the following:

"The part of the blade nearest the handle and gripped by the fingers may be covered with cork or other materials for convenience of grip; it is to be regarded as part of the handle. Similarly, if the reverse side of the racket is never used for striking the ball, it may be of cork or any other material convenient for gripping. The definition of racket cover materials refers only to the striking surface. A stroke with the side covered with cork or any other gripping surface would, however, be illegal and result in a lost point."

No.10 A Good Service - last paragraph.

"At the moment of impact of the racket on the ball in service, the latter shall be behind the end line of the server's court or an imaginary extension thereof."

No.20 The Choice of Order of Play.

"The pair who have the right to serve the first five services in any game shall decide which partner shall do so. In the first game of a match the opposing pair shall then decide similarly which shall be the first receiver. In subsequent games the first receiver shall be established automatically to correspond with the first server as provided in Law 21."

No.21 The Order of Service

"Throughout each game, except as provided in the second paragraph, the first five services shall be delivered by the selected partner of the pair who have the right to do so and shall be received by the appropriate partner of the opposing pair. The second five services shall be delivered by the receiver of the first five services and received by the partner of the server of the first five services. The third five services shall be delivered by the partner of the server of the first five services and received by the partner of the receiver of the first five services. The fourth five services shall be delivered by the partner of the receiver of the first five services and received by the server of the first five services. The fifth five services shall be delivered by the server of the first five services. And so on, in sequence, until the end of the game or the score 20 all, when the sequence of serving and receiving shall be uninterrupted, but each player shall serve only one service in turn until the end of the game.

In a one game match, or in the deciding game of a match of more than one game when the score in games stands even, the receiving pair must alter its order of receiving when first either pair reaches the score 10.

Throughout the third game where there is no such alteration, up to the score 10 where there is such an alteration in it, and up to the score 10 in the fifth game, each partner shall receive from the opponent who served to him in the first game. Throughout the second and fourth games, and after the score 10 in the third or fifth game where such an alteration has occurred, each partner shall receive from the opponent to whom he served in the first game."

These changes came into force on the 1st January, 1966.

MICHAEL SZABADOS MEMORIAL TROPHY

State Champion Barbara Sweeney won the Trophy for 1965 for her play during the year and for the work she performed for the Association.

Two affiliated Associations held Australian Championships during 1965.

Australian Public Service Championships were held in June at the Art Gallery, Anthony Hordern & Sons and the outstanding feature was the form shown by New South Wales players who won 11 of the 15 events on the programme.

Both New South Wales Men and Women teams won and Doug. Cowell won the Men's Singles and Fay Smith the Women's Singles.

The Insurance Officers Table Tennis Championships of Australia were conducted at the Association's Headquarters during August. New South Wales were again successful with Barbara Sweeney winning three titles as well as leading the Women's team to victory.
