PRESIDENT'S REPORT

While COVID continued to create challenges for our sport, we, nevertheless, were able to deliver a largely unchanged suite of competitions and services for the financial year 2021-2022.

At the start of the year, a decision was taken by the Management Committee that TTNSW would change its approach to the business of Table Tennis management.

TTNSW would take steps to evolve from being a “Facilitator” which looked to delivering the cheapest and most convenient service, to becoming a “Manager”, in the full meaning of the word.

TTNSW agreed to review its pricing and practices, with a view to creating a profitable business which could then approach Government or Commercial Interests, in order to finally fund a “Centre of Excellence” for the sport of Table Tennis in NSW.

With that in mind, the organisation began by installing professional and paid management to begin the process of renewal and growth.

A CEO has been appointed to run the business. The position attracts a salary, and the appointee is expected to devote their time to re-framing the business.

As well, a permanent part-time position has been created, and a school specialist appointed, who's focus is on growing the grass roots of our business - school competitions.

The hope is, that as our sport will begin to permeate school sporting activities, the eventual outcome hopefully, will be a growth in local club membership, and a broader base of players which will result in new revenue streams, as well as growing our talent base.

It's early days, but initial results are promising.

As for profitability, we are looking to undertake a re-vamp of the way we price our services.

President's Report (Continued)

For too long we have offered a base rate service, which delivered fixtures, but did little for our financial position.

Here, the intention is to re-evaluate the costs of our services, and price them adequately and fairly, but with a determination to make a profit which can be applied to eventually sourcing our own Centre.

My thanks to all the volunteers that make it possible to deliver the services we do. Without them there would be no TTNSW.

Their work ethic is prodigious and admirable - Thank You.

I look forward to continuing my association with the sport, always depending on the support of the Council members.

We began 2022 with remnants of the COVID-19 Virus and related protocols still hanging around but as the year progressed, we moved more and more into the mode of “living with COVID-19”.

Our “Return to Sport” was identified by the National Authorities and was in line with the Federal Government template. I would like to thank our Tournament Committee and all our members for assisting with the continued use of the updated COVID-19 procedures and hygiene protocols to continue playing our game at the safest possible level.

We commenced our Calendar for 2022 with GPS Schools, TTA High Performance training and the Veterans Teams Challenge.

The National Championships (including the Senior, Youth, Junior and Para events) were held in Caloundra in July and the National Veterans Championships were held in Darwin in October.

The initial mandatory requirement to attend both National Championships, as set by Table Tennis Australia, was for all players, coaches, officials, parents, etc., to be fully vaccinated with proof of vaccination status to be submitted.

- Under 10s - 1 dose
- 15s and Under - 2 doses
- 16 to 64 - 2 x doses plus a booster; and
- Over 65 - 2 x doses and 2 boosters

The National Championships in Caloundra proceeded under this requirement but the vaccination mandate for the National Veterans Championship was removed by TTA as the Championships drew closer, being replaced with a strong encouragement to be fully vaccinated.

NSW achieved excellent results at both Championships; in team events as well as in individual events, resulting in many GOLD medals. Detailed results are viewable elsewhere in this Annual Report.

As in 2021, all Tournament draws were conducted as fully timed draws, mostly with singles events only. All events were timed and played to completion to ensure compliance with the “get in-play-get out” principle. For 2023 we will be continuing the use of timed draws and using two days for tournament events held at the Sports Halls, Sydney Olympic Park, as well as continuing the use of appropriate safety protocols.

The Veterans Teams Challenge Pennant days were very smoothly completed with total cooperation from the Veterans Committee and the players. All Veterans Teams Challenge matches scheduled in 2022 were completed; unlike the situation in 2021 where the competition was hampered by the various COVID lockdowns.

Secretary's Report (Continued)

In 2022 Table Tennis suffered an enormous loss. Ted Davis passed away suddenly in September whilst playing Table Tennis. Ted and Jan's work contribution in the Office over the past 20 years has been invaluable and the enormity cannot be expressed in words; a great personal loss to myself. We will continue to promote all projects and programs Ted had in place and ensure his legacy continues.

In moving forward Table Tennis NSW all of Sport Strategic Plan (NSW version) has been working well and due to the success of the grant applications we were able to continue with the initiatives in the social media area across all digital platforms. The new sub-committee worked well across all platforms: Website, Instagram, Facebook and YouTube. The Social Media Team were in action at tournaments with many cameras, taking photos and conducting several interviews. The Team released photos, videos and of-interest articles on a regular basis across several platforms. A big "Thank You" to Slawek, Dylan, Anthony and David. This is an exciting time as the younger members have taken to these new roles whilst working closely with Karen Zhang, a former NSW Junior who is on the Table Tennis Australia Board.

Most of our committee meetings during 2022 were held via Zoom. The 2023 AGM in March is tentatively scheduled as a face-to-face meeting unless conditions require the meeting to be held via Zoom. Attendance will, however, also be available via Zoom.

The Sports House renovations are still to be completed. These renovations were originally scheduled for September 2022 but will not start until sometime in 2023.

I would also like to thank our valuable Major sponsors who have come to our rescue in our time of need: Grants - NSW Office of Sport NSW and Table Tennis World, providing immediately on request, essential equipment necessary to continue safely in our sport. We have also secured a new sponsor in 2022 - ACY Securities as our Junior Sponsor - on a 2-year agreement. A special thanks to Ted Davis and Michael Li for securing the ACY Securities sponsorship.

TABLE TENNIS AUSTRALIA - 2022 REPORT

2022 will go down as arguably one of TTA's greatest ever years, especially in relation to high performance and international results.

It's important to look back and reflect on some of the achievements throughout the year. Highlights from 2022 include, but are not limited to:

HIGH PERFORMANCE AND PATHWAYS:

- Our best ever Commonwealth Games results were achieved, winning 1 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals, plus 2 x 4th place results.
- Our best ever World Para Championships results were achieved, winning 2 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze medals, plus 1 x 4th place result.
- Our best ever World Youth Championships results were achieved, winning 1 silver and 1 bronze medal, plus 2 quarter final results. This was the first time we have ever won medals at the World Youth Championships in the 20-year history of the event.
- Our best ever ITTF-Oceania Championships results were achieved, winning 28 out of 28 gold medals on offer and 67 medals in total. These are the best ever results by any country in the 44-year history of the event.
- Australian athletes competed in a record 33 international events throughout the year, winning a record 125 medals.
- 5 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 100 world rankings (senior), including Yangzi Liu (WR31 in Women's) and Nicholas Lum (WR42 in Men's) achieving the best ever world rankings by Australian athletes.
- 5 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 10 world rankings (para), including Qian Yang finishing 2022 ranked as number 1 in the world (Class 10 Women's).
- During the year, Nicholas Lum was the first ever Australian to reach number 1 in the world rankings in able-bodied (Under 17 Boys').
- National Squad training continued to go from strength to strength, with record training hours continuing to be offered in Melbourne and Sydney.
- Hopes Programs and Talent ID initiatives were held in 7 States/Territories, attracting more than 230 participants and served as an important vehicle in providing opportunities for all parts of the high performance pathway.
- The Para Pathways Program was rolled out across 12 centres in 7 States/Territories, delivering 150 new participants; plus the first ever National Para Pathway Camp was conducted with 9 new Para Pathway athletes.
- 14 new para athletes were classified ahead of the 2022 National Championships and the new provisional classification process was also successfully rolled out across all States/Territories.
- Player of the Year Awards went to: Yangzi Liu (Senior - Victor Barna Memorial Trophy), Qian Yang (Para - Arthur Wilks Award), Nicholas Lum (Junior - Michael Szabados Award), and Craig Campbell (Veterans - Ken Cole Trophy).

PARTICIPATION AND DEVELOPMENT:

- The TTA Equipment and Facilities Grant Program was successfully rolled out for a fifth consecutive year. 15 clubs/associations from 7 States/Territories received grants, which resulted in more than \$95,000 worth of equipment and facilities being injected into the table tennis community, including Terrey Hills Table Tennis Club and Willoughby Table Tennis Club. Cumulatively across the five years of the program to date, more than \$440,000 worth of equipment and facilities have been distributed to 69 clubs/associations across all 8 States/Territories.
- 12 outstanding contributors to the sport were honoured through the National Volunteer and Coaches Awards Program, including Joseph Fung who was awarded the Fran Keyhoe Award as the Official of the Year. Mick Coughlan (QLD) had the honour of being awarded the Bev and Brian James Trophy as the 2022 National Volunteer of the Year.
- Membership rebounded strongly to exceed pre-COVID-19 numbers with 10,440 members being recorded through the 2022 Census.
- A new participation record was set, with the 200,000 participants mark being exceeded for the first time through the 2022 Census. This included more than 81,000 NSW participants.
- Our entry level program, Spinnerroos, continued to be rolled out at both club and school level throughout Australia.
- Our Sporting Schools program continued to be rolled out across Australia, with more than 22,000 students undertaking the program.

NATIONAL EVENTS:

- 2022 saw the return to a full calendar of national events for the first time since 2019, with 8 highly successful national events delivered across 6 States/Territories.
- The National Senior, Youth, Junior and Para Championships were combined into one all-inclusive event for the first time. The event attracted 445 competitors and nearly 1,900 individual event entries from all States/Territories.
- The National Veterans Championships attracted 310 competitors and nearly 1,200 individual event entries from all States/Territories and New Zealand.
- After a pilot event in NSW in 2021, the TTA Tour was expanded to cover 4 events in 2022 (Canberra, Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane). Overall, the event series was a roaring success, attracting nearly 600 competitors and more than 1,100 individual event entries from 7 States/Territories plus New Zealand.
- The National Hopes Week and Challenge attracted a record 76 entries from 7 States/Territories and continues to set the benchmark in terms of sourcing the next generation of players.
- The Commonwealth Games Qualification Tournament served to determine the final men's and women's places on the 2022 Commonwealth Games team and provided high calibre table tennis throughout.
- 7 national events were livestreamed with outstanding statistics being generated. 91,000 unique viewers and 118,000 total views watched 318,000 minutes (5,300 hours) of footage in more than 30 countries. Social media posts (Facebook) reached 482,000 people across more than 206 posts. Finally, 560,000 website hits were achieved.

GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE:

- The 2019-2022 TTA Strategic Plan came to an end, with significant and sustainable progress being made across all elements of the plan. A summary of all achievements can be viewed by clicking here: <https://www.tabletennis.org.au/news/tta-2019-2022-strategic-plan/>.
- The 2023-2025 TTA Strategic Plan was finalised and is now ready to be rolled out over the next three years. TTA is working with all States/Territories to ensure that State/Territory Strategic Plans align with TTA's, but maintain a localised focus where beneficial. This will ensure that a unified strategic direction will be in place across the sport for the next 3 years, which will underpin collaboration across the sport.
- 2021-2022 MOUs that TTA entered into with TTACT, TTNSW, TTNT, TTT and TTWA concluded. TTA is hopeful to enter into MOUs with all States/Territories for the 2023-2025 period to further strengthen collaboration between TTA and States/Territories.
- A fifth consecutive surplus was delivered and the TTA Cash Reserves Target of \$575,000 has been met by the end of 2022. The 2022 financial result underlines the financial reforms implemented in recent years and demonstrates that TTA's business model continues to be robust.
- Importantly, with the TTA Cash Reserves target being met, it is anticipated that the need to generate surplus results will diminish, meaning more resources can be put into further developing the sport.

RECOGNITION INITIATIVES:

- Five players made their international debut (Able-Bodied) and were recognised as Official Australian Representatives. Congratulations to Min Hyung Jee, Yangzi Liu, Nicholas Lum, Finn Luu and Alex Lee. The Official Australian Representative tallies now sit at 78 (Able-Bodied Men), 70 (Able-Bodied Women), 73 (Para Men) and 31 (Para Women).
- Two icons of Australian table tennis were inducted into the TTA Hall of Fame: Russell Lavale (Athletes - Open) and Noel Shorter (Coaches). Congratulations Russell and Noel, you're most worthy inductees.

Delivering results of this nature requires the help and support of a broad network of people and organisations and it is important to thank those who have contributed along the way.

Sincere thanks go to all funding partners and peak bodies, namely the Australian Sports Commission and the AIS, Commonwealth Games Australia, Australian Olympic Committee, Paralympics Australia, ITTF and ITTF-Oceania. TTA enjoys a positive working relationship with all parties and looks forward to this continuing in 2023 and beyond.

Thank you also to all TTA's commercial partners. In particular our long-term partners Nittaku and DHS, plus Table Tennis World through the backing of Paul Pinkewich, plus all others who supported TTA throughout the year.

Of course, special thanks must go to all players and also the parents of junior players. We run the sport to provide opportunities for people to play, and the sport would not function without you playing from the highest level, right through to grass roots level.

Thank you also to State/Territory Associations for working collaboratively for the betterment of the sport once again in 2022. The work that all parties have put into strengthening relationships between National and State/Territory level in recent years has undoubtedly been beneficial for the health of the sport overall. It is clear the underlying theme is a willingness to help each other maximise the finite resources available across Australian table tennis and the increased sense of unity is appreciated by TTA.

The work at club/association and State/Territory level, by volunteers and staff, to grow participation and deliver local competitions and activities is the bedrock of the sport - thank you, we couldn't progress without you.

High praise is deserved by all TTA staff, who once again performed with distinction. TTA are fortunate to have staff who are both extremely dedicated and exceptionally capable. They always focus on the job at hand to service stakeholders and maximise finite resources. The passion, work ethic and commitment of the TTA staff is both acknowledged and appreciated.

Special mention goes to everyone who serves on TTA Board Sub-Committees. It is not lost on TTA that you all volunteer your time to help the sport you love and, in some instances, this can be a thankless task. However, I express my sincere thanks for your ongoing contribution.

Finally, the TTA Board must be recognised. Advancing Australian table tennis remained firmly at the forefront of all decision making and the Board continued to function effectively and efficiently in a cohesive manner. The Board-CEO relationship is pivotal to the success of any organisation and the mutual trust and the ongoing strong working relationship is an essential element of TTA's strength.

Thank you once again to everyone for your contribution to our great game throughout 2022. Here's to another successful year in 2023.

SCHOOLS REPORT

After coming out of COVID schools returned to some sort of normal but were greatly impacted by staff shortages that restricted the willingness or capability to engage in extra curriculum activity.

SCHOOL KIT

After the initial development of a school kit that includes 15 retractable nets, 30 bats and 50 balls, the kit was trialed for feedback from primary and secondary teachers. During term 2 a final model of implementation was developed. Schools would be given the kit to “have a go” for 3 weeks. A try before you buy model. The TOPS Manual was also provided as lessons for teachers to use. If the school wished to purchase they would keep the kit, if not the kit was moved onto another school. A school promotional email was also developed to distribute to various schools’ sport organisers and to school sport associations. The model was also presented at district school sports meetings, and at our school events. It has proven successful with a number of schools buying kits to implement programs that include class-based activities, as part of school sport or lunchtime programs.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

A shortened version of the Level 1 course was developed. It is a 90-minute practical session based on the TOPS Manual and delivered by Level 1 coaches. Three schools (20 teachers) participated and the feedback was very positive.

SCHOOL EVENTS

Primary and secondary school events as per previous years were again held this year with participation numbers remaining the same with some increases.

Two new events were added:

- The Sydney Secondary Catholic school event with 300 students participating in a gala day/competition. A great day. This will be expanded next year to include 4 district events in term 2 and a finals day in term 3. Expected participation numbers are 500 students. This model can now be used for other catholic school sport areas in both primary and secondary. The head of Catholic School sport has agreed to help implement in 2023.
- Independent Christian Sport Association also held a day in term with 100 students and the feedback for the head of school sport was very positive and they have booked an event for 2023.

Schools Report (Continued)

HYUNDAI

A meeting was held with Hyundai and attended by John Alexander with the hope of continuing and expanding their sponsorship in 2023. This would have a significant impact of the success of the school program. 6 schools participated in the Bennelong Cup. This needs to be increased in 2023.

CLONTARF (INDIGENOUS)

All Clontarf Secondary School Academies are involved in table tennis activities. There are currently 32 in NSW with the possibility of more in the future. Plans are being discussed to hold an event that all 32 schools could participate in during 2023.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM 2023

In partnership with the Sydney Catholic School Sport school holiday programs will be conducted each school holiday period in 2023. They will promote and co-ordinate as well as provide some staff. TT NSW will need to supply two coaches. Venues, costs and dates are to be determined. It is anticipated that 50 students will attend each day.

NSW SCHOOL SPORT UNIT

After discussions with the head of Strategic Planning Table Tennis will be added to the teachers' resource section on their website that caters for teachers looking for new programs to implement.

SPORTS HIGH SCHOOLS

There are 6 secondary schools that have specific programs that caters for talented sport students. A presentation was made at their term 4 meeting. They will discuss how we might implement programs to their curriculum and hold an event in 2023.

Overall, an additional 3,000 students participated in activities in 2022.

The goal for 2023 is to have a minimum 12,000 participate.

VETERANS REPORT

After a tough couple of years of Veterans Table Tennis, it has been a relief to enjoy a generally uneventful year of playing our sport in 2022. Thanks to all players who followed COVID safe procedures and ensured the whole competition proceeded without incident.

We were able to hold a full round of Veterans Challenge, both the NSW Veteran's Open and Closed, and the National Veterans which were held in Darwin in October. Whilst COVID did not prevent any events going ahead, we did struggle with numbers at some events due to prevalence of COVID in the community. This may still be an issue in the years to come but hopefully, if the situation remains under control, we will be able to continue to enjoy our sport without restrictions.

For NSW, the National Veteran's Championships were a great success. NSW won 9 Team medals out of a total of only 12 events on offer - 4 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze. Such outstanding results were also reflected in the Individual events, the Order of Merit awards and the Table Tennis World Best and Fairest Player awards. This year our NSW women really did us proud winning gold medals in the 0/50 and 0/70 Women's teams and a silver medal in the 0/30 Women's Teams. Amy Zhang won gold medals both in the 0/40 and 0/50 Women's Singles and Joanna Ma won gold in the 0/60 Women's Singles. Other medals are too numerous to mention but set the benchmark for an even better result in 2023 in Canberra. A complete listing of State Teams, placings and medallists are outlined elsewhere in this Annual Report.

Special thanks to our Team Managers of Peter Wood and David Clackson who kept us well informed and organised a great NSW Team dinner. Thanks also to our Selection Committee of Jennifer Aduckiewicz, Leonie Whiteford, Beverley Clackson, Cyrus Pestonji, and Ian Finlay who did a great job of putting together the Team.

Unfortunately, there was one serious issue raised with me at the Nationals. It was reported that a couple of NSW players had illegal rubber. This was dealt with fairly by the Referees but caused some embarrassment to the NSW team. This matter was raised at the NSW Veterans Committee meeting and has been followed up by TTNSW's President, Tony Aduckiewicz, who advised that there will be a strong no tolerance policy from TTNSW for anyone in the future being found using illegal rubber.

Unfortunately, we lost Ted Davis - one of the great workhorses of NSW Table Tennis, shortly before the National Veterans. This was my first year that I was Team Manager at the Nationals and Ted's passing left a big hole in our knowledge. Special thanks to David Clackson, our previous President, for stepping up to assist as co-manager this year. There is a lot organising and planning that goes into running the National Veterans Championships and I want to thank Bev and Brian James and Phil Davis for putting on such a well-coordinated event.

The loss of Ted was a shock to all of us and a great loss with regards to the management of table tennis in NSW. Ted has been the first point of contact for TTNSW for many years and has done a great deal of work to promote and organise table tennis in NSW. Fortunately, Leonie Whiteford has now stepped up into the role of CEO of TTNSW. Leonie has also done much, in a voluntary capacity, to assist in the management of table tennis. Now that Leonie has moved into this role full time, we can be happy that role extends her efforts for table tennis in NSW.

Sadly, we lost a few of our very special players in 2022. Tom Cooley who travelled the world with us to play table tennis, Ted Davis long term member of our NSW Veterans Committee and Tom Boyd OAM recipient, outstanding player, husband to Joy and patron of NSW Veterans Table Tennis. Their outstanding contributions make us what we are today.

We look forward to the new challenges and successes that 2023 will bring.

2022 Report

SOCIAL MEDIA GROWTH

In 2022, Table Tennis NSW social media platforms are starting to grow and reach the Australian table tennis community and beyond. On Youtube, we have achieved gradual growth and an aggregate of 145,396 views and 823 Subscribers.

In 2023, our Youtube Channel goal is to become a monetised Youtube Google Partner and reach more than 1000 subscribers and 40,000 watch hours.

Our Instagram Channel has reached 1176 followers and engages around 10,000 people on average each month. Our Audience is both local and global shaped by the content we post.

2022 was a year where there were a lot of surprises in store by our Australian Team. Representing both Table Tennis NSW's and Team Australia - Chulong Nie, Adi Sareen and Won Bae created history for Australia, winning the first ever World Youth Championships Medal for Australia: winning Silver in the U15 Teams Event. Liu Yangzi, Tracy Feng, Jee Min Hyung and Jian Fang Lay were also history makers and won a Team Bronze Medal at the Commonwealth Games. Liu Yangzi also garnered Australian media headlines as she won Australia's Individual Bronze Medal at the Commonwealth Games. Jian Fang Lay being a legend of the sport and most senior member of the Australia Women's Team became a hot topic in Australian media, being published across 30 major media outlets and becoming a household name among the wider community. Michelle Bromley's success and resilient fighting spirit and appearances on media and social media were fantastic highlights of 2021 and 2022.

Our events, social media promotions, post-production broadcasting and highlights videos continues to build awareness for Table Tennis talent and rising talents in NSW to the wider community.

We have seen that having an existing social media platform can foster a stronger foundation for TTNSW Juniors to be ready for National and International Events with broadcasting. By showcasing the matches, this captures the high level and intense competition that drives the players to reach newer heights. The level of play these few years is getting higher.

There have been many spectacular matches in both the Juniors and Senior ranks. We have scratched the surface with broadcasting, social media and marketing and built the platform and foundation. However, evidently there are still many areas to improve upon.

In 2023, we can examine our progress and growth and potentially create more events and opportunities for players as there is increasing interest from local and international university students and student athletes. As a former table tennis athlete, it is easy to compare Australia to Asia and Europe. We can compare the system, support, professional teams and commercial leagues of other countries as the gold standard and benchmark and get carried away. We understand the many challenges that we face and we understand that it will take time and many small steps to help the sport grow and to nurture talent and grow the market significantly. With everyone's efforts across Australia, it is even more exciting to have seen recent International success by our athletes who have come through the current Junior program.

In 2023, we aim to build up new social media channels effectively, optimise on the current social media channels and keep them growing. It will be important to run different marketing and media campaigns with grassroots, community, school and university events and veteran events. We also aim to collaborate and/or partner with different non-for profit and commercial entities for events to continue the reach and community engagement across New South Wales.

Our aim is to help showcase and develop a multicultural table tennis community that can help grow table tennis as a household name across different cultures and ethnicities. Table Tennis is truly a game and sport that can bring everyone together. In 2023, we may consider engaging and finding delegates or representatives from different cultural communities to understand their needs and how table tennis can reach their communities and also provide value to them.

2022 marks the 50th Year Anniversary of Ping Pong Diplomacy between USA, Australia and China. Such a commemoration has a legacy impact on society. We look forward to having events between China and Australia and different communities to help foster community engagement and improve community and cultural relations at a grassroots level. 2022 has seen some improvements in International Relations between Australia and China. From the angle of the Social Media Team at Table Tennis NSW, we can help create content, build platforms to facilitate cultural exchange and community growth through sport. I think it is also important to engage different Australian and Chinese businesses for the sport to create opportunities for commercial support and find sponsors.

In 2023, as China's borders open up and International Students from around the world return to Australia, we aim to build awareness of Table Tennis in NSW on cross-border social media platforms such as China's Instagram equivalent RED-Xiao Hong Shu -小红书, WeChat and also developing a Weibo presence to set up recognition within China. By engaging Chinese communities and the existing large table tennis market, we are able to foster opportunities for exchange, build impactful events and create more awareness and participation. We will also look at Twitter and all new social media platforms and content geared for specific communities e.g. Table Tennis in Japan, Germany and Europe has a significant impact on Twitter and Yahoo (Japan). e.g. Tik Tok - USA, India, South East Asia and global markets.

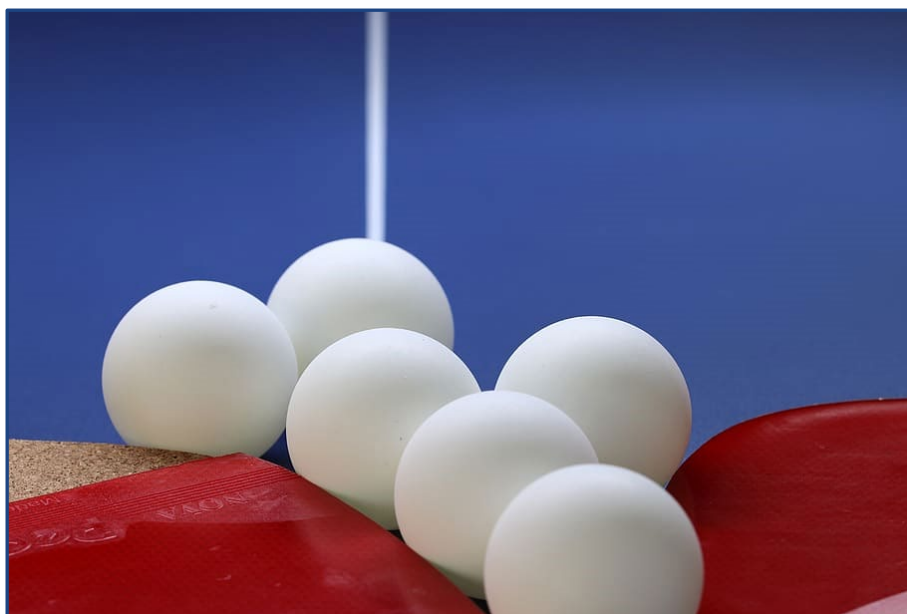
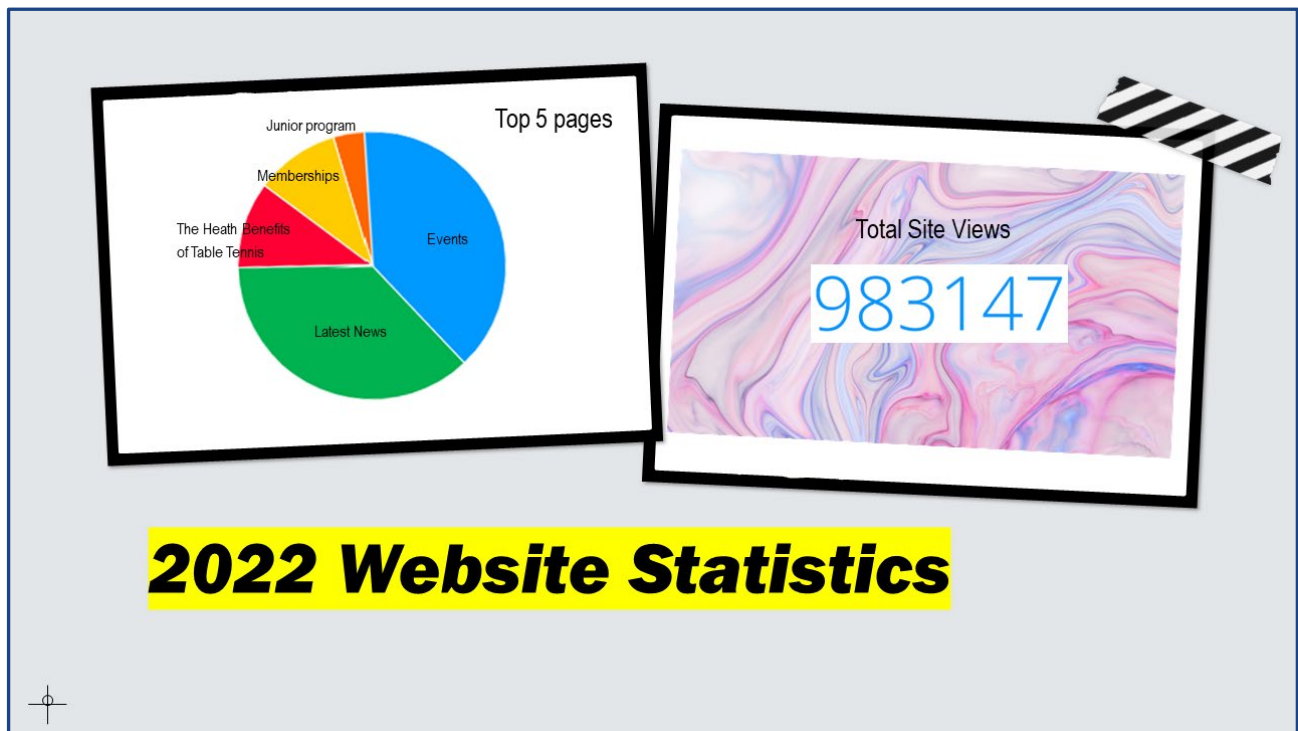
In 2023, we have been present at the Universities Orientation Weeks for UNSW, USYD, University of Technology Sydney, Macquarie University and our small team was able to get 260 new subscribers across 4 days and reach more than 2000 university students. We are currently working on content to engage the huge university student market. MARKETING REPORT

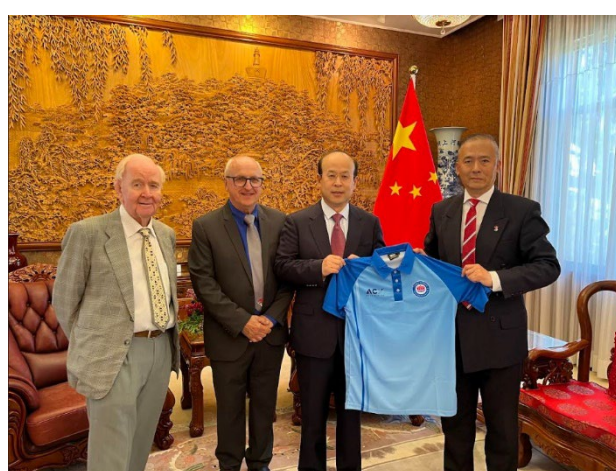
TTNSW had a great achievement in marketing and social media promotion in 2022.

- to His Excellency Ambassador Xiao Qian of the Chinese Embassy in Australia;



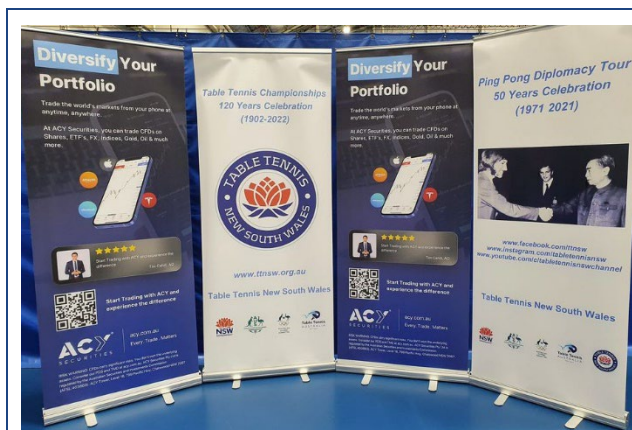
- to Mr John Coates AC, Vice President of the International Olympic Committee, and Mr Matt Carroll AM, CEO of the Australian Olympic Committee;

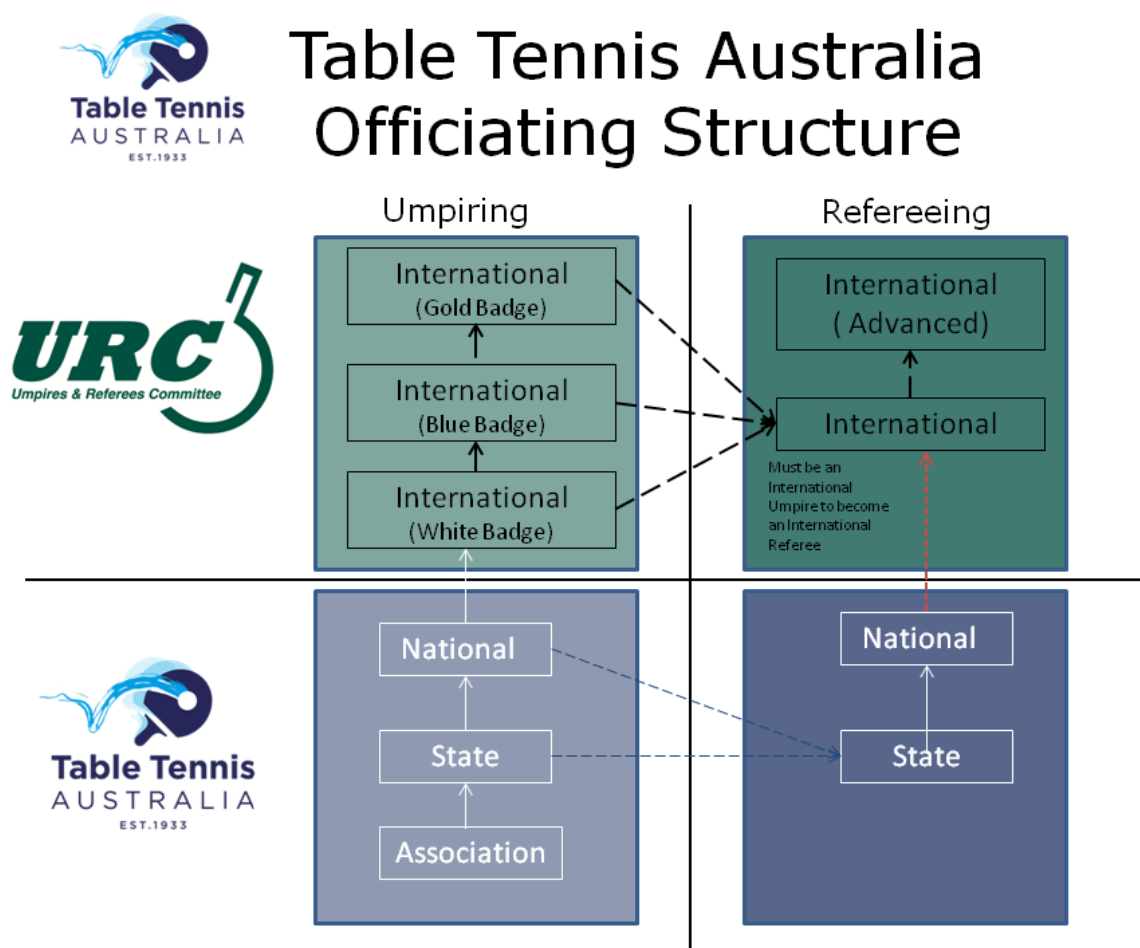

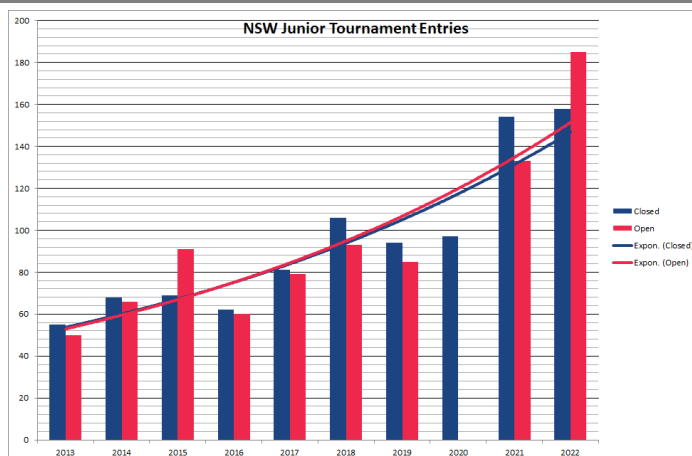
Over the page are 3 graphs showing the number of participants in TTNSW Tournaments over the last 10 years.

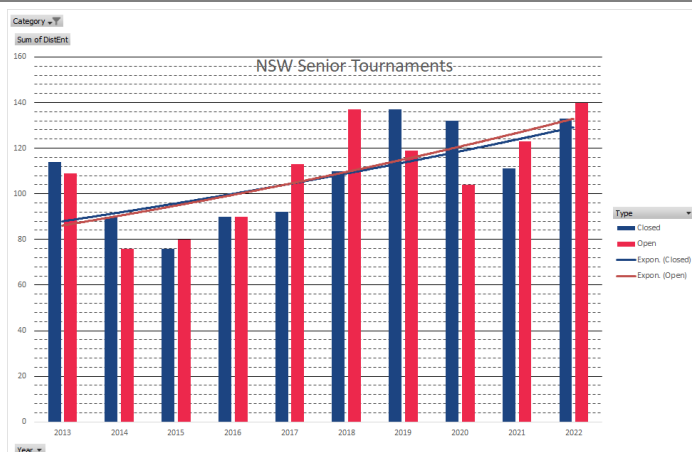

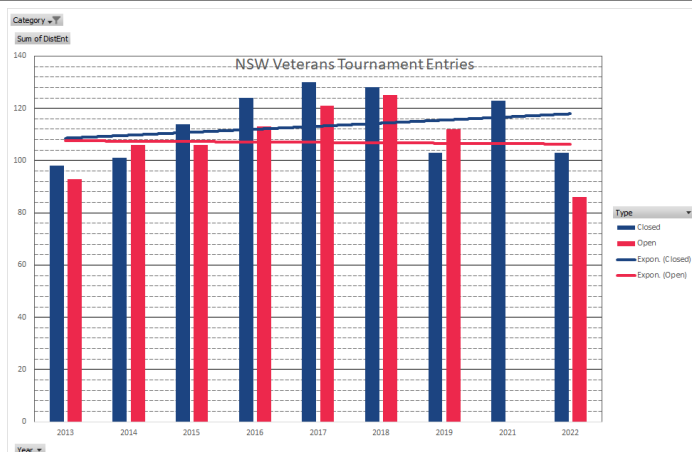
NSW Junior Tournament Entries - 2013 to 2022

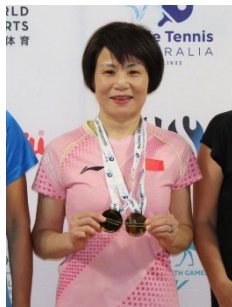

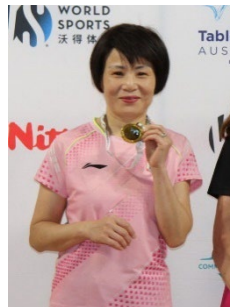

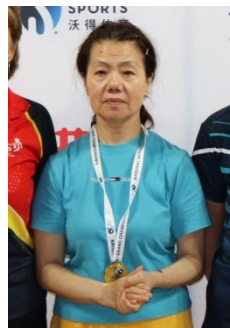
