## PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2009

At the time of the last AGM on March 7 2009, the idea of being the President of TTNSW was not on my agenda and at best, was something to be considered in several years time. As we all know, sadly, Les Walczuk, who was re-elected unopposed, passed away 48 hours after that AGM. Les had dedicated many years to the game, both as a player and an officer. He was passionate and very keen to see this organisation improve at all levels and the game develop and grow.

Following the passing of Les, there were discussions regarding a replacement, it was in this forum that I was approached and ask if I would take on the role. I admit to being hesitant due to my existing workload and commitments. However, on April 23<sup>rd</sup>, at a Council meeting I was duly nominated and elected President.

On reflection I can appreciate the pressures that Les was under. Balancing this role with professional and family responsibilities can be a heavy burden. We miss him and thank his family for allowing us to share Les with them.

### THE YEAR THAT WAS

2009 was a very busy year, we played host to two major events, the World Masters' Games followed quickly by the Australian Veterans' Tournament, both occurring in October. The preparation for these two events had been long and detailed and it is appropriate to start this report by acknowledging and thanking Leonie Whiteford, Ted Davis and Douglas Flood for their dedication and hard work that led to the successful outcome that these events were. I also extend thanks to those who served on the various sub-committees, without whom these events would not have been as successful.

Also during this year we have seen the appointment of several new Directors: Michelle Beaumont (continuing the family tradition) Guy Fainbloom and Antonio Kang. Of course they join those other stalwarts, Dave Beaumont, Phil Males, Ted Davis, Ian Finlay, Mike Turner, Amy Chen, Paul Pinkewich and Paul Zhao. To all of them, I thank you for the efforts and work you have put into making 2009 a success and helping us build the organisation for the future.

During the year we have been experimenting with new organisational structures and investigating new ideas for enhancing our administration and streamlining our systems to better serve our members and registered players. It is always difficult for a small sporting organisation to expand its activities when almost everything we do is with the use of voluntary labour. We receive little in the way of regular Government assistance; those we do get are often small tied grants for specific tasks.

It would be great for us to have a permanent presence or to have someone who could go out and visit and seek out new table tennis groups to join TTNSW. Some of these issues will be re-visited in 2010, particularly expanding the reach of TTNSW, through the use of existing contacts and part-time consultants.

## **DEVELOPMENTS**

When taking on this position I was keen to review our many processes and structure. The two major events during the year did make it difficult to complete this task. However, in 2010 we are introducing a newly designed Registered Players' Card, which will contain better information for the administration and the players concerned. The card also makes provision for bar-coding; the use of which will be introduced during this year to assist with player tracking and events registration.

We are also extending the use of the TTNSW website to allow for both on-line tournament and membership registration. This new facility will allow players to enter events with the option of either paying on-line or on the day. Players will also be able to keep track of their events as well as rankings and results.

## **THURSDAY NIGHT PENNANT**

We are revamping the Thursday Night Pennant Series to make the administration easier and also to offer players a new experience, the series will have both an individual and team component. The Individual Pennant offers the advantage of this new arrangement in that it allows us to use the shorter session prior to Easter to identify player's standards while still giving them an opportunity of financial reward.

The Teams Pennant will commence in May and because of the individual pennant, the organisers will be able to make sure teams play within their correct levels, making for a better and fairer competition.

This new format also has the added benefit of assisting the State Selectors in the task of preparing NSW Teams for national competitions.

## **MEMBERS AND PLAYERS COMMUNICATION**

We are looking at making additional improvements to the on-line information services to make communications easier. Of course, we still have our newsletter, "The Loop", which to be honest has not been issued enough during the past year or so. It gets back to the problem of most tasks being undertaken by volunteers, these tasks sound easy, but the reality can be different.

In 2010 we will be working harder to gather email and/or mobile phone numbers for as many players as possible to make the administration easier and smoother. Up to date contact details is essential if TTNSW is to become a better and more efficient organisation.

## **EXTENDING TTNSW TO SOCIAL PLAYERS**

TTNSW is planning to introduce a new level for registered players called "Social". This level will be aimed at those many hundreds of social players who have their regular hit-up at a local club, who are not interested in playing at tournament level, but who would

benefit from the player insurance policy that registration provides. It is also hoped that this new level will encourage social players to consider playing in tournaments and upgrading their levels. We are be working with Table Tennis Australia to make this new level applicable across Australia to give table tennis better representation at government levels.

## **CONSTITUTION/STRUCTURE**

There are several areas where structural or rule changes could make TTNSW a better organisation. Also, the issue of "proxy" voting which has been raised at several Annual General Meeting. The reason that no changes have been made or proposed at this time is because in 2009 the State government changed the Association Law, but as of the end of 2009 the regulations had not yet come into effect. As the new laws may require some additional amendments, and we are charged for any amendments, we felt it better to wait for the new regulation to be proclaimed before seeking any changes. Therefore, hopefully in 2010 we will be in a position to move on suggesting desired changes for decision by our members, possibly at a Special General meeting later in 2010.

## **NATIONAL TOURNAMENTS**

This year has seen TTNSW players be very successful at a number of national tournaments and championships. In the Australian Youth Championships (Melbourne) and Australian Juniors' Championship (Hobart), our teams and individuals were very successful and raised the profile of NSW in these tournaments. Our Men's Team won Gold at the Australian open Championships for the first time in 19 years. Many of the results were the best we had had for many years. NSW can be very proud of the achievements of all involved.

Obviously, it is not only the players but the State Coaches and their assistants. In this regard we also must thank all the parents and friends who give their time and money to allow our representatives to participate. Without their involvement we could not achieve the results we have.

## **2010 MAJOR EVENTS**

There is a lot activity planned for players this year. Apart from championships to be held in other States and New Zealand, there is the Commonwealth Games in India. While teams and individuals are yet to be selected, TTNSW has a good chance of having representation in the national team.

Also in June we will be host to the Australian Open, to be held at the Niagara Sports Complex near Gosford. This year was not our turn, but the last four championships have been held in Melbourne and many of our players requested we consider taking this opportunity. It would be fair to say that some Board/Council members were hesitant and concerned given our heavy schedule in 2009. The "Open" is normally not a positive financial event, however, if TTNSW wants our players to be competitive and continue their interest it is important that they get the chance from time to time, to perform in their home state.

I'm sure that the committee looking after this event will do their best to make it another success story for TTNSW.

## **TTNSW ACADEMY**

During the year we run training and coaching sessions on Tuesdays for all levels of representative players. These sessions are divided between the (NTC) National Training Squad members coached ably by Peter Ma Sen, and the State Senior, Junior and Cadets; team members coached by Paul Zhao. Both are assisted by Amy Chen and Guy Fainbloom.

Over the past year there have been changes made to the structure of the sessions and 2010 will continue to see adjustments to make these sessions better for participants and for the betterment of TTNSW as a whole.

## **NEW AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS**

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I welcome the new Affiliated Associations who have joined us in 2009. We welcome Hornsby Ku-Ring-Gai PCYC, Kempsey-MacLeay RSL Table Tennis Club and the Kiama Table Tennis Association to our ranks and look forward to working with you to further our game.

It would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the recent awarding of the Order of Australia to Dot De Low. There can be no doubt that her determination to continue playing in her 100<sup>th</sup> year is an inspiration to all.

Finally, I would again like to thank all Council and Executive members for their advice and goodwill over the past year. I believe that we will continue to develop this sport in the state and this can only be a benefit for our Affiliate members and players.

### WORLD MASTERS' GAMES & AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Organising & hosting of the World Masters' Games commenced in 2004 with the announcement that Sydney had been granted the Games for 2009. What ensued were countless meetings & negotiations:

Recruitment of volunteers

Agreement with the Sydney World Masters' Games Organising Committee on a venue

Upgrading of ALL Table Tennis NSW's existing equipment: Tables – nets – umpires tables – towel boxes – score counters & barriers

Necessary improvements at the venue (resulting in upgraded lighting at the venue - Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre)

The recruiting of expert volunteers was paramount to the success of both Championships with each of them performing their own area of expertise with the utmost precision & professionalism. I convey my personal thanks to each and every one of them.

The key to successful championships depends entirely on these volunteers who had my full support & confidence – I was asked by the Sydney World Masters' Games why so many volunteers – but as the event drew closer their answer was evident.

The venue at HALC (Hurstville Aquatic & Leisure Centre) was set – up with 28 new Tables & 225 new barriers.

For anyone fortunate enough to attend the Sydney World Masters' Games Opening Ceremony at ANZ Stadium, Sydney Olympic Park - what a truly amazing spectacular event this was. More athletes marched into the stadium than for the Sydney 2000 Olympics. The President & I were fortunate enough to be granted a VIP invitation to the Opening Ceremony – with Crown Prince Fredrick - and had amazing seats to witness the entire event.

The World Masters' Games experienced some minor delays with accreditation at Sydney Olympic Park with players waiting up to 5 hours to accredit. A testing time for both players & volunteers.

The first round of team's matches were disrupted by late arrivals still accrediting, but these problems were resolved after the first session – the Tournament Controllers did an amazing job with the late registration of players – quite a hectic first morning. The remainder of the week at the World Masters' Games proceeded quite smoothly.

The transition between the finals of the World Masters' Games and the commencement

of the Australian Veterans' Championships was on a very tight schedule – with the Finals of the World Masters' Games finishing at around 11:30 am; the Opening Ceremony & Official Team Photographs at 12:15 pm and the first round of teams matches for the Australian Veterans' Commencing at 2 pm.

The Australian Veterans' Championships were officially opened by Table Tennis NSW's patron, Minister for Sport Recreation & Gaming, Mr Kevin Greene MP - again the Tournament Controllers & Referee did an excellent job maintaining the schedule perfectly.

The week concluded with the Closing Function at Canterbury Hurlstone Park RSL Club. This club has the reputation of being one of the finest function venues in the southern hemisphere didn't disappoint. The décor was marvellous, the food excellent and the singer, Natalie Davis-Pratt, fantastic.

## COUNTRY LEAGUE REPORT - 2009

In 2009 the Country League took the bold step of moving away from the June long weekend and the teams and singles format to just a team's event held over 2 days just before the long weekend. The issue was forced upon the League when it could only get the Central Coast venue, the best table tennis venue in the State, once every four years.

A survey of players was conducted prior to the decision as it was possible to get the Central Coast venue each Easter, but that proved to be unpopular, so the Executive selected the 2-day format as the new direction.

This is not the first time the League has had to change dates. In 1963, when the new Summer Hill venue became available for the Country, the event was moved from the Easter weekend to the June long weekend. In fact, back before 1963, the Championships were known as Country Week.

The League also proposed starting matches at 8am on both days to allow teams to play 3 teams matches and finish early enough to be able to go out for a meal and on the Sunday to allow players to be on the road at an early enough time for most.

Would the change be accepted by the Country Associations? Would team entries be down? No, in fact entries were greater than the previous year at 40 and greater than in 2007 (35) when it was held there.

The Championship ran smoothly and finished at 6pm after team presentations. Table Tennis World was selected as the sponsor for 2009 Championships and provided vouchers for the winners and runners-up.

## **AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS EVALUATION -2009**

### **1) ORGANISING COMMITTEE / VOLUNTEERS**

Hosting both the 2009 World Masters' Games & the Australian Open Veterans' Championships created an enormous challenge for NSW

NSW Veterans' Table Tennis Association coordinated with Table Tennis NSW & the local association, St George & Sutherland Shire Table Tennis Association, up to 50 Volunteers were rostered on during the World Masters' Games with most being in attendance for the full two weeks.

The Tournament controllers – Brian & Bev James; Referee Ian Finlay; Assistant Reerees, Stephen Gillespie & Graham Boyton; Control Desk: Angelo Tabone assisted by Phil Males, Michael Turner & Jan Davis

### **2) VENUE**

The venue at HALC underwent some major transformation pre-event:

i) Upgrade to the existing lighting. A 2nd upgrade was required as the first upgrade was still below the requirements. The lighting upgrade was covered by Hurstville City Council.

Purchase of the door hanger to prevent the foyer admitting outside light (no doors). This expense was covered by the World Masters' Games.

The entire venue had a fresh coat of paint – even still being painted on the day we bumped-in for the World Masters'

ii) Heavy negotiation with the venue for the location of the canteen & access to the change-room facilities

iii) The venue had limited facilities and NO meeting rooms so we had to improvise and had the control area inside the playing hall and the Delegates & Managers meetings outside in the garden area

Douglas Flood was the Venue Manager for the 2 weeks of competition and did an excellent job which assisted to make these championships one of the best.

### **3) CANTEEN**

The canteen area seemed to work well – as it had a separate service area to the rest of the venue (swimming pool area) there were plenty of tables & chairs in the foyer area as well as the outside – the caterers had contacted the Perth Caterer to get an idea on numbers of people and timing of meals etc.

#### **4) EQUIPMENT**

As most of Table Tennis NSW's equipment was due for replacement – we decided to replace most of our equipment as well as utilising some of the local association's, St George & Sutherland Shire's equipment. They had also recently purchased the same equipment. We had 25 x new Xu Shao Fa tables; 3 x STAG wheelchair tables – 28 x courts all up – 170 x short & 55 taller barriers – all new umpires tables – all new flipovers & 20 x premium towel boxes & 40 x baskets. Again we were fortunate in that the World Masters' Games paid a substantial hire fee – which covered half the cost of the equipment.

#### **5) PUBLICITY & INFORMATION**

Regular bulletins were forwarded as well as placing the event on the World Veterans' website calendar. We also had a few additional entrants staying over from the World Masters' Games

#### **6) ENTRIES**

Whilst the entry was 346, it was a little disappointing not to have more entries from the overseas players competing at the World Masters' Games

#### **7) OFFICIAL PROGRAM**

With the increasing size of the event, the program also increases. This year's program was 112 pages. We used the Gold Coast size as an example which was 96 pages. We also learnt from previously conducting the championships where we had produced the program in-house using the Department of Sport & Recreation's facilities. There was a breakdown of equipment and we had to send out to an (expensive) external printer to complete. We decided to use the same printer we used for the 2007 Australian Youth Championships. Even though they are located at Lismore, they did an absolutely fantastic professional looking program at a cost which could not be bettered in Sydney.

#### **8) SCHEDULING**

Once again, Brian & Bev James did a fantastic job with scheduling considering we had very fine time constraints on the opening day of the Australian Veterans' & the finals of the World Masters' Games. With this, we decided to have the tosses for the first matches, 2pm on the Saturday, prior to the opening function. This allowed the controllers & referee to have everything ready on time for the matches to commence at 2 pm.

#### **9) ACCOMMODATION**

In Sydney there is always going to be the problem of the accommodation being away from the venue unless the event is at Sydney Olympic Park. Even then, the accommodation is quite expensive.

The Officials stayed at the Blakehurst Motor Inn which was the closest to the venue.

Some teams also stayed here with the bulk of the others staying at the Abcot Inn which is another 10 minutes away.

## 10) SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

The Opening Function at Peakhurst Bowling Club went quite well. This was located a short distance from the Venue as the playing venue had no facilities for catering for this type of function. Again due to the time constraints on the day, it was a very quick in & out.

The Championships were opened by the NSW Minister for Sport & Recreation, Racing & Gambling, Mr Kevin Greene, who is also local to the area. He was also on a very fine schedule and was also at HALC for the World Masters' Games medal presentations prior to the Veterans' Opening Function after which, he had a wedding to attend.

## CLOSING FUNCTION AT CANTERBURY HURLSTONE PARK RSL

To find a venue to cater for 300 plus is not easy, even in Sydney. Then in Sydney there is the cost.

Most venue's required a substantial hire fee for the room. As I was a member, this was waived. There was also a surcharge of \$3.50, being a Saturday night, as well as surcharges for the Bar Stewards; the AV Sound Technician as well as the DJ & the singer.

By the time you add all these figures together, you come up with a high figure per head for the night. The \$60 per head was quite conservative as the fees would have been \$17 to \$18 per head more for a plated meal rather than a buffet.

There was also no extra charge for the table & chair linen or the balloons (other function centres charged per head for this). There was a modest number of 200 in attendance and from all reports a good night was had by all.

The club has the reputation of being one of the finest function centre clubs in Sydney. Anyone who attended the function would now be aware. The food was excellent; the décor appropriate and the entertainment excellent. The dinner show by Natalie Davis-Pratt was superb and I encourage other states to provide the same form of show, as this was extremely popular. The DJ after the show was also very good. He had people on the dance floor non-stop until 1 am.

## 11) CONTROLLERS & OFFICIALS

Due to the size of the event, as well as conducting the World Masters' Games, we had quite a few officials. Brian & Bev James & Phil Males as Tournament Controllers; Angelo Tabone on the Control Desk; Ian Finlay as Referee with Stephen Gillespie & Graham Boyton as Assistant Referees. Both Stephen & Graham were locals.

The cost of the meals whilst at the venue, was quite expensive but, I cannot see any way around this. We provided meal vouchers to the value of \$15 and these added up to over \$1000 for the week for lunches.

## **12) SPORTS TRAINER / MASSEUSE**

We had lined up a local person but they withdrew from both the World Masters' and the Veterans' the week before the event. We had scouted the local Westfield's for potential Sponsors and these people were keen to come in so they had 2 people in attendance for almost all of the 2 weeks. This proved extremely popular.

## **13) OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHER**

With the very fine time line between the World Masters' Games Finals; the Veterans' Opening Function & the commencement of Veterans' matches at 2 pm, Winkipop Media did a good job in getting through all the State Team photos in an orderly manner. We also had Flash Harry at the venue – HALC – for the week taking action photos and players were able to purchase these on the spot.

## **14) MERCHANDISE**

One of Table Tennis NSW's sponsors is Table Tennis World & Paul provided the usual merchandising for both weeks - the Masters as well as the Australian Veterans'. We also had Kim's Collections providing Australiana. We produced a commemorative badge with the Table Tennis NSW logo and Sydney 2009 – but these weren't selling as hoped so, we included these in the players' bags.

Carol, Rosemary & Jennifer went to the local Westfield's to source potential sponsors and most of the local businesses agreed to give a discount to players with a voucher. These were also distributed in the players' bags. Carol, Rosemary & Jennifer did an excellent job collating the bags provided by Table Tennis World.

## **15) PLAYER NUMBERS**

These were provided by the World Masters' Games at no cost although we did need to purchase additional safety pins.

## COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT - 2009

### Appointment of Director of Coaching made in -2009

During the last three years I have suggested to the Board of Directors, Secretary and the former NSW President a Coaching Structure for NSW to be possibly carried out and implemented. This Proposed Coaching Structure was approved by Boards members in 2007 but the Proposed Coaching structure has been partially implemented; we need time to build these coaching structure.

The proposed Coaching Structure is outlined later in my report.

The training system is designed to work with the National Training Centres for a high performance program.

Our Common Aims-Key focus areas are development, participation and competition.

The structure creates a bottom up, pyramid-like approach to the table tennis sport and enables the NSW State to concentrate its efforts on developing the foundation for future growth, up to the elite level of national and international standard.

In developing the Coaching Structure, we need to ensure the Coaching Committee can cooperate with all coaches in various junior/senior/youth/veteran/AWD team, and can amicably work together and develop their teamwork skills into our table tennis sport and create opportunities for players at all levels complementing the proposed high performance program.

In 2009, the training sessions were conducted at the Indoor Sport Halls, Olympic Park, Homebush on Tuesday evenings, Saturdays and Sundays, a total of 30 sessions covering 98 hours. We had about 1108 participated players. Every session we had about 25-50 players (including National Training Centre and New South Wales State players) attending the training session.

In 2009, the New Board has made a new decision about the training sessions. The coaching arrangements were allocated to different coaches: From the Beginning of the year, Peter Masen was responsible for only seven(7) players in the National Training centre(NTC) for High Performance group program . I had discussed with Peter Masen that New South Wales Senior squad (Justin Han, Namho Oh, Chenxing Li, George Tang, Vivian Tan, Chermaine Chen) should joined the National Training Centre, combined training on every Tuesday Night at Indoor sport Halls, Olympic Park, Homebush. The reason for joining is for the quality training. From my view, It is a good development training direction for the benefit of New South Wales Table Tennis 's future. We can see the results from various competitions events in the year of 2009 NSW have achieved very good results for example as highlight below :

2009 The Australian Open Youth -Under 21 Justin Han won a Gold Medal in Singles, and I also want to mention the best part when ChenXing Li beat Kyle Davies (Victorian player, Australian ranked no.3 player)

The most memorable events -in 2009 Australian Open Men team, our New South Wales team defeated Victoria to win the competition for the first time in 19 years. Justin Han in the Mens team won 3 games, Namho won 2 games in the final where New South Wales beat Victoria 5:3;

2009 Australian Open –Men Singles Justin Han runner up, Chenxing Li -3<sup>rd</sup> place.

In 2009 Australian Closed-Men Singles Justin Han -3<sup>rd</sup> place and Women Singles Vivian Tan- runner up.

The best part in 2009 Australian Closed –Men Singles George Tang beat Willian Henzell (Australia ranked No.1) in 3:2 ,no Australian had beaten William Henzell for the past 5/6 years.

2009 Australian Open Junior Under 13 Boys New South Wales team (Erny Tsao and Abraham Ng) won Gold .

Individual events Boys Singles events Erny Tsao won Gold ,Abraham Ng -3<sup>rd</sup> place .

2009 Australian Open Junior Under 15 Boys New South Wales team also won Gold. (Danny Rauv).

All these above players are not National Training Centre players, but they trained together with National Training Centre players

NTC Squad also had additional training session at the Marouba Training centre on Sunday mornings from 10am-1pm.

Some players also had training in Hornsby PCYC with myself (Paul Zhao) Sunday afternoon. My task is to ensure “specific training” for some of these players. The training schedule was from February 2009 to present until December 2009. The training sessions had included various technical skills and competition tactics. The training programs were specifically designed and tailored individually in order to improve 80% of their overall skills. If sufficient times are allowed, their overall improvement will increase to 90%.

In 2008, it was proposed to review all the selected players in the NSW State Squads for their regular attendance at training programs. In order for the players to maintain their NSW State Squads status, they must attend a minimum of 80% of the designated training sessions and have the right attitude and discipline towards regular training. In 2008, we found that some NSW junior squad players were not disciplined enough to attend the regular training but we had selected these players to represent NSW State team for Australian Junior Open Championship. In contrast, a lot of sub-junior players and junior players had attended 85% regular training with good discipline and attitude were not given a chance to be selected to represent NSW State team to compete in the Australian Junior Open Championship. In 2009 I had suggested the order to be selected in the NSW State team, players would be examined on 3 main criteria: firstly, results from NSW Junior Closed, secondly results from NSW Open Championships and thirdly their 80% regular attendance training session and also good discipline and attitude from player . Based on these three criteria, I believe that all the players can have a fair opportunity for selection into the NSW State team for Australian Junior Open Championship. In 2009, NSW selection committee had laid down compulsory requirements before the Championships, that players must participate in 2 out of 3 tournaments, 2<sup>nd</sup> August –Youth Open,

23<sup>rd</sup> August- Teams Challenge, or 30<sup>th</sup> August- Metropolitan Open; and attending Team Training Sessions on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 5<sup>th</sup> September, 13<sup>th</sup> September. However, only some players selected had reached 80 % attendance training in Homebush, some players had not even reached 50%. My record on compulsory attendance requirements before the Australian Junior Championship in Hobart on 27<sup>th</sup> Sept- 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2009 on team training sessions is recorded below:

I will also like to mention about the Championships. In my point of view, the Boards should set some rules regarding players who will be in or are in the Australian National Competition Championship Teams should have high attendance records in percentage in training sessions. It is easier to maintain management in Squads and all players and to cover the rental of the Hall in Homebush State Indoor Centre. (Note: not including country players- for 60% to 80 % attendance in training session).

- groom potential Junior players for State Senior or Youth Squads

#### **Senior/Youth Coaching Team**

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experience Level 2 & Level 3 coaches to train State Senior and Youth Squads. The purposes are to:

- consolidate their technical skills
- improve their skills in ball spins, speed, power and quality
- improve their tournament specific skills and tactics
- improve their physical, mental and psychological power
- improve their combined techniques, tactics and mind use in competitions
- groom potential Senior & Youth players for National Training Centre

The team consists of around 3 to 5 experience Level 2 & Level 3 Coaches to train Veteran Squad. The purposes are to:



## SCHOOLS REPORT 2009

### PRIMARY SCHOOLS:

The top 3 teams in the Junior Division - Gymea North 1, Harry Roberts and Mitchell Gilmore. Murray Farm 1: Joshua Stammering and Andrew Wu and Carlingford West 1: Hortin Zeng and Jack Chen played off in a Round Robin with Murray Farm 1 being the winners. Andrew Wu was the outstanding player.

The Juniors semi-finals were between Yagoona Public 1: Bernard Nkomba and Ghassen Khulbuf. Epping Heights 1: Bob and Mike Liang: Yagoona Public 2: Brendan Troung and An Van Hoang and Murray Farms 3: Jane Bi and Celia Kan.
