PRESIDENT'S REPORT

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

After now completing three and a half years' service in my present position as President of your Association, I feel that I am entitled to look back and reflect on the progress of table tennis in N.S.W. during my term in office.

There have been some noticeable achievements and some continuing disappointments which are yet to be rectified. Any successful organisation must have firm foundations and there has been an obvious need for the Association to work in this direction. On the credit side we have now on Council a sprinkling of businessmen whose background is such that we have the necessary people required to be the backbone of the major steps which have yet to be finally taken. We are closer than ever before to fulfilling a great void by having our own premises. In our possession at this time we have eleven architectural designs of sporting complexes together with some scale models, and the prospect of available land in a suitable area. Obtaining finance is the final stage in this programme and will be the immediate target of our building committee in the early part of 1974.

Our status on an international level has never been brighter and we are entertaining overseas teams and presenting international matches at a level higher than had previously been the case. Our relationship with Government officials and sponsors has never been better and we can look forward to continuing support from these quarters in the years ahead.

The number of affiliated associations has increased by eleven during this time and the number of registered members by one hundred per cent.

We are now in a position to employ a full time coach for the State of N.S.W. and applications are pouring in from overseas. We will announce a final decision as to who is the successful applicant early in 1974.

On the debit side our playing standards have slipped dramatically and there seems to be an obvious gap in the relationship of officials and players. I also personally believe that there are self interested factions within the playing side which are hindering this relationship and having far too great a control over the game. This will be rectified as soon as we have our own premises ensuring complete autonamous control. In the meantime we hope to start an almost immediate programme of playing standard improvement by the importation of at least one international player/coach from overseas.

In conclusion, may I thank my hard working council members for their efforts during 1973. While some people expend more time than others and accordingly are capable of achieving better results, I am mindful that each one of you acts in an amateur capacity, receiving little reward other than self satisfaction, and that every minute expended is for the betterment of the game. May I extend to you and to the players and affiliated associations of N.S.W. my best wishes for the year 1974.

The thirty-eighth Annual Report, to be presented to Members at the Annual General Meeting, to be held at the A.M.P. Society, on Wednesday, 20th February, 1974.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

This, the Thirty-Eighth Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the vear 1973.

The Association again had a busy year which was highlighted by the visit to Australia

by a team from Japan.

We were fortunate enough to obtain the new Bankstown Town Hall for the visitors' first match in Sydney. It was an international tournament which was held during the Council's opening celebrations. Our thanks to all the officials for all hard work and many sleepless nights put into the preparation for this match, which was held on Tuesday, 17th July, 1973.

The New South Wales team was represented by: Men — P. Pinkewich and D. Lee Mun Chew; and Women — F. Smith and A. McMahon (S. Aust.).

The finals resulted in wins for Japan in both events. In the men, Toshaiki Furakawa beat Paul Pinkewich 17-16, after a most entertaining match, featured by impossible retrieving by the Japanese star against Paul's consistent hitting. Pinkewich, earlier in the evening, had beaten Japan's No. 2 player, Keitano Sugimoto 2-1, 17-7 — 18. Their women were far too strong and experienced for our women.

AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS:

In these events, N.S.W. players again were lacking in form. Only P. Pinkewich reached the semi-finals of the Men's Singles, losing to the eventual winner, S. Knapp, of Victoria, in 3 games. Pinkewich reached the final of the Men's Doubles with R. Tuckett (Vic.), losing to W. Mannett - S. Knapp (Vic.), 3 games to 1.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD:

This year's winner of the Victor Barna Award was Bob Tuckett, from Victoria.

AUSTRALIAN SUB-JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS:

These events were held in Perth during May, 1973. N.S.W. retained the Under 16 Boys Team Trophy, while the Under 14 Boys lost the final to Victoria. Our girls failed to win a

game in any event.

In the Individual Events, Philip Gebauer reached the final of the Under 16 Singles, eventually losing to R. Javor (Vic.), who also beat G. Townsend in the semi. Gebauer and Townsend reached the final of the Under 16 Doubles, losing to R. Javor and T. Evans, of Victoria.

NEW SOUTH WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Paul Pinkewich again retained his Men's Singles, for the third successive time, Mixed Doubles with Joy Brown, and adding the Men's Doubles with Philip Gebauer. In the Singles he defeated his fellow team mate and also three times winner, David Lee Mun Chew, in a most entertaining five set match, after defeating Richard Lassen and Philip Gebauer in earlier rounds. David had beaten Martin Stern and George Livesey to reach the final.

Paul and Joy won the Mixed Doubles for the fifth consecutive year, defeating the scratch pair of Philip Gebauer and Fay Smith. Paul also paired with Philip to win the Men's Doubles from Rod Sutherland and David Lee Mun Chew (his previous partner).

Joy Brown regained her Women's Singles title, beating her old foe, Fay Smith, in the

final. This is the fourth final between these two, with the score standing at 2 all.

Congratulations are extended to the winners and runners-up in all these Championships.

The match was played before a capacity house and was a huge success, the crowd often applauding spectacular rallies. Japan ran out winners by 6-1, our only win coming in the Doubles, which was won by Pinkewich and Tuckett.
