

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER'S REPORT

Members, it gives me pleasure to present my seventh report as Administration Officer (Part Time 3 days a week) for Table Tennis NSW Inc. The year 2002 was another busy and interesting one, which this report should demonstrate.

Tournaments

I am pleased that the members decided to elect a Director to be responsible for the conduct of tournaments. I have received glowing reports from the members for the efficient and professional way Steven Lee conducted them in 2002. He has set a high standard for others to follow.

General Administration

In last years report I detailed four areas of concern identified at the "Table Tennis Beyond 2000 Workshop", namely Finance and Marketing

Facilities
Participation
Constitution and Governance

It is pleasing that the Directors have continued to pay heed to the need for change in these four areas. Leigh Roden was appointed Marketing Director. His specialty in the area of marketing was of great benefit to Table Tennis NSW. The Directors continue to investigate various options regarding the acquisition of a suitable Table Tennis facility. One only has to read the Financial Report to see the vast amount of funds outlaid in the hire of facilities for various NSW Championship. The appointment of a Tournament Director has had a positive impact on tournaments, however more needs to be done to increase the numbers involved in the various Club/Associations weekly pennant competitions.

Where to play Table Tennis guide

This again has proved to be a valuable tool in the daily operation of the office. Over the course of a year I refer hundreds of inquires from the public as to where they can play Table Tennis to the nearest Club/Association. It is the duty of each Club/Association contact person to encourage all potential new members. Don't fall into the trap of feeling comfortable with current membership numbers of your club. There is a constant need to grow.

Bad Debts

It appears that bad debts continue as a result of non payment of all fees associated with selection in NSW Teams at National Championships by some members. Directors may have to take a stronger stand against members who have not made full payment prior to the departure for Australian Championships or this worrying trend will continue.

Equipment Sales

Once again the sale of Table Tennis equipment has been an important part of my duty. We receive funding from NSW Sport & Recreation for this project. It provides a service to all members, particularly those residing in country areas and a small profit for Table Tennis NSW (see Finance Report).

Registrations

There has been an increase of 114 Registered Members from the year 2001. Which is a good sign. Newly affiliated Cabarita Beach Club contributed forty-seven of them.

Congratulations to the following Clubs/Associations who have had good increases in their membership.

Berrima District Table Tennis Association 950% increase.

Bathurst District Table Tennis Association 108% increase.

Wah Sing Table Tennis Academy 36% increase.

Western Sydney Table Tennis Association 32% increase.

Illawarra District Table Tennis Association 28% increase.

Nepean District Table Tennis Association 20% increase.

While some other Clubs/Associations unfortunately recorder a negative result which will have to be addressed by their Office Bearers.

Member should be mindful of one of the benefit associated with a larger number of registered members is the financial burden will be smaller because it is shared by a larger number.

Loop

Three editions of LOOP were distributed in April, June and November in 2002 and posted to members. Most of the articles have been posted on our Web-site for members of the public to access. Once again I would like to thank all of the people who submitted articles for publication, they made interesting and informative reading. Thank you to our advertisers, I hope that you received value for money.

NSW Sport & Recreation Involvement

NSW Sport & Recreation continue to be our main source of income. With out which this Association could not continue to provide the many services it does to Its members and the sport in general. We are now in the second year of our three-year business plan. Table Tennis NSW received \$20,000.00 for 2002. Leonie Whiteford and I had informal discussions with Wendy Gillett NSW Sport & Recreation Director Industry and Partnerships, at the launch of "It's Your Business Scheme" asking how Table Tennis NSW could receive more funding in the future. We were advised that funding was linked to growth in membership. Every effort will have to be made to convert social players into registered members.

The Country Athlete Scheme applications continue to be negotiated directly with the Department and the parent. My only involvement apart from the distribution of the Application Forms is to verify membership currency and have the Junior Selectors prioritise the applicants. Eight of our Junior Members were successful in 2002 sharing \$3,640.00.

In addition to free access to the Internet and E-mail, NSW Sport & Recreation provide free office accommodation at Sports House and access to photo copying equipment. This is very much appreciated.

Please note that there has been two errors in the numbering of Annual Reports during the past. This report now corrects the error.

Conclusion

I consider that the duties of Office Administrator are a very important link between the public, NSW Sport & Recreation, the Directors and the sport of Table Tennis.

SECRETARY'S REPORT - 2002

2002 was again an extremely hectic and productive year for Table Tennis NSW.

Table Tennis NSW relocated from the Peter Forsyth Auditorium at Glebe to the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre at Olympic Park on the 4th May We had a good number of volunteers who helped move all the tables and equipment and set up at the new venue by 3 pm that afternoon and the first event was a veterans comp day on the 5th.

The venue was open Tuesday & Wednesday nights for training. Tony Lee the duty coach for Tuesday nights and Paul Zhao the duty coach on Wednesday nights. On Thursday nights the Insurance Comp from 7pm to 11pm — it was good to see four junior teams participate in one of the two grades.

Sundays 9am to 5 pm for - tournaments; training & Veterans Competition.

We also had some Saturdays for Trainings & a few tournaments.

The City Vs Country annual challenge was again a very enjoyable and successful day and we held the first annual NSW Vs ACT challenge with ACT bringing 9 teams and NSW / NSW Country with 17 teams this was also very successful and enjoyable day and we look forward to continuing these events in 2003

Table Tennis NSW participated in the NSW Sport & Recreations — national Pilot on Risk Management in 2001 along with fourteen other sports and this is one of the modules in the NSW Sport & Recreations "This Is Your Business "resource. This Is Your Business resource was officially launched in May at the Sydney Sports Ground with Ron Pickering and myself attending the launch. Beryl Davies and myself attended the two-day seminar on the This Is Your Business resource. This will be used by all sports nationally. Table Tennis NSW has added this resource to our By Laws and has begun putting the resource into practice.

Since Table Tennis NSW ventured into the World Wide Web in May 2001, for those who don't know, the address is — www.ttnsw.org.au We have had over 12,000 visitors to our WEBSITE since 15th May last year. All our tournament results are entered here the same day or within two days of the tournaments completion. Also during the Australian Junior and Australian Veterans Championships the results were entered as matches were completed. The site contains the annual Calendar of events, equipment catalogues, and a separate Veterans & Country League page as well as venue contacts and tournament entry forms. This continues to be a successful venture and we have attracted several new players via the WEBSITE and again well done to the WEB MASTER Phil Males who keeps the site up to date.

We had three members selected in the Commonwealth Games team to Manchester-John Tawadrous, Joy Boyd & Luisa Silva, with Joy Boyd winning a bronze medal in the Womens EAD singles event. Congratulations and well done to Joy winning a Commonwealth Games medal is truly an outstanding achievement

We also had John Tawadrous, Michelle Beaumont and Daryn Lu selected in Senior junior & cadet representative teams for Australia in 2002 overseas congratulations and well done.

The relocation to the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre has also provided more opportunities to provide coaching services to schools – with the help of the State Sports Centre & NSW Dept of Sport & Recreation we hope that we will be able to further develop our schools programs with more schools using the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre.

The registrations for 2002 were almost 700 – an increase of 100 - the registration fees for 2003 have increased slightly due to increased costs and it is important that members ensure their association/club forward any registrations as soon as possible to ensure members receive entry forms and the LOOP on time and are covered for players accident insurance. The registrations are being updated as they are received and members should receive their membership cards within two – three weeks of the TTNSW Office receiving the registrations. If members have not received their cards they should firstly contact their club/association to ensure their membership has been forwarded to the TTNSW office and if so contact the office. NB: If members have changed address it important to contact the office either by: phone; fax or E-mail to advise your change of details.

Table Tennis NSW has submitted an expression of interest with Auburn Council on the 20th December for the vacant premises formally occupied by Lidcombe RSL Bowling Club located at 75 Olympic Drive at Auburn. The document took a huge effort to prepare as we only had two weeks notice to submit the expression of interest, the document is 72 pages and copies are available at the office. The land is quite large and we could build a permanent Table Tennis Centre, which would hold 30 tables, have a cafeteria, merchandising shop, as well as a CAR PARK. I would like to thank Leigh Roden (Marketing Director) who prepared the final draft and presented it to Auburn Council. The Council will advise us sometime in February as to whether our expression of interest was successful.

2003 will be a very busy year - commencing with the

- Table Tennis NSW has been invited by Table Tennis Australia to Host the 2003 Australian Schools Championships – these will be held at the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre from Tuesday 8th to Friday 11th July inclusive and the Australian Junior & U18 Championships – these will be held at the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre from Saturday 27th September to Friday 3rd October inclusive.
- NSW Country & the Australian Insurance Championships will both be holding their 50th Anniversary Championships in Sydney at the Sydney Indoor Sports Centre and Nepean District TT clubrooms respectively.

NSW Country Veterans team visits Country Victoria

A team comprising Hans Wetsteyn, Ben Slaiman, Greg Evans and Les Walczuk were selected to tour Country Victoria from the 22nd to the 28th September 2002.

Their began at Mildura winning 12–8, then proceeded to Warracknabeal winning 9-2 and followed by Bendigo winning 6–5, Ballarat losing 7–13, Warrnambool winning 16–4, Wonthaggi losing 6–14 and playing their last match at Bairnsdale winning 11–0.

The match at Bairnsdale was played in a retirement village and was watched by more than 60 spectators.

The team had a great tour travelling more than 3,500kms in the 9 days. Even so, just after the tour started I received a phone call requesting that at the completion of the tour that they be allowed to turn around and do it all again.

The tour opened in Canberra on Sunday 29th September 2002 with a loss to the ACT 13–7, followed by win at Goulburn 8–3, a win at Bathurst 10–1, wins against Penrith 1–19 and 7–13.

REPORT AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Our teams resplendent in their new uniforms arrived in Melbourne for the Championships with great expectations, which for the most part were realised.

The highlights were the Gold Medal performances of our Men in the Over 40 and Over 60 competitions. The Over 40 Men were favourites for the event and firmed dramatically when Victoria could only field two fit players in the final. The Over 60 Men performed above expectations as the Victorians were firm favourites who were eventually beaten by the greater team spirit of NSW Further highlights were the Silver Medal performances of our 60s Women and 70s Men. Our 60s Women were well beaten by an extremely strong Victorian side whilst our 70s Men were just edged out in the final.

MARKETING REPORT 2002

This year the position of Marketing Director was made formal and was undertaken to review our marketing strategy for TTNSW and to look at what possibilities lay ahead for us in obtaining both funds to assist players / officials and to look at a permanent venue to assist all in our sport.

Our theme this year has been: *Marketing Matters* (both in content and actually looking to do it)

Activities during the year included:

- A strong association with the Chinese community through participation in the Para Para Chinese Olympians fundraising event. The event was primarily to raise funds for Miao Miao, who came from Melbourne to attend, and gain better relations with the greater Chinese community. Both of these activities were met. Miao Miao made over \$800 on the night and we have made closer friendships with many leaders with the Chinese community. Financially we 'lost' \$300, having to pay this for three members participate in an on the night fundraising torch relay.
- Printing of the LOOP magazine rather than photocopying was undertaken. This was a cost neutral exercise with Combined Sports Traders and Nepean Table Tennis Association funding the first issue in December.
- With the relocation to the Sydney Indoor Sports centre in May, a much improved venue from the previous site, we have endeavored where possible to promote our sport with flyers, including free give-a-way training sessions, and notification to various authorities and exhibition organisers of both our location and the fun and health benefits of playing table tennis.
- We have been asked by The Cargo Club in Sydney to have a 'Fun Day' in their premises promoting the sport. This will take place in the first 1/4 of 2003.
- We have asked Combined Sports Traders (Stiga agents) for significant assistance in the form of sponsorship, cash, trophies and a closer association for Junior Table Tennis. This will take effect during the first 1/4 of 2003.
- We have commenced discussion with World Expo Promotions to exhibit and trade at the upcoming Sports Exhibition to be held in October 2003. This will be along with some 100+ other sports involved in this event.

Marketing (advertising) costs money — money we currently do not have to throw around so we have to look at placing 'the cart before the horse' in the form of sponsorship.

Sponsorship is easy to obtain — small sponsorship, but to obtain significant sponsorship and ongoing sponsorship takes time and a concentrated effort by both Board members and general table tennis players and officials who will all need to assist to succeed. To obtain what we need, rather than just what we want, our focus on our sponsorship requirements needs to be right, our alignment with the right sponsor/s needs to be right (for all three groups — juniors, seniors and veterans) and our ability to return to our sponsors a good 'bang for their buck' needs to be considered before we can successfully gain our sponsorship needs.

I have enjoyed my time this year with the Marketing activities and wish TTNSW and the new Marketing team well in 2003 and beyond.

NSW TABLE TENNIS UMPIRES ASSOCIATION.

The year 2002 was a somewhat quiet year on the local scene with the association again experiencing difficulties in providing referees at state events. Steven Lee was the TTNSW Tournament Director and although present at most events was not classified as referee. The planned seminar for new umpires did not eventuate.

The Associate, State and National Umpire qualifications are now practically accredited with the National Officials Accreditation Scheme, which means that these umpires will now be formally recognised at their respective levels by an accredited organisation which covers officials of all sports in Australia. Plans are being made to hold a seminar for people who wish to obtain their qualifications at Kogarah around May, with a number of people having already expressed interest. This will hopefully help alleviate the current shortage of officials at our tournaments.

lan Finlay resigned all his Table Tennis officiating commitments for personal reasons during the year. All will appreciate lan's enviable record of service to umpiring and refereeing over many years and his contribution will be sorely missed.

During the year Steven Lee was Referee for the FESPIC Games in Pusan, Korea and Deputy Referee for the World Championships for Players with Disabilities in Taipei.

Maurie Poole was an umpire at the Japan Open Championships (Omigura Cup) in Kobe, the World Championships for Players with Disabilities in Taipei, the World Masters Games and Australian Veterans Championships in Melbourne and was Referee for the World Gay Games in Sydney.

Phil Males was Tournament Director of the NSW Country Championships, the Australian Senior Championships in Perth, and the World Gay Games in Sydney.

Carol Poole, Karl Preuss, Rob Crowdy, Shirley Smith and Armida Brugnoli-Croccolo were umpires at the World Gay Games in Sydney.

Already this year Steven Lee has been Deputy Referee at the Youth Olympics, with Peter Lazell, Maurie Poole, Carol Poole, Karl Preuss, Tony Katona, David Cheung and Sam Lau being umpires at that event.

Steven Lee and Maurie Poole also attended an Advanced Umpire Training Seminar in Melbourne as part of the new ITTF Blue Badged Elite International Umpire scheme and both passed the subsequent exam.

The association maintains its' contacts with the TTA Officiating Committee, who are working largely behind the scenes to improve Table Tennis Officiating in Australia.

It is hoped that 2003 will see improvements in our association and an increased presence of our Referees and Umpires at tournaments and championships in the future.

TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR REPORT 2002

There were ten (10) tournaments held in 2002 season. Seven (7) of them were held in Sydney Indoor Sports Centre during the period from May to July, possibly due to the availability of the playing venue. Surprisingly, there were no tournaments held since August. There is an obvious imbalance in the tournament schedule, thus affecting the number of participants. The reduced number of participants has an obvious effect on the standard of play and revenue raising from the entries. In general all the tournaments were completed satisfactory. I wish to thank Leonie, Tien and Geoff Henry etc for their assistance during the year. In summary, I would like to raise the following issues which need to be addressed in the future:

1. Number of participants and the closing date for entries

Many players did not put in their entry forms in time before the deadline. This may be habitual on part of the players or inefficient distribution of the entry forms to the members. Whatever the reason, the organisers are forced to accept late entries because of the lack of entries. This has an adverse effect on the preparation of the tournament; quite often leading to last minute preparation of the draw. It is hoped all players can put in their entries in time and there is no need for any late entries.

2. Delay in tournaments

It happens regularly that a number of players are playing in different events at about the same time on the same day. This leads to problems of many divisions waiting for a particular player to finish his/her match in one grade/division. Matches were delayed as a result. In addition, because of the lack of umpires, many player were late in starting their matches and therefore holding up the progress of the tournament. While it is fortunate that the venue can be used overtime, this will eventually increase the costs of running a tournament.

3. Ways to increase participation

In general, the number of participants in tournaments is not satisfactory. It is hoped that more players can participate in tournaments. A more complete system of ranking and seedings have to be introduced to encourage more players to participate as well as holding a variety of events which are new to players to encourage increased participation.

Due to health problems and other personal commitments, I regret to advise that I cannot continue to be the tournament director in 2003. I wish TTNSW every success in 2003.

FINANCIAL REPORT Year Ended 2002

Ladies & Gentlemen

I present the 2002 Financial Report and Balance Sheet and move that they be accepted.

At the time of writing this, the audit had not been completed but should it be finalized before the meeting I will table the audit report to the meeting for acceptance.

During the year I have cleaned up files and records from the previous couple of years and now all figures should be in the correct area. Balance Sheet items have also been adjusted to show correct figures as at the end of December 2002. As a result of this I have had to write out a lot of amounts and accordingly the adjusted entries reflect in the write off amounts in expenditure.

The Property and Equipment section in the Balance Sheet reflects the assets of TTNSW. Unfortunately we have not been able to do a stock take of all items but we do have a record of all items purchased this year. At some stage during the year we will have to undertake a full stock take of all Table Tennis Equipment held by TTNSW and an inventory established of all items and where they are located. Accordingly I have not depreciated any equipment for 2002 and hopefully we can get this area completely up to date in 2003.

A loss of \$5230.13 was incurred but we should not read anything into this because at the end of 2001 we had received the extra government funding and this had boosted the figures up so 2002 is seen as an adjustment that has evened everything out.

We have been able to maintain the investment right through 2002 but some of the funds may have to be utilized in early 2003 when we allow for insurance, workers compensation and superannuation.

In order to show correct figures for the SISC complex, I have generated accounts in Income and Expenditure and by generating journal entries, transferred funds between accounts so as to show a definite income and expenditure for the SISC complex. Some accounts such as the Veterans and Insurance, don't need to have journal entries transacted as it is a straight in and out situation however when there is an event such as the NSW Open for example then journal entries need to be passed to show as expenditure for the event and income for the SISC. Doing it this way we can determine a more accurate picture to see if it is holding its own financially.

Government Grants are now no longer specified for a particular function therefore it is not necessary to show unexpended amounts and I no longer maintain separate accounts just for grant monies expended. All audit certificates are up to date for the end of the last government financial year.
