

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would like to thank the Board Members for their efforts on your behalf for the 1999 year. Unfortunately Theo Morsink will not be standing for the Financial Directors position this year and I would like to thank him for the good job he has done for TTNSW.

I would also like to thank our sponsors who supported us this year - Civic Videos and Combined Sports 'Traders - and I am looking forward this year to their ongoing support.

NSW Sport and Recreation are the main sponsors of TTNSW, and their support and encouragement is gratefully acknowledged. I personally would also like to thank the Affiliated Associations and Financial Members for their support to table tennis as well.

As President, I take this position very seriously and try to give my best, and at times it does become frustrating.

1999 had some plusses and a few disappointments. I'll deal with the disappointments first. The Metropolitan Committee I believe, is a very important committee. Sadly, they had only one meeting all Year. It all starts with the Chairman calling meeting. I can't help but wonder that if the Metropolitan Committee had met and discussed the Western District Open, then maybe it would not have been cancelled. Each association has members, and communication with those members is essential to make Table Tennis a rewarding experience and a fun sport to play.

The Smash Hit Program held in Newcastle started out OK, but at the end of 1999, with no Coach available or Coach to help out, unfortunately will not continue in 2000 unless a local player takes up the position. In Sydney, TTNSW and TTA have asked for interested parties to run a Smash Hit, but to no avail. This is a pity because it Is a good way of getting younger players into our sport.

In regards to the Table Tennis venue at Homebush - it won't happen at \$50 an hour. It is too expensive and difficult to get to. Next year alone, \$15,000 will be needed for a Table Tennis venue alone, Think about it - that is money going to other sporting groups.

Once again, the need for a permanent Table 'Tennis Centre Is on the agenda. I have asked Ken Cole to draw up a proposal in regards to this project. I strongly urge you all to read it and give some serious thought to it.

In regards to the last **LOOP**, the levy to TTA - some \$13,000 -will not happen. I have spoken to all of the other states and we have all decided that we will not be paying the levy. TTNSW does not have that sort of money to give to TTA.

As President, I must congratulate the Under 14 Girls Team - winning the National Under 14 Gold Medal. This has not been done since 1974. Well done Michelle Beaumont, Nadine Lewis and Susan Huynh and non playing Captain Wendy Au.

Once again, John Tawadrous was outstanding, winning the Australian Under 14 and 16 Singles and with John Beaumont, the Under 14 Doubles, the Under 14 Team Bronze Medal and the Under 18 Boys Bronze Medal.

Junior Table Tennis is going from strength to strength.

I would like to thank Kiet Tran and Peter Masen for their help with the Junior Squads.

The Men's Open Team came a credible 4th. Also, congratulations to Wayne Heginbotham the 40 National Champion - and Inh Van Le - Over 50 National Champion. Nadine Lewis Under 14 Girls Doubles Champion. The NSW Veterans once again distinguished themselves at the Veteran Nationals on the Gold Coast. Well done.

In closing, thank You Ron Pickering, for all of the work that you have done for TTNSW during 1999. It is appreciated.


Leonie Whlteford is trying to get a Womens Competition going in 2000, so ladies, please support her.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER'S REPORT

Members, it gives me pleasure to present my fourth report as Administration Officer (Part Time 2 days a week) for Table Tennis NSW Inc. The past twelve months has been very busy for me. I am finding that I have to spend extra days, in addition to my one day a week gratis, in the office in order to get the work done. This I don't mind, because it means that things are happening within our sport.

Where to play Table Tennis guide

The "Where to play Table Tennis guide" has once again proved its worth. I receive on average three to four telephone calls a day from the public asking where they can play in their area. Constant up-dating of the information has to be done to make sure the information is correct and current. Incidentally we receive funding from NSW Sport & Recreation for this project.

LOOP

Three editions of our newsletter *LOOP* were produced during 1999, and posted to members in May, August and December. I would like to thank all contributors of articles published, they made interesting and varied reading. Also thank you to the various advertisers, I hope that you felt that you received value for money.

I was contacted by a representative from the State Library Of NSW during October 1999 requesting a sample of *LOOP*. I complied immediately. They contacted me again requesting any back issues be forwarded to them also. Subsequently they wrote thanking me and requesting further copies and I quote, "All issues of this publication will be kept in the Library as part of the documentary record of the State, and may in time become the only set in existence. Any further publications you may produce will also be gratefully received". On top of receiving specific funding by NSW Sport & Recreation for me to produce *LOOP*, the inclusion in The State Library enforces my belief in its merit.

Tournaments

Last year I reported the cancellation of seven TTNSW tournaments during 1998. I am pleased to report a remarkable turnaround, with no cancellations of State tournaments in 1999. We now have to work on greater participation by members because, apart from an enjoyable playing experience they are an ideal source of much needed finance for Table Tennis NSW Inc.

General administration


A great deal of my time in February '99 was taken helping to organise the Coaching of Coaches Course conducted by former National Coaching Director, Glen Tepper. Eighteen prospective coaches and those taking a refresher course took part.

During 1999 a considerable amount of my time involved trying to recover bad debts. I am pleased to report all except the debts of Chi Nguyen \$586.25 and The Korean Table Tennis Club \$1825.00 have been recovered.

Once again the sale of Table Tennis equipment has been an important part of my duty. We receive funding from NSW Sport & Recreation for this project. It provides a service to all members and a small profit of \$759.00 for Table Tennis NSW.

Registrations

The number of registered players continues to be of great concern. With almost no growth in numbers during the past five years.



Consider the final numbers registered for 1999 for the following affiliated Clubs/Associations. (See full report on separate page).

If these numbers are accurate, (so few people registered it is doubtfull that they could organise a competition). Board/Council will have to offer considerable assistance to the above Clubs/Associations to recruit and retain additional members in 2000, or risk the demise of these Clubs/Associations.

On a positive note, Table Tennis Western Sydney are to be congratulated for an 83% increase in registrations from 1998. Well done.

NSW Sport & Recreation Involvement

NSW Sport & Recreation continue to be our main source of income. It is pleasing to report that we have successfully applied for a record \$35,000.00 grant to run three programs in the 1999/2000 period. This is an increase of \$9,000.00 on last year.

The three funded programs are:-

- A) Junior Club Development,
- B) School Development and
- C) Information disbursement, Administration and Marketing.

Applications by six Country Juniors have received a total of \$1,800.00 from the Country Athlete Scheme for 1999, with a further five applications currently being considered by NSW Sport & Recreation.

My involvement with the NSW Sport & Recreation continues to be at a high level. With several formal and informal meetings taking place during 1999. Their expertise in correct procedures will, in time, have a beneficial impact on Table Tennis NSW.

The structure of the Board/Council and management policies of Table Tennis NSW needs to be reviewed, including the constitution. NSW Sport & Recreation has offered to assist with this review in the first quarter of 2000.

Financial

I am sure that you have heard the expression "We must be more professional". This is not an empty statement, considering income and expenses totaled \$78,741 was managed by Table Tennis NSW during 1999. A dollar figure not too different from that of a small business. We do need to be more professional and business like in our thinking.

Table Tennis NSW is struggling to meet its financial obligations on an ongoing basis. A review of all sources of income needs to be undertaken. This is a critical issue.

- Any proposed project must be accompanied by a budget, showing that it is at least self funding.
- Budgeting for a loss must not be permitted.
- Registration fees are presently unrealistrictly low, at less than 40 cents a week.

They must be calculated to cover at the very least:Affiliation fee with Table Tennis Australia
50% of the wages of the Administration Officer
Plus an amount equal to the cost of individual membership with Table Tennis Australia.

Conclusion

I think that my efforts in the office continue to provide an important link between Table Tennis NSW programs, NSW Sport & Recreation and the general public. With some changes to the way we do business there is no reason why Table Tennis can not grow and take advantage of the Olympics in Sydney. We may never have this opportunity again.

WOMEN'S PORTFOLIO REPORT

The International Womensport Festival was held in Sydney in Mach/April, 1999. This year we were able to be represented. Two competitions were organised by TTNSW as a lead-up to the festival. One for schoolgirls and one for women and girls. I will report on the schoolgirls competition in my school's report.

The Womensport Women's Grade competition was held on Sunday, 14th March at the Bankstown City Y.M.C.A. at Revesby. All women members of TTNSW were circularised as well as all girls schools in the Metropolitan area.

Ten players responded. Because of the lack of numbers, the competition was reduced to three hours in the afternoon and all those who competed played a number of round robins in that time.

Since the first Women's competition I have organised over the years there has been a core of veteran players and each year a different group of newcomers - one year players from Gosford, another year players from Bowral and in 1999 two young players and two schoolteachers from the Western Suburbs.

With the emergency at the Peter Forsyth Auditorium in June postponing a number of competitions to the later end of the year there were no dates available to organise another competition in 1999.

SCHOOLS' PORTFOLIO REPORT

The NSW Secondary Schoolgirls Teams Championships and the Individual Primary Schoolgirls Championships were also held in March as part of the International Womensport Festival. This took place at the State Sports Centre with 34 girls competing. This was very encouraging.

Secondary Schoolgirls Challenge for teams of 2: Birrong Girls High School No. 1 defeated Wiley Park No. 1 in a very close game.

Girls Category I Shield Championship for teams of 4 - schools with over 400 girls. Birrong Girls High School No. 1 defeated Wiley Park on a countback of POINTS! Birrong has been a winner over a number of years. While Wiley Park was new to the competition.

Girls Category II Shield Championship for teams of 4 -schools with under 400 girls. West Wallsend High School defeated Cromer High School

The two primary schoolgirls who participated in the Secondary Schoolgirls Challenge as well as the Individual Primary schoolgirls Championship showed a lot of potential.

Krystina Burdekin defeated Laura Ryan (both from Chipping Norton Public School).

Heather Reid drove from Canberra specially to present all the participants with their International Womensport Festival certificates.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS SHIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS, Thursday, 5th August.

This competition was for teams of three, whether all boys, all girls or mixed. Forty-two students, most of them boys, from five schools participated. Gulgong Public School was the only country school.

Michelle Beaumont of Gulgong won much admiration from the Secondary school boys who were also playing matches, when she blitzed her male opposition.

Winner: Gulgong Public School, Runner-up: Haberfield Third: Ferncourt.

BOYS CATEGORY I BOYS SHIELD CHAMPIONSHIP for teams of 4. 23rd June, Peter Forsyth Auditorium.

Forty-four boys from eight schools participated in this event. Some teams were very inexperienced while other were very strong. However this did not dent the enthusiasm of the rookie teams who want to come back for more. The young team from Canley Vale High School caused an upset by defeating a confident Randwick Boys High in the quarter-finals and then Sefton in the semi-finals. However, a mature St. John's Park was too strong for them in the final.

BOYS CATEGORY II SHIELD CHAMPIONSHIP -Teams of 4 for schools with under 400 boys.

Thirty-two boys from six schools participated, mainly from country schools. A very keen team from Ginninderra District High School, having defeated Holroyd, took the Shield and the medals from Wollongong, who had defeated Dungog in the semi-finals.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS CHALLENGE for teams of 2. 16th June State Sports Centre.

These games were strongly contested by sixty-two players from seven schools with Ginninderra District High School the only one not from the Sydney. This school was keen to take another lot of medals home but their hopes were dashed by the St. John's Park High No. 2 team in a very close match in the quarter-final. St. John's Park High No. 1 team met their match in the final when they were beaten by a very strong Sefton High team which included a highly experienced player from Sweden.

This year all winners and runners-up were presented with medals with a trophy for the winning school to keep as well as the perpetual shield.

I am indebted to the Sports Education Unit of the Department of Education for their distribution of entry forms to 800 primary schools and 250 high schools in the region.

COACHING / DEVELOPMENT REPORT

1999 was busy and successful year for Table Tennis in NSW.

We started off the year with a coaching seminar for the development of & updating of existing coaches. This Was held at Kogarah RSL & in conjunction with a Junior training session at Lidcombe TAFE.

We also sent two coaches to the Olympic solidarity -coaching seminar in July in Adelaide, many international coaches attended this seminar.

We conducted monthly junior training sessions from March at the Peter Forsyth Auditorium in Glebe.

We held an exhibition at Haberfield Public School this was attended by Peter Masen and many times Australian Champion Paul Pinkewich. The school was extremely pleased with the exhibition and continue their regular coaching session with NSW on a Friday Afternoon at Leichhardt Masonic Hall.

The schools development has been fairly hectic with many schools requesting coaching.

The existing schools can be broken down into four main areas:

- I. Eastern Suburbs/City Maroubra, Sydney Girls High, Randwick Girls, Ultimo Community Centre, North Sydney Girls High.
 - 2, Inner/South City Haberfield Primary, St George Girls, Kogarah High.

We also plan to visit Dungog High school in March'; they have an active inter area schools competition and are keen to get some coaching.

The schools and club plans are developing at an encouraging rate and the requests are exceeding our current resources. For 2000 we are planning to increase our resources (le: coaching staff) to accommodate all the coaching requests. As most of the coaches accreditation expires in 2000. The Development Officer will be conducting a re accreditation and new accreditation's in early 2000. The overall report is extremely encouraging, which is reflected in the schools & Junior results contained in those reports.

TT NSW Financial Report Year Ending 31 December 1999.

In presenting the enclosed financial reports, you will find that the financial position of TT NSW Inc. has continued to deteriorate. Although the loss is similar to the last financial year, TT NSW Inc. is in better shape and control and likely to find a way out the problems in the new financial year.

The reported loss of \$1143 requires some qualifications to the accounts in particular to the 1999/2000 grants for Juniors & Development and High Performance shown as a liability of \$13750 and \$5000. respectively, on the Balance Sheet. These grants overlap our financial year and have to be earned in such a way that for every 2 dollars spent on each particular project, we can claim one dollar from the grant indicated.

At this point of time, details of expenditure are only available for administrative support amounting to a cost of approx \$\$7500 and for that reason only \$3750 has been shown as income under the 1999/00 grant todate. It is understood that negotiations are under way to proceed with these projects in the near future so as not to endanger the qualification for the outstanding balances on these grants.

The control of tournaments sofar has only slightly improved. The reports provided to the finance director came close to the final revenue figures in the profit and loss statements, but authorising signatures regarding control of each tournament and the certification of the number of entrants and fees has not been forthcoming. In addition some reports are still outstanding. From the enclosed reports it is quite evident that there is still a lot of work to be done to get this area under control. In stead of providing an operational loss, tournaments should generate a positive cashflow for TT NSW Inc.

Control of debtors has also improved to a certain degree and we have been able to make some in roads in clearing quite a few outstandings from the previous year. The Korean TTC still owes us \$850 and C.Nguyen \$586, but I've been assured that we are continuing in our efforts to collect these debts and no provision for write off has been made at this stage.

From an operational point of view, the financial situation remains tight, but with continued restraint and a few new initiatives like: sponsorships, paid advertising in Loop and more memberships and affiliations, a positive turn around is quickly possible. It needs the commitment not only from the committee, but from all concerned with the well being and growth of Table Tennis as a sport in NSW.

As a final note, I would like to compliment my fellow members of the Council for their restraint shown in expense claims and their willingness to have a go at one of the most difficult and thankless jobs around. I can only hope, that those reading these words, including non member Associations, Clubs and Individuals, that their passion for the game of Table Tennis will encourage them to assist the new committee in their future efforts.
