

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Firstly, a big thankyou must go to Geoff Henry for his contribution to Table Tennis as President for the past few years.

After his recent resignation, I wish him all the best for his future.

1998 saw a year of changes, being the introduction of a Junior Committee chaired by Andrew Chan, also a Metropolitan Committee chaired by Steve Eggleton. These committees require each and every one of us to support them.

The idea of a Metropolitan Committee is so that all associations work together - something that has been lacking in the past. You may think that is doesn't matter if I don't play, "I won't be missed". That's not true. Each and everyone of you are important to our sport. I have been asked by different people "what does TTNSW do for me?" The answer is "we are all TTNSW, and the more we support table tennis the more table tennis can do for you!"

As a player of table tennis for some 33 years and the fact that both my parents and my children play, I don't want to see the game stagnate.

1998 had some plusses and some disappointments. On the positive side TTNSW has appointed Peter Marsen as Coaching/Development Officer. Hopefully 1999 will see Peter going into different schools promoting table tennis hopefully enhancing our player base.

TTNSW in conjunction with the Table Tennis Australia has had a Smash Hit Table Tennis pilot scheme running in a Newcastle school and the feed back was that it was well received. In the second term of 1999 five more schools in Sydney and surrounding areas will take place, and with the interest shown in this area of table tennis it should be a success. For more information on Smash Hit programmes please contact TTNSW.

In regards to the Table Tennis venue at the Easter Showground, Homebush, there are still ongoing negotiations. Hopefully by the AGM we should know more, and yes, it is frustrating.

In regard to the State Representative teams, NSW Junior under 14 girls and under 14 boys won silver medals at the National Championships. The under 16 boys, although not gaining a medal, should be praised by their effort. I would like also to congratulate the NSW Veterans teams on their superb efforts at the Hobart National Veterans Championships.

The big disappointment for 1998 for me and for TTNSW was the facts that we were unable to field an under 16 girls team as only two players were available. Once again there was no Senior Womens team, and also for the first time in TTNSW history, no Senior Mens team participated at the National Championships. I would urge all female and male players to participate in tournaments and make themselves

available for team selection. It would also be a great help if the respective associations made sure their players are registered.

I can not stress strongly enough the importance of registration of players, as this money is needed so we can run TTNSW more effectively for all players.

At this point, I would like to thank all the TTNSW Council for their tireless efforts in 1998, sometimes in difficult circumstances. Special thanks to the Secretary, Leonie Whiteford, who has been a tower of strength to the sport. Also Andrew Chan with his commitment to Junior Table Tennis and training of the Junior squads, and enthusiasm to the game. Also Gillian Hutchinson with her work with the NSW schools teams and women's table tennis. My appreciation to Theo Morsink for his work as Financial Director. Also recently appointed Radko Zaloudek. I would like to thank Yasaka for their support of table tennis in 1998 and hope for their continued support in 1999.

The Department of Sport and Recreation are again the main sponsors of TTNSW, and their support is gratefully acknowledged.

On behalf of TTNSW I would like to thank Ron Pickering for the work he does behind the scenes, and it is appreciated. Also to Lester Vibert, a thankyou for running our table tennis tournaments. A thankyou to the Umpires' Assn and I look forward to their continued support in the future events.

I think also not only as President of TTNSW but as a player and parent, I would like to thank Ghiath Khalil for the professional way he has produced the Loop magazine this year.

I, David Beaumont, would like to thank all players, parents and helpers of our sport for 1998 and trust that 1999, with all your support, will lead to a bigger and brighter year ahead.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER'S REPORT

Members, it gives me pleasure to present my third report as Administration Officer (Part Time) for Table Tennis NSW Inc. The past year has been one of significant change in the way not only Table Tennis but all sports do business with the NSW Department of Sport & Recreation. Example: - Greater accountability and development of human rights and protection policies.

General

The 'Where to play Table Tennis' data base has once again proved to be a valuable tool in the day to day office operations. It will continue to serve us well providing the contact details remain accurate. Members co-operation is still needed to advise me if there is any change in contact people or telephone numbers.

One of the most important positions in any club/association is the 'First Contact Person'. I am referring to the name on our 'Where to play Table Tennis' data base. If these people are doing the right thing Table Tennis NSW should have hundreds of new players, if the number of telephone calls I receive from the general public is any indication.

Only two editions of *Loop* were produced during 1998, one in July the other in December. I am grateful to the members who phoned to pass on their compliments for some of the articles. I wish to thank the members who submitted interesting stories for your enjoyment and education. I wish also to thank Ghiath Khalil for his work in editing the July issue.

The preparation of various entry forms has continued to be an interesting and important part of my duties. Unfortunately several of the entry forms mailed to members were in vain due to the cancellation of seven (7) events. Apart from my frustration, the cancellations resulted in considerable financial loss to Table Tennis NSW. One of the condition of hall hire at Cumberland Health College is that hirers must give seven (7) days notice of any cancellation, but as we did not comply they charged us each time. A Tournament Sub-Committee has been elected to revamp the way tournaments are organised in 1999. One of the suggested changes is to have the closing date ten (10) days before the tournament, thus giving time to cancel in time, if necessary, without incurring cost.

Disturbingly, the number of registered members has fallen by almost 200 from last year, which in dollar terms means \$4,000.00 less income. This is a serious problem considering every dollar of income is vital to match Government grants.

I have successfully applied to use the State Mail Service (a division of NSW Dept. of Public Works and Services). This is a postal service for NSW Government departments which gives savings of two cents per letter. This will mean many dollars saved per annum.

I would like to thank Jim Wright, Table Tennis Coach at Campbelltown/Minto PCYC and Steven Lee, International Referee for their help in organising the Table Tennis part of the NSW Sports Council for the Disabled, South West Region "Disability"

Sports Expo". The Expo was held in Minto on Saturday 5 December 1998. I produced some promotional leaflets promoting Table Tennis at the PCYC which were given out on the day. Jim said that he gained several new members as a result.

I would like to offer my congratulations to Dave Beaumont for being voted 1998 Volunteer of the Year by Table Tennis Australia. If more members had the enthusiasm of Dave, Table Tennis in NSW would be much better off.

It was pleasing to see thirty (30) people in attendance at the Special Meeting held at Kogarah RSL on 26 July 1998. The meeting put forward several worthwhile ideas to advance our sport in NSW. Members now have the responsibility to get behind the two (2) new Sub-Committees, Junior and Metropolitan and have them operating efficiently and effectively. For information on the Junior Sub-Committee Andrew Chan should be contacted. Metropolitan inquiries should be directed to Steve Eggleton.

NSW Department Of Sport & Recreation

The NSW Department Of Sport & Recreation continue to be the principle source of funding for Table Tennis NSW. Their continuing contributions both financial and practical (rent free accommodation and advice) are very much appreciated.

The processing of Country Athlete Grant applications has resulted in ten (10) country juniors receiving a total of \$5,000.00 from this scheme, which is an increase of \$1,500.00 from last year.

As forecast in last year's Annual Report my involvement with NSW Dept. Sport & Recreation has increased significantly. I have attended several seminars dealing with the new co-operative agreements. As a result of our co-operative agreement several new policies will be put forward to the Council of Table Tennis NSW for endorsement. ie., Sexual Harassment, Child Protection, Equal Employment Opportunity, Occupational Health And Safety.

Publicity and Sponsorship

I have produced several promotional posters promoting a number of events.

Generous sponsorship from Combined Sports Traders was obtained for the School Students Grade competitions and the travel costs for Trevor Brown (Vic) when he took part in a television interview and demonstration with Warren Gray during 7 networks Eleven AM program earlier this year.

Conclusion

I think that my efforts in the office continue to provide an important link between Table Tennis NSW programs and the general public. Recent approval by NSW Dept. Sport & Recreation of funding for me to administer marketing and promotional activities, reinforces my belief that my efforts are worthwhile.

VETERAN'S REPORT

Another successful year has been completed by this Association and progress made with recruitment of players, improving the standard of play of many veterans and competing strongly at the Australian Championships.

The Teams Challenge was the main event conducted in 1998 where two matches were played on the one day, once a month. This format allowed some country players to gain valuable teams practise and our lady players the experience of playing against lady players, which is not readily available in the competitions currently being conducted in the metropolitan area. The A grade was won by a team not containing one of the big guns, but by a team of players who attended regularly and played solidly throughout the competition. Congratulations to Ray Vanem, Paul Uttley and Dennis Ryiatt for their fine performance.

The B grade competition increased to 12 teams but unfortunately the standard of play from the best players to the weaker players became too wide thereby jeopardising the running of the competition. Regardless of this problem the players who attended had some good table tennis and the winning team was not decided until the last round. 'Kogarah One' consisting of Cary Mullard, Alison Bourke and Robert Sharp prevailed to take the prize money. The 'C' grade consisted of four teams and due to the consistent attendance of Endel Busch, Keith Johnson and Leo Moase they took the title.

In between the teams matches we intended conducting 6 grade tournaments but as the first tournament was poorly attended the remainder were cancelled and the thoughts of members will be canvassed to ascertain what events they would support in 1999.

The Police and Community Youth Club remains our venue for 1999 with either six or seven top grade tables erected as necessary with some barriers increase(d in height to improve the efficiency of stopping balls from passing into another playing area.

Our Association fitted out our new State team members with tracksuits and shirts for the Australian Championships this year. The players once again looked smart, looked like a 'team', bonded as a 'team' and played like a 'team'as the results show. Ted Davis took the position of Manager and his attendance at meetings and attention to players requirements was greatly appreciated. Some new, young over 40 men have bolstered the depth of this age group who went on to take the Gold Medal. Strong competition for selection in the State teams is expected in all age divisions in 1999 as the Championships are to be held at the Gold Coast.

The year concluded with a fun day for members who battled out a doubles tournament with an odd assortment of bats and sponge rubber balls. Lunch and prizes for everyone completed a great social day.

Even though there was low participation all players, parents and officials had an enjoyable fun day at Homebush.

During 1999 the Junior Committee will try to find ways of increasing the participation rate to our NSW Junior Tournaments, set up a training academy for both National and Novice players under the direction of Peter Masen. Try to find more affordable venues to hold our tournaments, thus making money. Try to get more sponsorship. AUSTRALIAN SCHOOLS TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS GEELONG SEPTEMBER 1998.

Ten teams from NSW schools participated in this competition, including Albury High Corowa High Fort Street High, Hurlstone Agriculture High, St. John's Park High, Eschol Park Public, Gulgong Public, Haberfield Public and St. Andrews Public school.

Michelle Beaumont from Gulgong Public School starred in this event, winning her age competitions and leading her school to victory in the Primary Girls teams competition.

St. John's Park High were runners-up in the Open teams Championship and won the Open.

Challenge Cup. Gulgong High were runners-up in the Junior Male section and winner of the Intermediate Female section of the Challenge Cup.

I was asked by Sallee Caldwell the TTA organiser of this competition to liaise with the NSW schools, which I did.

This year the Department of Sports Education helped us with the distribution of Entry Forms in the Metropolitan Regions. Entry Forms being sent to 250 High Schools and 800 Primary Schools. Metropolitan Girls Schools received entry forms separately. This netted up quite a few schools who hadn't participated in the past.

I also faxed the Regional Sports Organisers of the 6 Country Regions, (which I have done in the past years) who forwarded me lists of the schools who had participated in the CHS knock out Teams Competition. Letters were sent to these as well as Catholic and Independent Schools.

This year Don Ho, teacher from St. John's Park School suggested that the winning team be given medals. His team would be willing to put in \$2 each. I agreed that this was a good idea and bought medals for the players and a trophy for the school to keep. In the past I have always ploughed back into TTNSW funds the money left over from these Championships, but this time I felt that if we are to keep the school students interested in playing Table Tennis competitively, we must do something extra like this. However, this is one year when I have only made a small profit. The Council meeting held in August agreed that TTNSW pay the difference.

In 1999, I hope that TTNSW will provide medals and a trophy for all Championship winners.

So far I have made contact with more than ten schools. I have visited five and have given exhibitions and coaching to 550 students. I have also visited three Community Centres and did some coaching.

I plan to visit more schools this year to push our Table Tennis program "Smash Hit" in Primary Schools, with the aim of developing two squads, one in the City and one in the Eastern Suburbs.

I plan to organise a Junior Squad training on a regular basis this year.

NSW Country team tour of Country Victoria

Representing NSW Country were the Goulbum players, Brad Miller, Glenn Wharton and Peter Zantis and Adam Green from Newcastle. Michael Turner, from Goulburn, was the manager/driver for the team.

UMPIRE'S REPORT

1998 was somewhat a disappointing year on the local scene, with so many tournaments unfortunately forced to cancel through lack of entries, with the resultant lack of activity maybe at least partly causing a lack of interest among our members at that level. With one tournament cancelled already this year, it is hoped that this trend does not continue.

On the broader scene some of our members have been prominent in the appointments for major positions, particularly Phil Males being confirmed as the referee for the 2000 Olympic Games, and Steven Lee as the referee for the Paralympics. The current year also saw Steven Lee as a Deputy Referee of the 14th. Asian Championships held in Japan and also the World Disabled Championships in France. Maurie Pool as Deputy Referee of the Australian Open (Pro Tour) Championships, Australian Youth Championships, and Umpire at the 14th. Asian Championships. Ian Finlay, Les Lawrence and Phil Males were also active on the National scene. We look forward confidently to further appointments to both the Olympics and Paralympics in due course.

Another innovation during the year was the introduction of playing shirts for umpires. These shirts are distinctive, being the two blues of NSW with the Umpires Association badge on the breast. Watch out for these shirts around tournaments, as the wearers are all qualified umpires who are able to give reliable advice on the rules and will be pleased to help you with all aspects of their interpretation etc.

TABLE TENNIS NSW FINANCIAL REPORT YEAR ENDING 31/12/98

In presenting the following Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss Statement for TT NSW for this financial year, I regret to have to submit these accounts with some qualifications.

During the year I have been pressing for proper tournament reconciliations, without much success I must say, to be produced by the tournament organizers for scrutiny by the committee of TT NSW. This operational deficiency has now become the main focus in the accompanying letter from our Auditor, although the accounts in itself were found to be in order regarding the preparation and testing of supporting documentation.

I was advised that the Incorporation Act does not require our accounts to be audited by a licensed Auditor and it is therefore advisable that the comments in the Auditor's letter should be viewed as recommendations to improve internal control and to set up a more efficient organisational structure with considerably stricter and documented guidelines.

Our organisation incurred a loss of \$1155, after accounting for a non-cash depreciation expense of \$2217.

Income from grants from previous years was taken up to enable us to cover the losses incurred from Tournaments (\$746) and unplanned Development expenses (\$9144), with the latter including an amount of \$3662 for the Newcastle Smash Hit pilot program, for which so far no income has been received. We have recently been advised that all previous years grants have been gifted, except for the \$5000 High Performance & Talent Development grant, for which qualifying initiatives are currently being undertaken.

Administration costs were slightly lower than last year, but in line with the budget. It is recommended that by centralizing all administrative functions in our Glebe office, including accounting, cheque writing, filing etc, considerable savings could possibly be achieved, whilst duplications of work and delays could be avoided. I would also like to suggest that in future all committee meetings are being held in Glebe on a preset monthly time table and during the week.

It should be noted that the 50% of the 1998/99 grants due for the period 1/7/98 to 31/12/98 for Club & Junior development have as yet not been included in the current accounts despite the fact that wages costs for Administration (\$7873) and Development (\$5536) are shown in the Profit & Loss statement. The reasoning for this is that there are clearly defined rules for each of the 1998/99 grants of \$13000 in regard to eligibility. At this stage only the wages costs have been incurred and we have to spend a specific \$2 for each \$1 of the grant to be earned.

With current assets valued at \$38721, (including outstanding Debtors of \$3962), and total liabilities of \$35968, it is obvious that cash reserves have become rather low, especially keeping in mind that only a small proportion of the unexpended grants income has been earned at this stage. It is therefore recommended that the committee initiates, as a matter of urgency and priority, income generating activities like sponsorships, tournament levies etc. with the ultimate aim to become a more viable business like operation.

I'm sorry, that due to work commitments I will be unable to continue as treasurer, but should the need arise, I will try to make myself available on an ad hoc basis only.

I was requested to carry out the audit of the accounts for your

This would require me to express an opinion as to whether, in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, the accounts represent the operations for the year ended 31st December 1998 and the financial position at that date.

I write because an initial examination of your records leads me to the conclusion that I would be unable to express an opinion without a qualification that would essentially nullify the benefit of an audit of your organisation. My main difficulty is that the documents presented to support the various sources of income are not adequate to verify that income and I am not aware of any form of internal control that could substitute in this regard. I do not believe that this situation can be corrected retrospectively. In addition confirmation of assets such as bank accounts and deposits requires direct confirmation to the auditor by the bank and a lead-time of 2-3 weeks needs to be provided. I was advised that an immediate audit was required.

I have examined the accounts that have been prepared and am satisfied that these have been faithfully prepared from the books of accounts.

In regard to the books of accounts:

Expenditure recorded has been tested against documentation and found to be properly supported and allocated to the correct accounts. It was noted that documentation did not bear authorisation and I was not made aware of any internal control that might be in place and thus was unable to test this area. I have been advised that this internal control is now in place. Income accounting is a difficulty and I can express no opinion as to its correct disclosure. For audit purposes and management financial control each event should be covered by a separate operating statement signed off by the event organizers and reviewed and signed off by the committee. The operating statement should be backed by entry forms and expense documents which could be audited on test basis and by reviewing this internal control.

I would recommend that each payment (and receipt where appropriate) indicate, in addition to the current date and cheque number, costing information to indicate whether the amount is general or attributable to a particular event or project. The greatest concern is in regard to grants. I am advised that these grants are given on the basis 50% contribution. This would appear to mean that an amount can be drawn down equal to the income raised by your organisation. Again a separate operating statement for each project related to the grant appears to be needed so as make quite plain the basis of drawdown of grants. As unspent grants need to be returned a "pro forma" apportionment of general overhead expenses may need to be made. This system need not be part of the formal accounting provided there was some safeguard against duplication.

Generally in terms of income the receipt of money should be separated from the organisation of the event or within the active control of more than one person. All event outcomes need committee review.

I notice a major item "registrations". This should be covered by a published list of some sort reconciled with the disclosed income.

In regard to Venue Hire a letting diary would be appropriate.

I examined the Balance Sheet and was able to sight documentary evidence for significant amounts with the exception of Unexpended Grants. The evidence sighted would not on its own meet Australian Auditing Standards and would need independent verification e.g. bank audit certificates. In regard to Trade Debtors it is not clear that potential bad debts have been provided for. I am advised that this is determined after the preparation of the accounts. This is inappropriate.

Theo Morsink has asked that I comment on the viability of your organisation. It would be presumptive of me to do this but I would like to point out the obvious conclusion that the disclosed surplus is based on the correct valuation of the Balance Sheet items. In this regard valuation of the unexpired grants would give me considerable concern. Bringing to profit and loss grants that have not in fact been earned will overstate the surplus or change the surplus to a deficiency.

The above notes are only an outline and would need amplification and discussion with your organisation in advance of an audit period.

I trust the above notes are useful to you.
