### ADMINISTRATION OFFICER'S REPORT

Members, it gives me pleasure to present my sixth report as Administration Officer (Part Time 3 days a week) for Table Tennis NSW Inc. The year 2001 was another busy and interesting one, which this report should demonstrate.

#### **Tournaments**

I am pleased that the members decided to elect a Director to be responsible for the conduct of tournaments. The support by members, in terms of numbers participating has shown a slight increase over the past years, which is a positive sign.

#### **General Administration**

The purchase of new computer equipment has greatly assisted with the day to day workload in the office. The NSW Sport & Recreation Department have provided free access to the internet and E-mail, yes at no cost to Table Tennis NSW. This technology has been of great assistance particularly when producing LOOP magazine.

In last years report I detailed four areas of concern identified at the "Table Tennis Beyond 2000 Workshop", namely Finance and Marketing

Facilities Participation

Constitution and Governance

It is pleasing that the Directors have continued to pay heed to the need for change in these four areas. Tony Aduckiewicz was appointed Independent Director. His specialty in the area of finance was of great benefit to Table Tennis NSW. Some significant changes to the constitution were passed at the 2001 Annual General Meeting and in time their effect will become most beneficial to our sport. The Directors, particularly Secretary Leonie Whiteford continue to investigate various options regarding the acquisition of a suitable Table Tennis facility. One only has to read the Financial Report to see the vast amount of funds outlaid in the hire of facilities for just two events, namely the Australian Junior and Under 18 Championship and the Australian Schools Championship. The appointment of a Tournament Director has had a positive impact on tournaments, however more needs to be done to increase the numbers involved in the various Club/Associations weekly pennant competitions.

### Where to play Table Tennis guide

Over the years this guide has proved to be a valuable tool in the day to day operation of the office and now that our web master, Phil Males has included it on our Web-site the general public have easy access to its content.

#### **Bad Debts**

Unfortunately the debt owed by the Korean Table Tennis Club has only been reduced by \$310.00, despite the agreement made with a representative from that club for payment and repeated follow-up correspondence from the office once their payments ceased.

I recommended in my report last year that the debt owed by Chi Nguyen be written off and unfortunately the Korean Club debt should be written off too.

Mention was made in my report last year of the debt incurred by Peter Masen, former Coaching/Development officer, as a result of not matching dollar for dollar grant money paid to him during 1999. I have written to him several times during the past twelve months

requesting payment, however he has not responded. Directors may have to take firmer action with him in order to recover the amount of \$7,128.00.

#### **Equipment Sales**

Once again the sale of Table Tennis equipment has been an important part of my duty. We receive funding from NSW Sport & Recreation for this project. It provides a service to all members, particularly those residing in country areas and a small profit for Table Tennis NSW (see Finance Report).

#### Registrations

There has been an increase of 44 Registered Members from the year 2000. Which is a good sign. However, a much greater effort will be needed from Office Bearers from all of the Affiliated Clubs/Associations this year if registration numbers are to reflect the true number of players actually playing Table Tennis across the State.

Member should be mindful of one of the benefit associated with a larger number of registered members is the financial burden will be smaller because it is shared by a larger number.

#### Loop

Four editions of LOOP were distributed in January, May, August and December in 2001 and posted to members. In addition some of the articles have been posted on our Web-site for members of the public to access. Once again I would like to thank all of the people who submitted articles for publication, they made interesting and informative reading. Thank you to our advertisers, I hope that you received value for money.

#### **NSW Sport & Recreation Involvement**

NSW Sport & Recreation continue to be our main source of income. With-out which this Association could not continue to provide the many services it does to Its members and the sport in general. I was required to submit a three year business plan to cover the period July 2001 through to June 2004. All sports were placed into categories according to criteria determined by NSW Sport & Recreation. Table Tennis NSW was placed into a category which received \$20,000.00 for each of the three years of the business plan. This amount was a drastic decrease from previous years. The Directors successfully applied for an increase in the funding for the first year.

The Country Athlete Scheme applications continue to be negotiated directly with the Department and the parent. My only involvement is to verify membership currency and have the Junior Selectors prioritise the applicants.

In addition to free access to the Internet and E-mail, NSW Sport & Recreation provide free office accommodation at Sports House and access to photo copying equipment. This is very much appreciated.

#### Conclusion

I consider that the duties of Office Administrator are a very important link between the public, NSW Sport & Recreation, the Directors and the sport of Table Tennis.

Given the reduction in grants over the next three years every office bearer will need to exercise due diligence in the execution of their portfolios.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT - 2001

2001 was an extremely hectic and productive year for Table Tennis NSW.

The introduction of the GST and BAS statements in July 2000 caused an immense increase in workload for the Finance Director and resulted in a total overhaul of the books for 2000 by the new Finance Director Phil Males. The books are now in excellent order and have adjusted to the GST & BAS transactions.

Table Tennis NSW participated in the NSW Sport & Recreations — national Pilot on Risk Management along with fourteen other sports and this Risk Management Policy module will be used by all sports nationally. Table Tennis NSW has our policy ready for implementation and addition to our constitution at this years Annual General Meeting.

In 2001 Table Tennis NSW ventured into the World Wide Web with Phil Males setting up our WESITE, for those who don't know, the address is — www.ttnsw.org.au

We have had almost 5,000 visitors to our WEBSITE since 15<sup>th</sup> May last year. All our tournament results are entered here the same day or within two days of the tournaments completion. Also during the Australian Junior and Australian Veterans Championships the results were entered as matches were completed. The site contains the annual Calendar of events, equipment catalogues, and a separate Veterans & Country League page as well as venue contacts and tournament entry forms. This has been a successful venture and well done to the WEB MASTER Phil Males.

Table Tennis NSW also hosted the Australian Schools and Australian Junior Championships in September/October at Minto and this was a huge task with several obstacles. The Ansett collapse affected all states attending apart from ACT and Victoria. The other states loosing their airline bookings and having to make alternate bookings costing in some cases double & triple their original costs. Tasmania and Western Australia not being able to secure travel until the very last minute. I would like to thank the interstate players & officials for supporting these Championships and appreciate their efforts with enduring the additional costs.

The Australian Schools Championships had very few interstate teams due to the Ansett collapse and the late posting of the entry forms, but I would like to thank, Ron Pickering in the Office, Gillian Hutchison, Tien Quach, and Dave Beaumont for their efforts in securing 87 teams for the Australian Schools Championships, which is the most teams ever at these Championships. We also experienced further problems when the tournament director for the Schools and referee for the Australian Juniors, Graeme Ireland was called overseas with work commitments, there were initial problems with Graeme's program, but after a persistent effort from the Referee & Assistant referee, Fran Keyhoe and Angelo Tabone with assistance from Dave Beaumont, Tien Quach, Jennifer Aduckiewicz and the other teachers the schools tournament was finally underway. It was good to see the four teams from the ACT who

entered the disabled category and watching the enjoyment they gained from participating in the tournament. Overall a very pleasing and successful tournament.

The Australian Junior Championships ran smoothly apart from the problems associated with the Ansett collapse. The Championships were officially opened by Mr Brendan O'Reilly, Director General NSW Sport and Recreation. I would like to thank our sponsors STIGA who supplied the balls and CIVIC VIDEO who provided Table Tennis NSW with 100 new barriers. Once again a successful tournament with over 40 teams from NSW and interstate.

I would also like to thank Dave Beaumont, Robert Beaumont, John Beaumont and Ritchie Meredith for assisting with the equipment for the Australian Schools and Australian Championships with collecting, transporting and setting up of the tables and the hall, it was a very long day starting at 7 am and finishing at 9 pm.

Table Tennis NSW was well represented at all Australian Championships in 2001-

U20 Youth Championship – Mens & Womens Teams
U18 & Junior Championships – 6 x Boys & 3 x Girls Teams
Senior Closed Championships – 2 x Mens & 2 x Womens Teams
Veterans Championships – 7 x Mens and 5 x Womens Teams

A total of 27 representative teams at National Championships, which is an outstanding effort, congratulations to all those players. Also congratulations to John Tawadrous who was selected in the Australian Mens Team for the Commonwealth & World Championships and on winning the Michael Szabados Junior Player of the Year award. John won all six events in the U18 & U16 age groups at the Australian Championships. Also Congratulations to Michelle Beaumont who won The U14 Girls Singles and U14 Mixed Doubles and the STIGA award for U14 Girls at the Australian Championships. Michelle was also selected to represent the Australia Junior team overseas in January 2002.

Table Tennis NSW has been negotiating with Peter Ross from the State Sports Centre regarding the promised legacy from the Sydney Olympics. The Sydney Olympic Park Authority (SOPA) has agreed to the building of two new facilities next to the existing state sport centre, to be used primarily by the six identified legacy sports from the Sydney Olympics. This facility will contain a Table Tennis specific area with permanent Tables. This facility will allow the two buildings belonging to the Royal Agricultural Society to be returned to the Royal Agricultural Society. It is planned for construction to take approximately two years. In the interim the facility belonging to the Royal Agricultural Society will be available outside the Royal Easter Show times.

There is a budget to allow for the sports floors to be installed and these will be ready for use after this year's show from Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April. There has been much negotiation between the six legacy sports and Peter Ross from the States Sports Centre and inturn the States Sports Centre with SOPA on several issues. For Table Tennis there is likely to be an area with 2 rows of 7

tables and a 2-metre aisle between with the court sizes being 6 x 12 metres. Peter Ross has agreed that there would be difficulty with setting up and dismantling and it is probable the tables will be set up most of the time. The legacy sports will have first priority over ALL bookings and will be required to enter into licence agreements for their usage. SOPA has taken some bookings outside of the legacy sports for 2002 and this along with the HSC marking in November may prevent us from relocating to Homebush until the end of 2002 or into 2003. Table Tennis NSW is still continuing its quest to obtain a permanent Table Tennis Centre owned by Table Tennis NSW.

The registrations for 2001 were almost 600 – the registrations for 2002 will continue to be the same cost and it is important that members ensure their association/club forward any registrations as soon as possible to ensure members receive entry forms and the LOOP on time. The registrations are being updated as they are received and members should receive their membership cards within two – three weeks of the TTNSW Office receiving the registrations. If members have not received their cards they should firstly contact their club/association to ensure their membership has been forwarded to the TTNSW office and if so contact the office. NB: If members have changed address it important to contact the office either by: phone; fax or E-mail to advise your change of details.

#### DISABILITY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

As Director of Table Tennis Disabilities the main objective is to communicate to the people with disabilities the positive values of participating in recreation and competition Table Tennis programmes and development of Table Tennis skills for both young and old.

On Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2001, I contacted 37 wheelchair players from Country and Metropolitan areas to attend a "Come and Try Day" at the Peter Forsyth Auditorium. An invitation was issued to many Disabilities Associations to attend also. The players who took part gained insight to the plans for 2002.

Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2001 was the "Fun Day" at Leichhardt Aquatic Centre to celebrate the UN International day of People with Disabilities. Table Tennis tables and surrounds were transported to the centre for use on the day. This was a very successful day, 100 come and try pamphlets were handed out. Contacts were made with people who are mentally impaired, standing disables, wheelchair and deaf.

An exahibition of wheelchair Table Tennis was the feature of the day at Leichhardt. Thanks to Joy Boyd and Jacob Wright, they put on an excellent display. Also thanks to Matty Padley, CEO Table Tennis Australia for assisting me on the day.

Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2002, trials will take place for the Commonwealth Games at the Peter Forsyth Auditorium.

#### Future

Purchase a Robot Machine and balls for training.

Obtain grants from NSW Sports Council for a coach to assist long term training plans and an understanding and ability to recognise elite levels.

### JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT & COACHING

#### 1. Training Sessions:

There were ten State junior training sessions throughout the year. The age groups were U14/U16/U18/U20 both boys and girls. We received an average attendance from all age group based on all players who were invited to the training sessions.

All training sessions were held at Glebe on Sundays, 90% of the time the hall was used for Veterans competition and the other half was used for State junior training.

State junior training for 2002 will be held at Glebe on both Saturdays and Sundays giving players more choice and availability to attend. There needs to be more than one coach at these junior training sessions if there are in excess of 30 players.

#### 2. Youth Championships:

In April 2001 NSW had entered a full Men's and Women's team at the Australian Youth Championships. NSW were very desperate to send a team, our higher ranked players were unavailable to participate. Therefore we were forced to send our low ranked players.

Results were very poor in both the Men's and Women's competition, team moral was low due to non-ability to win matches.

In future, if NSW cannot field teams with our top players then we would be better off not to send a team at all.

#### 3. Australian Junior Championships:

Overall the Championships were a success.

The results for NSW were mixed including:

- Individual results from John Tawadrous and Michelle Beaumont which were the highlights for NSW
- Final teams rankings included some high ranked and some low ranked positions.

Overall the standard of the State Junior teams at the championship was quite poor, apart from some individual efforts, the balance of results average to say the least.

There needs to be a great deal done to improve the standard of quality of table tennis in our junior teams, as we cannot rely on individual efforts to improve our overall team results as a whole in NSW to compete with the other states.

#### Summary:

- Training sessions need to be held in a venue where there are more than 6 tables available for state junior training's, especially when 30 players turn up. It is not feasible for the players to be playing cross court and is not a method of improving their game. Players get discouraged and don't give their full potential.
- A strict 80% attendance to the overall State Junior training sessions must be put into force with no exceptions (apart from country players)

- For the standard of our junior players to improve to the next level, there must be greater emphasis on constant and consistent training sessions. It is very hard for this to occur if NSW does not have a base for junior players, it seems that every other state has a junior base except us!
- Until there is a permanent table tennis centre where a base for junior players can be set up, we must set up various junior elite squads in our existing club around Sydney.

#### Aims for 2002:

- Greater emphasis on junior elite squad training to be set up with frequent training sessions such as
  - Bansktown Masonic Hall
  - Uinversity of NSW Table Tennis Club
- Increase the number of competitions that junior players are to compete in, so they can
  feel how it is to play under pressure in matches. We have recommended for 2 junior
  teams compete in the Insurance competition for 2002.
- \* Enforce the 80% attendance to junior training's to ensure that players are serious about representing their state team.

#### **2001 CITY v COUNTRY**

After the heavy defeat in 2000 Country bounced back to win the 2001 tournament in a very close encounter 127 rubbers to 122.

### JUNIOR DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Division Tournament - Held twice in 2001 (May and November)
This tournament provides new junior players a guide to become better players and ultimately if they wish, compete at state levels.

All the junior players that attended these tournaments thoroughly enjoyed the day whether they won or lost, due to the fact that they were challenging players of their standard. While it's an ideal tournament for juniors, there are not enough during the year.

#### State tournaments

Junior Closed —45 males, 9 femalesJunior Open —41 males, 12 femalesSutherland Open —19 males, 6 femalesMetropolitan Open -11 males, 5 females

The above tournaments were competed at age levels, U12, U14, U16, and U18. Entries to the Junior Open/Closed doubled the other two due to the fact that they were compulsory for state team selection.

Approximately half of the players attending the division tournaments do not attend the state tournaments knowing that they will not stand a chance when competing with state players in their respected age group.

In total we have 103 junior registered for 2001 - 41 at Championship level, 46 at Junior level, and 16 at School Level.

Only 54 attended the Junior Closed and 53 attended the Junior Open.

What happened to the other 41 players?

Were they the 41 players that attended division tournaments only?

Were entry forms sent out to all players?

If entry forms were sent to the clubs, were the juniors at those club informed by their coaches?

Is it the way the tournaments were organised, which discourages players to take part?

Whatever the problem is, we need to identify it, prevent it from happening, and hopefully we will get more junior players participating in all tournaments in 2002.

### NSW TABLE TENNIS UMPIRES' ASSOCIATION. REPORT

After the fever of excitement of the Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2000, last year was something of a comedown for the association with the level of activity showing a marked decrease, with some local tournaments left without a referee due to lack of availability.

Internationally, Steven Lee was appointed Deputy Referee for both the World Championships and the FESPIC Disabled Championships in Osaka, Japan with Maurie Poole umpiring at both events as well as being appointed as referee of the Arafura Games Table Tennis in Darwin and the Australian Junior Championships in Sydney. Phil Males controlled the computer operations of the Junior Championships and the year also saw Ian Finlay become chairman of the National Umpires' League selection committee.

The Junior Championships also saw the introduction of the new basic umpire's course, with sessions conducted by Fran Keyhoe from Victoria (Deputy Referee), resulting some new entrants into the umpiring field, who it is hoped will continue to become further qualified.

This course is the first stage in the overhaul of our umpiring qualifications to eventually come into line with national standards, with changes to other level qualifications to follow. Although information is somewhat sketchy, the association will try to stay abreast of the changes and offer opportunities for those who wish to either gain new qualifications or update their existing ones as well as provide qualified umpires and referees as required.

It is also hoped that our association will continue to be represented on the national and international fronts, however, there are no details available at this stage.

### TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2001 was a hectic year with seven tournaments run over ten days. The tournament director's role is sometimes a difficult one.

There is the receiving of entry forms — which have to be catalogued. Some entries are received — paid in full, some are partly paid — some people do forget they MUST pay both the \$2 teams and the \$1 development levies- others have not paid and there are always late entries

Once the entries are catalogued and marked as either paid or owing. They are then separated onto an event sheet and it must be determined by the number of entries as to whether to run a knockout or round robin event. Also where players require partners for doubles events this must also be determined. This takes some considerable time an hour to an hour and a half and this must all be completed before you can commence the draws.

Then the seeds for each Open or aged event are added into the draws - the seeds are taken either from the appropriate selectors or from the latest available seeding / ranking list. The top seed is placed in the top of the draw and the 2<sup>nd</sup> seed in the bottom of the draw. The next seeds in pairs of two are tossed for top or bottom and inserted into the appropriate position in the draw.

Once the seeds are completed the remaining competitors are drawn into the draw. All unseeded draws are completed by lot.

When the draws are completed - two copies written out - one for the tournament control and one copy to be placed on the wall for the competitors to view. The first round matches are written up onto result slips for the commencement.

A minimum of two required for the draw and is desirable that the tournament referee is present. The overall preparation & draw takes three to four hours.

Upon arrival the hall has to be set up. There are usually only one or two people present. If only two people it takes around half-hour to an hour to set-up. If there are around ten people it only takes around 20 minutes to half an hour.

Tournaments are mostly started on —time. There is ALWAYS someone who either hasn't turned up or is very late for the scheduled start of their event, this in a lot of cases causes the tournament to be delayed and is unacceptable especially seeing we are limited with a finishing time for the hall.

There are ALAWYS people who have not paid their entry fess or have not paid the correct amount and this takes some time to round up the outstanding money and also run the tournament

There are always competitors who want to enter on the day or someone who has sent their entry in late and is not received until the following week. When the tournament is completed — the same old story the equipment then has to be packed away , and again it depends how many people have stayed behind to assist with the packing up — if ten or more people 20 minutes to half an hour — if only two or three people half an hour to an hour.

The next step is to reconcile the tournament and bank the money. The reconciliation is then forwarded to the Finance Director and a copy to the office.

The tournament results are also entered up and a copy to the WEB MASTER for entering onto our WEB site.

The first tournament NSW Closed – Open & Grades – Sun – 18<sup>th</sup> March. Restricted to a 4 pm time limit. There were several competitors holding up events. Result several events not completed and were re-scheduled to the Metropolitan Open – Sat 14<sup>th</sup> July.

The  $2^{nd}$  tournament NSW Junior Closed – Sun  $22^{nd}$  April – again restricted to a 4pm finishing time. We were invaded by the basketballers at around 2 pm, who were disruptive and did not help - result several events not completed – rescheduled to the Junior Open on Sat  $7^{th}$  July.

The 3rd Tournament NSW Veterans Closed Sat & Sun  $2^{nd}$  &  $3^{rd}$  June. — Set over two days — 6 hours each day. Doubles on Saturday & Singles on Sunday. Event finishing well on time. The only problem being with doubles on Sat & singles on Sunday, several competitors only entered events on one day. It would be desirable to run the event on one day from 9 am to 6 pm.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Tournament NSW Open – Open & Grades Sun 2<sup>nd</sup> July – time restricted to 4 pm. There were some events not completed and again scheduled for the Metropolitan Open Sat 14<sup>th</sup> July.

The 5<sup>th</sup> tournament – NSW Junior Open Sat 7<sup>th</sup> July – the extended time to 5 pm allowed this event to be completed and also the re-scheduled matches from the Junior closed.

The 6<sup>th</sup> Tournament – Metropolitan Open – Sat & Sun 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> July – with the event over two days. All events completed. Rescheduled events completed apart from one.

The 7<sup>th</sup> tournament – NSW Veterans Open – Sat & Sun 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> July. Event held over two days – no problems completing all events over the two days. Once again some competitors only entered events on one day and it would be much more desirable to have the tournament on one day 9am to 6-pm finish.

Overall there are several problems which need to be addressed. It is impossible for one person to run the entire event. It is essential to have a tournament committee of at least five to six people to run the tournament

- two = three people to conduct the draw
- five six people to set up the hall
- Tournament one to control the events, one to write up the results; one to collect the money and two to chase people to their tables.
- five six people to pack up the hall
- The tournament director to complete the reconciliation & banking.
- One person to complete the results and send to the WEB MASTER.
