## PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

Throughout Europe and Asia Table Tennis is a major sport attracting tens of thousands of spectators to tournaments. Apart from the Olympic Games, more nations come together at the one venue for the World Table Tennis Championships than for any other sport. This development overseas did not come overnight, but obviously was the result of a strong administration and player support. These in turn attract both sponsors and spectators.

Here in New South Wales, I am afraid that we lack all the ingredients which have made Table Tennis a success overseas.

During my first year in Table Tennis administration, I have been appalled by the lack of support we have received from players. Their failure to attend the Annual General Meeting and their subsequent criticisms of the elected Council, or individual members thereof, are incompatible; the apathy towards and lack of respect of well established rules by some teams in the "A" Grade Pennants, would not be tolerated elsewhere; very few top-class players have come forward and offered to assist the usual small band of regular workers who appear at every tournament and function; how many players have qualified as Umpires and officiated as such? All this boils down to the fact that too many players expect too much from the game without wanting to put anything into it.

Council members are elected to serve everybody, not just one particular faction; thus a Council member must be prepared to subjugate personal likes or dislikes for the general benefit; particularly, each Council member must be prepared to work in harmony with every other Council member, especially on Sub-Committees which are an integral part of the successful running of the Council; unless a person is prepared to work with everybody they should not stand for Council; a disunited Council can only do harm to Table Tennis in this State.

Whilst on the subject of Officials, I am disturbed by the fact that our Affiliated Associations, particularly the Metropolitan Associations, have not seen fit to be represented on Council. Each Affiliated Association has the right to be represented by one member on Council and unless this right is exercised the Council ceases to be representative and Table Tennis in general suffers.

I now wish to comment on a particular class of person common to all sport - "the knocker". I have alluded to these in the course of my comments on players and officials. Let me comment here on an article which appeared in "Table Top" during the year and which illustrates perfectly the art of "knocking". The article was unsigned and, in effect, accused the Council of doing nothing about the problem of registered players participating in unaffiliated competitions. It can be no coincidence that this article appeared in the first issue after the Affiliated Association which published the magazine had problems with their own Affiliation. Due to the anonymity of the article it is impossible to say whether the article was personal or representative of the attitude of the Affiliated Association, but it must cause some dissension which would have been obviated if the problem had been raised through the proper channels. All I can say is, that if anybody has a genuine grievance, refer it to Council immediately instead of creating storms in tea cups to the ultimate detriment of the game.

To this point, it may appear that I myself belong to the class of person I have been denigrating; however, I would ask all who read these comments to reflect and consider if any comments apply to them. If so, be a little more tolerant in the future and to place the game before yourself.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Continued)

On the brighter side, the 1970 year looms as the greatest ever in the history of N.S.W. Table Tennis, the highlights being the visit by the World's Doubles Champions, Alser and Johansson, and the 25th Australian Championships. Both these and other events will require the wholehearted support of all players and officials and I would ask anybody able to assist to let their availability be known to Council members.

A particularly pleasing feature during the past year has been the support received from the Press, radio and television. For the sport to expand, we require continued publicity and I am confident that this will be given provided the players play their part and are backed by an active band of officials.

The Council during the year commenced a programme of developing junior players. Whilst we appear to have many promising junior boys, it is disturbing that few junior girls are coming into the game. It was evident during the Australian Championships that in a short time N.S.W. will be far behind the other States in women's events. Expert coaching is available at the Table Tennis Centre for juniors wishing to participate in the sport and to parents who are looking for a wholesome and cheap activity for their children, Table Tennis could well provide the answer.

I wish to congratulate all players who represented the State during the year. Whilst success did not come their way, they all played to the best of their ability and were a credit to their State and to themselves.

Congratulations, also to Victoria for winning the inaugural Trudeck-Flakeboard Award which is awarded to the leading State, not only for playing standards, but strength of officials and administration.

In his last report, my predecessor reported that arrangements had been made for an administrative connection with the Centre at Summer Hill. Whilst this has lead to a greater stability in the sport, it highlights the necessity that we must obtain our own premises so that we may be independent and act of our own accord. Players should remember that the Centre is a privately-owned commercial enterprise and whilst this situation exists, by way of necessity, few financial concessions can be granted.

Elsewhere in the Annual Report, you will read a resume of the year's activities and the names of those who have been prominent in the sport. I have refrained from mentioning anybody personally and offer my thanks to all who have assisted the sport during the year, players, officials, sponsors and spectators. However, the sport owes particular thanks to our Secretary, Mike Lane, who has devoted an enormous amount of time to his personal detriment and I sincerely hope that more assistance will be available to Mike during the coming year.

In conclusion, I have enjoyed my first year as President and, if re-elected, look forward to cementing the friendships I have made and being associated with the continued expansion of the sport.

### OBITUARY.

It is with deep regret and a feeling of sad loss that the death of Hubert G. Schachtel is recorded in this Annual Report.

Mr. H.G. Schachtel died on 1st January 1969, at the age of nearly 81 years, after a life-time of close contact with many sports, not the least of which was Table Tennis in New South Wales.

He was Patron of the N.S.W. Table Tennis Association for many years and he also filled the position of President. In his latter years, right up to the time of his passing away, he was a Vice-Patron.

He was an Office-bearer in City Tattersalls Club, Sydney, and was able, with the fine and valued co-operation of that worthy Club, to provide the N.S.W. T.T.A. with venues for many exhibitions and matches, and meetings at a time when facilities for such were almost beyond the means of the Association. His financial and private support, too, was more than generous, but it never received any publicity.

Herbie, (as he was generally called) may not have been known personally to many of the younger members of the N.S.W. T.T.A., but to the older members he will be remembered as one of the stalwarts in the earlier era of table tennis, who earned the admiration and respect of all of those with whom he worked. Indeed, he was a gentleman; conservative, yet with a warm and sincere nature.

His passing is full of sorrow, and to his widow (who, incidentally, was always a keen supporter of table tennis), the N.S.W. Table Tennis Association extends its most sincere sympathy.

### ANNUAL REPORT.

Thirty-Fourth Annual Report to be presented to members at the Annual General Meeting, to be held at the 10th Floor, Training Room, A.M.P. Building, Sydney Cove, on Thursday, 5th March 1970.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

This, the Thirty-Fourth Annual Report covers the activities of your Association for the year 1969.

The Council, in general, has had a good year, but still rests heavily on a few willing workers. I am pleased to report that 'the few' have increased during the last twelve months, both in numbers and quality.

But, we still require many more willing hands to enable the sport of Table Tennis to be run at a level where it is beneficial to both players and administrators.

### FINANCE.

The financial position has improved slightly during the year. Bearing in mind that many running expenses have increased, this is a very good sign. This Association does not work on a substantial margin with its Championships or other organised functions and the only way that a profit can be made is by having the support of all players and officials.

This profit can then be 'ploughed' back into the game for the coaching of junior players and the advancement of Table Tennis in general.

Support is what is needed to make Table Tennis gain its rightful place in the Australian Sporting ladder.

### WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

New South Wales were represented by three players, Joy Brown, Vicki Wheller and Paul Pinkewich, being selected for the Australian team to play in Munich.

All players gave sound performances at the 'Worlds' and gained much experience as was shown only too clearly in Pinkewich's game on his return to Australia.

### AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

Brisbane was the scene of the 1969 Championships for the first time since 1956.

Although having a stronger team than in 1968 when we won the Men's Team Championship, we were defeated 6-3 by Victoria in the final match of this year's event. All N.S.W. players played very well, but were unable to produce the little extra needed.

The Women's team played creditably but were on the receiving end of an unexpectedly heavy defeat from South Australia and were pipped by Victoria 5-4.

Our Juniors were very inexperienced and gained tremendously from the trip. The boys, in particular, with a little more run of the ball, could easily have finished in second place.

In the Individual Events, Michael Wilcox combined with Stuart Gibbs to win the Men's Doubles, and with Joan Lane (S.A.) to take out the Mixed title.

Michael has now equalled a record held by Phil Anderson of winning a total of 13 Australian titles - a record of which he can be justly proud.

Fay Smith came within a whisker of defeating Mary Cleaves in the semi-final of the Women's Singles and combined with Joy Brown to be the losing finalists in the Women's Doubles.

## AUSTRALIAN SUB-JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS.

1969 was the inaugural year for this event and was staged in Melbourne during May.

N.S.W. teams selected were:-

Most of these boys were visiting inter-state for the first time and were over-awed by the high standard of competitors. The venture proved worthwhile, as all players have shown an improvement since this event.

## NEW SOUTH WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The Championships, held at Summer Hill, drew one of the largest entries for many years.

The play was of a particularly high standard and culminated in a crowd of nearly 400 witnessing an electrifying display of Table Tennis from Lee Mun Chew and Paul Pinkewich in the Men's Singles final. Lee fought back from being two games down to win the title for the second consecutive year.

Fay Smith easily won the Women's Singles for the third time by defeating Margaret Lindsay. It was unfortunate that Margaret sustained a leg injury after winning the first game.

The junior singles events were won by two new champions in Lyn Manser (Dubbo) and Terry McEntyre (Maitland), both of whom show promise for the future.

Congratulations are extended to the winners and runners-up in all events.

During the year several Championships have been conducted in Sydney as well as at various country centres, such as Newcastle, Lismore, Dubbo, Canberra, Grafton and Armidale.
